In addition, UMCOR is involved in the humanitarian response for the **Ukraine**, aiding Ukrainians in the country and those who are leaving as refugees. If you wish to directly support the Ukrainian effort, you may do so by writing a check to Asbury UMC and putting "Ukraine" in the memo section. Gifts can also be made through Zelle, with the destination as finance@asburylive.org. If you give this way please drop an email to our financial secretary <u>Gail Bryan</u> so she knows what the gift is for. Gifts to the Ukrainian effort are separate from UMCOR Sunday. So please mark "Ukraine" or "UMCOR Sunday" in the memo section depending on which place you want your gift to go.

SSP Lenten Offering





Many of us care deeply about helping our unsheltered neighbors, and often we have helped them indirectly, maybe by donating to one of the great service organizations that help them. The Laundry program at Asbury, in collaboration with the Unitarian Universalist Church in Livermore, provides a great opportunity to help some of these folks directly. Asbury has three washing machines and dryers available three afternoons a week, to anyone in need. Our guests wash their own clothing and bedding, and we provide volunteers to answer questions about how to run the machines, and to make sure they are being used correctly and safely.
