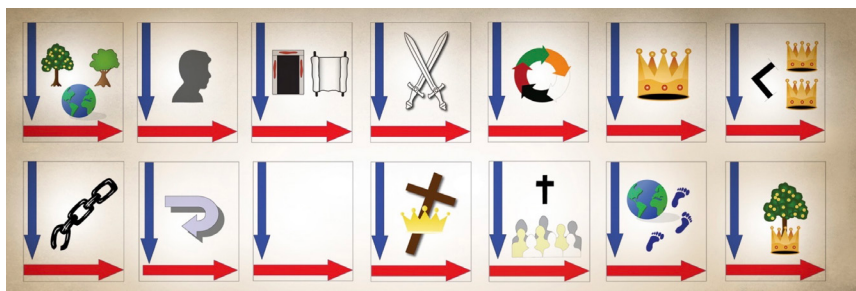

The 14 Era

Structure of the Bible

This year as we read the entire Bible in a year it is our desire that our Church would be equipped to understand and to tell the story of scripture in a succinct and simple way. We will be using the 14 Era Structure of the Bible so that we have a framework for this story. This is one simple tool that helps us remember and share how the entire Bible fits together.

“Assembling the story line of the Bible resembles the assembly of a puzzle. Without the picture on the box cover, you won’t know what you’re building, and you’ll quickly lose interest. Further, without the straight edges and corners you will not have a framework for all the other pieces in the box. The 14 Era graphic of the Bible provides a simple structure that builds the storyline of the Bible.” Each time we enter in to a new era in the story, there will be a descriptive page of what that era entails in our Rooted Journals with an icon that symbolizes that Era.

Captive Era

We are now moving into the Captivity Era. After years of ignoring God's warnings, Judah's judgment came when Babylon conquered Jerusalem in 586 BC, destroyed the Temple, and carried many of God's people into exile. Even in captivity, God did not abandon His people. He raised up prophets such as Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and Daniel to remind them that His judgment was just but His mercy remained. Jeremiah promised that the exile would last seventy years before God restored His people, Ezekiel gave hope of God's presence and future restoration, and Daniel revealed God's sovereign rule and the coming eternal kingdom. This era demonstrates that God always keeps His promises—both His warnings of judgment and His promises of redemption. Even in Israel's darkest season, God remained faithful, offering His people

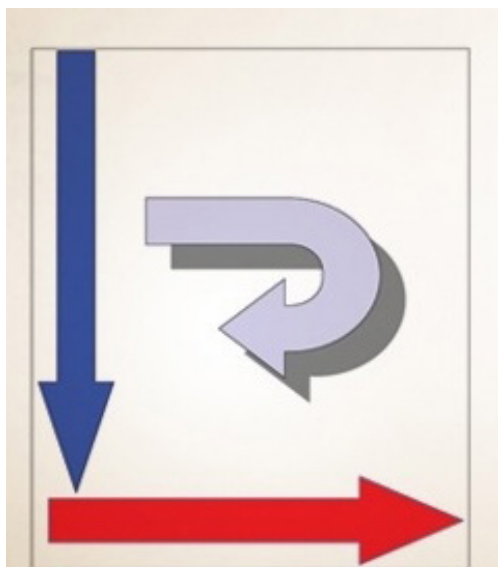

The Return Era

We are now moving into the Return Era. After the seventy-year exile, God fulfilled His promise by raising up Cyrus the Great to allow the Jewish exiles to return to Jerusalem and rebuild the Temple. When the people became discouraged, God sent the prophets Haggai and Zechariah to encourage them to complete His work. God also used Esther to preserve His people from destruction, Ezra to restore the reading and teaching of God's Law, and Nehemiah to rebuild Jerusalem's walls and lead the people in spiritual renewal. During this era, Israel finally turned away from idol worship, and the prophet Malachi called the people to wholehearted obedience before God. The Return Era reveals God's faithfulness to keep His promises, His sovereignty over nations and rulers, and His desire to restore His people through His Word and faithful leaders.

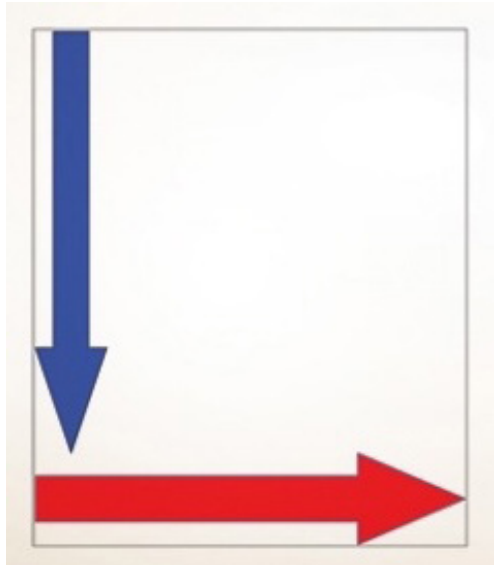

The Silent Era

We are now moving into the Silent Era, the approximately 400 years between the Old and New Testaments. Although God gave no new prophetic revelation after Malachi, He was far from inactive. During this time, God sovereignly directed the rise and fall of the Persian, Greek, and Roman empires, fulfilling prophecies given through Daniel and preparing the world for the coming Messiah. A common Greek language, Roman roads, and the Pax Romana made it possible for the gospel to spread rapidly. Jewish life also changed as synagogues became centers of worship, religious groups such as the Pharisees and Sadducees emerged, and additional traditions burdened the people with legalism while increasing their longing for a Savior. Though God was silent, He faithfully worked behind the scenes, preparing the world so that, in the "fullness of time," the promised Messiah would come and accomplish His plan of redemption.



The Gospel Era

We are now moving into the Gospel Era, when God fulfilled centuries of promises by sending His Son, Jesus, the promised Messiah, to save His people from their sins.

After the ministry of John the Baptist prepared the way, Jesus lived a sinless life, taught about the Kingdom of God, performed countless miracles, healed the sick, forgave sins, and called people to repentance. Though welcomed by sinners and the humble, He was rejected by many religious leaders, who handed Him over to be crucified. Through His death on the cross, Jesus became the perfect sacrifice for sin, fulfilling the prophecies and sacrifices of the Old Testament. Three days later, He rose from the dead, defeating sin and death and providing salvation for all who believe in Him. Before ascending to heaven, Jesus commissioned His disciples to take the gospel to the ends of the earth. The Gospel Era reveals that God always keeps His promises, provides the payment for humanity's sin through Christ, and offers forgiveness and new life to all
