Pathways to Peace: Are nuclear weapons necessary today?

Global tensions are dramatically rising from the recent Russian invasion of Ukraine. At the forefront of these

tensions is the heightened alert toward nuclear weapon use. For many born in the last few decades, this is the first time in their lives that this threat of nuclear weapon use has felt real. Because of this, Asbury United Methodist Church and Livermore Indivisible are co-sponsoring a public forum entitled, "Pathways to Peace: Are Nuclear Weapons **Necessary Today?**"

There are many perspectives on nuclear weapons and their development, and this forum will highlight four different paths to peace. We will have four experts, Dr. George Miller, Dr. Ron Lehman, Fr. George Griener, and Rev. Joanna Shenk, speaking on the four topics of nuclear deterrence, nuclear reduction, just war theory, and religious pacifism. Livermore, California has a long history and connection to nuclear weapon development through the Lawrence Livermore National, and this forum draws on that history while equipping new generations to answer the question, "Are Nuclear Weapons Necessary Today?".

Prayer will begin with an invitation for worshippers to come forward and light a candle as they pray silently. Prayer request cards may be left in the basket by the prayer


candles. Fernanda will accompany this time of prayer, which will be followed by a brief pastoral prayer and the Lord's prayer.

Antiracism Ministry: Update

At our April meeting, Asbury's Antiracism group discussed the book Hood Feminism: Notes from the Women that a Movement Forgot, written by Mikki Kendall.

We covered just a few of the chapters, but there were still lots of ideas to discuss and think about. The author contends that mainstream feminism in the US does not focus on improving the lives of women of color. Instead, it concentrates on advancing the opportunities for white women. Food insecurity, a living wage, and access to health care and education are issues of importance in "hood feminism." These issues, if addressed, could help all women and men but most especially the disadvantaged people in our society who need the most help.

Because the book is a collection of essays, you can read one or two chapters or even jump around in the book as your interest leads you. Copies are available to borrow if you contact the church office. We guarantee the book will challenge you, give you new perspectives, and leave you with lots to think about.
