Running on Empty

I take care of my wife's vehicle fuel 99% of the time. I bring two important acts of service to her as she sees it: I kill bugs and I keep her car gassed up. (Whatever it takes to keep her working! LOL) I'm happy to do it; I only ask her to tell me when she's down to a quarter tank. But that must be way too boring!

As we all know, people are different; especially the way they treat a fuel tank on a vehicle. Some are extra cautious and as soon as that tank is half empty, they seek to fill it up. These are the kinds of people with a bomb shelter in the backyard. Me, I like to fill up when the tank is at the quarter mark. (My dad taught me that keeps the fuel pump lubricated.) Sure, why not! But some are adventurers. You push it down to the bottom. "Let's see how far we can go on empty!" You like to push it till you get caught or you barely make it to the gas station. You love the rush. That is the usual state of my wife's car. The idiot light is not only on but is quickly dimming from it's pending death due to fuel starvation. Bonnie likes to bet on if I can make it to the gas station or not.

Which brings us to our October Sermon Series titled, "Running on Empty." This is really a series about hope. Hope to the soul is like fuel to the tank. Keeping our tank full isn't easy these days. Everyone will, from time to time, experience something that is draining our tanks. We all have an emotional tank. We have a spiritual tank. We have a confidence tank, a relationship tank, and a strength and vitality tank. Any good driver knows we need to be intentional about checking our gas gauge and keeping our tank full so we don't become stranded and alone and empty. But how does one keep a full joy tank these days when so many troubles are contributing to our emptiness?

Unfortunately, many are fed up, burned out, weary, mad, strained, stressed, and discouraged. What do we do when life becomes too busy, too troublesome, too painful, too irritating, too crazy? What do we do when our tanks are dangerously low?

Ignore it? Try harder? Fill our lives with things we know will fail? No. There is a better way. Join us in October as we look at "Running on Empty!"

GLOBAL IMPACT

TCM began as a church planting organization in 1957. In 1961, TCM began



offering assistance to churches and pastors behind the Iron Curtain, providing them with food, clothing, Bibles, and other Christian literature. Responding to the changing needs in a post-Soviet environment, TCM transitioned to a ministry training institute in 1991, offering graduate degrees in practical theology to Christian leaders, believing that equipping national leaders is an affordable, practical, and strategic path to carrying out the Great Commission.

TCM's offices in the United States are in Indianapolis, Indiana, and its main European campus, Haus Edelweiss, is in Austria. Incremental and consistent growth has taken the ministry in the last eight years from a student enrollment of 1,232 to one of over 2,000 and from a vision that focused on Eastern Europe and Central Asia to a vision that encompasses any nation in the world, wherever the Lord leads.

Fred Hansen began working with TCM January 1, 2012 as Assistant Professor of Biblical Studies and Global Outreach Representative. He teaches courses from both the Old and New Testaments, including introductory courses in biblical languages. When he is not teaching in Europe, he and his wife Cindy and children Madeline and Parker reside in Minnesota. There Fred travels in the Midwest to meet with churches and individuals to raise awareness of TCM's ministry as well as to establish and deepen partnerships. Cindy continues to serve children and families through her roles as principal of Pine Island Elementary School and adjunct faculty member at Bethel University. Madeline is a sophomore at Harding University double majoring in Bible and political science with plans to go to law school. Parker is finishing his senior year in high school before heading to Harding next fall to study molecular biology and biochemistry.

Please keep Fred in your prayers as he has a vigorous teaching load this fall. Ask God to protect his health and his family while he is away.

The "I Am UnAFRAid" anti-bullying program came to elementary schools in Lincoln,

Dr. Jay Banks (speaker), stated "I saw a piece of research that said about 85 to 90 percent of the students who commit violent crimes in school were bullied. Now, it is not an excuse for what they did. Absolutely not an excuse. So, this program is not just important in creating safe classrooms, but it may save some lives."

Bank says, "It's a self-empowerment program that teaches them how to be empowered via a research-based acronym which is *unA.F.R.A.id.*" It teaches kids to:

- Avoid bullies
- Find a friend
- Report bullying
- Act confidently

All three schools, Central Elementary, West Lincoln -Broadwell, and Chester-East Lincoln, gave nothing but the highest praise for this program!
