#### **Plastic Christmas**

Can you identify a fake? Do you know how to pick out a counterfeit? I'm learning.

My wife likes it when I run her around town for Saturday garage sale-ing. She enjoys shopping at a discount. I enjoy the savings. (Thank you Lord!) Recently, she gave me a lesson in counterfeit handbags. I saw a Coach purse and pointed it out to her since she has discovered a passion for expensive purses that my career choice doesn't permit. One from a garage sale seemed to be a good idea to me. Plus I liked the price. Cheap!

However, it would seem fake counterfeit handbags is America's number one fraud. My wife taught me the differences from authentic and fake, the differences from a real Coach purse versus a counterfeit. Needless to say we didn't buy the bogus handbag. It's easy to be taken in by a phony. The same happens in matters of faith especially at Christmas.

Shockingly, there are still some molded plastic lawn Christmas nativity sets floating around out there. The entire set with wisemen and shepherds and camels are hard to come by these days. Occasionally, you might still see a full set on some front lawn, but they are rare. Plastic nativities got me thinking. How many Americans like the idea of plastic Christmas?

Plastic can be cute and inexpensive, but let's remember there's no substance to plastic. It doesn't stand up well when the winds of storms blow. It tumbles over easily; lights inside burn out leaving us in the dark. And how many things are wrong with a plastic Jesus? Our secular culture would love a Jesus they could put away quickly and easily. But Jesus isn't plastic. He's real flesh and blood.

This holiday season, our sermon series is titled "Plastic Christmas?" We're going to look at how secular society packages Christmas versus how God presented Christmas. One leaves us in awe and wonder, and the other leaves us disappointed and hollow. Don't fall for a counterfeit Christmas this year. The story is true. Jesus is real. And our Christmas can have more substance than we have ever imagined.
