Our online worship will offer us the opportunity to participate in foot




washing and take holy communion. Supplies needed: basin filled with water for foot washing, a cloth, a towel and a bread item and beverage for communion.

"There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens"--so begins Ecclesiastes 3. Asbury has been through a great many changes lately in our IT and communication systems. Many of these changes started in response to the pandemic. We know there have been some glitches and oops while we are in in the process of adapting to new procedures. We have also experienced some key changes in volunteer leadership due to families moving away from Livermore.

I have highlighted a few things that we will do in communications:

- continue to develop our E-articles
- improve our Facebook and local press presence
- initiate an Instagram presence
- begin a major overhaul of the website.

On the IT front, the things we will tackle Include:

- the bringing online of the second camera for worship livestreaming which will improve the visual experience
- calibrate the sound system for both in-person and online worship (it takes different calibrations for each setting)
- develop a manual and more in-depth training for our volunteers (We are grateful for our amazing group of AV volunteers)
- continue to refine our worship slides as we engage more deeply with the new software.

All this change takes time and so we ask for your patience and good humor as we learn and adapt. Some of the improvements will happen soon, others will take a year or a year and half. We welcome feedback and ask you to understand that quick fixes are rare. We must think through and examine how each change impacts other components of the system. We will keep you apprised of our progress. I ask that you hold this group in prayer and be patient. And I extend my deep appreciation to

all who are working on these projects. If you have further questions about what we are doing, please talk with Brad or me. As always, we are happy to discuss these or other matters.
