## Download the App & Create an Account!

We have our own app! Download it from your phone's app store by searching for "Asbury Livermore." Once you have downloaded it, create your account!

### Creating your account in the Asbury app

**Step 1:** Tap on the three lines in the top left corner of the home screen.

**Step 2:** Tap "Log In or Sign Up."

**Step 3a:** Use Apple ID (iPhones only)  
**Step 3b:** Use Google account info  
**Step 3c:** Use your email address to create account (proceed to Step 4)

**Step 4:** Tap "Create an account."

**Step 5:** Create an account using your email address.

### WHY you should create an account

- You'll be able to send and receive messages within the app with other Asbury folks who have an account.
- You can set up online giving for donations or if you need to pay for an event, item, or service.
- You'll (hopefully, eventually) be able to register your attendance at worship with a single tap!
- **Note:** if you don't plan on using the online giving/payment system, you do not have to connect a credit/debit card to your account

### How to create your account:

1. Open the Asbury app and tap on the icon with three lines in the top left corner
2. Tap "Log In or Sign Up."
3. Choose which method you want to use to create your account.
  - 3a. "Continue with Apple" - use your Apple ID (iPhones only), then you're done!
  - 3b. "Continue with Google" - use your Google account info, then you're done!
  - 3c. "Continue with Email" - use your email address to create an account, then proceed to Step 4
4. Tap "Create an account."

5. Enter your name, email address, and create a password. Then tap "Create account" and you're done!

**Training includes:** ERT training manual, ID badge, lanyard and t-shirt

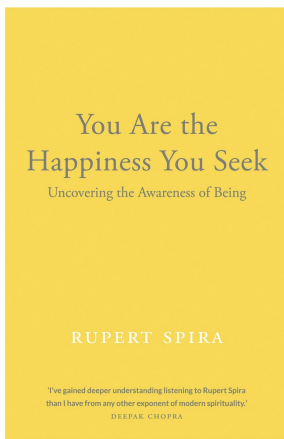

## Tiny Homes at Asbury: Update

On Sunday, September 11, after worship, the congregation gathered to hear what the Tiny Homes Task Force has been working on since January. A recording of this event will eventually be posted on the Asbury website, so watch for the announcement in a future e-article. When it is available, we encourage you to view it there if you were unable to attend, or even if you just want to hear it again.

There are, of course, many more questions than answers at this stage. Lots of study and research remain to be done. Here, however, are a few of the highlights of what we know so far.

1. There is a real need for housing the unsheltered in our area. As of the 2022 point-in-time count of the unsheltered in Alameda County (delayed three years because of Covid) there were 7,135 homeless people in Alameda County, 174 of them in Livermore. This number continues to grow every year.
2. Asbury is blessed with having ample unused land behind the Fertile Groundworks gardens and the community gardens, which gives us the unique opportunity to provide the space for tiny homes. The land is zoned for residential use.
3. Creating housing for the unsheltered very much aligns with Asbury's core values: being centered in Jesus Christ, we grow in faith, we celebrate community, and we serve others with love. It will take faith to undertake such a large and complex project; along with our partnering social service agency, we will strive to create a safe, stable, supportive community for the residents of the tiny homes; and of course, we will serve them with love and kindness, not judgment and barriers to healing.
4. A housing model that has proved highly successful in helping the unsheltered transition away from the streets for the long term is called "Housing First." Once in permanent supportive housing, people can better address their other needs, e.g. reconnecting with family, getting medical help, and working on education and job goals.
5. The City, District Superintendent and a local service agency (La Familia) have encouraged us to continue exploring the concept of



building tiny homes at Asbury.

6. If this use of the land is approved by the Cal-Nev Conference Cabinet, the approval of the congregation will then be sought in an all-member vote. If approved the plan will then go to the regional body for approval, since the land belongs to the Annual Conference, not to Asbury.

There will be other educational events be presented in the future and the Tiny Homes Task Force will keep everyone updated with articles in the digital newsletter, announcements in worship, etc.
