
Much Ado About...the Food Bank!

We felt called to respond to the well-documented choking death of George Floyd, but needed to educate ourselves on the issues, the history, and the nature of racism. We wanted to be actively working against racism in our own lives and in our society. We've learned a lot and there's so much more yet to learn.

We meet via Zoom on the 4th Tuesday of each month, and we would love to have you join us, no matter where you are in your own journey. Our next meeting is Tuesday, April 26th at 7pm and will be discussing portions of the book, Hood Feminism by Mikki Kendall, which examines how the feminist movement does (and mostly does not) help women of color.
