# Church Conference re: Tiny Homes

Sunday, May 21 | After worship

The District Superintendent, Samuel Hong, has authorized Asbury to hold an all-Church Conference on Sunday, May 21 following worship at approximately 11:15 am. The Reverend Michael Yoshii has been authorized to Chair the Church Conference. This Church Conference has one item on the Agenda: Tiny Homes.

The Conference will be asked to vote on the following which has been supported by the Board of Trustees and the Church Council: We authorize the Trustees of Asbury to sign and submit the planning application for a community of 16 tiny homes and associated administrative buildings on Asbury's back lot to provide housing to the chronically homeless.

The planning application and this approval do not obligate Asbury to build the tiny homes, even once the planning application is approved by the City of Livermore. The Tiny Homes Task Force will make a short presentation prior to the vote. The vote will be by written ballot. There will be one ballot box in the courtyard for those who are still avoiding indoor gatherings due to COVID. All are

welcome to attend the Church Conference but only Church Members (the technical term is Professing Members) may vote. If anyone needs a ride to the church conference, please contact the church office by May 18. Please direct your questions to Pastor Kathy or Rob Rudd. Thank you.

## **Tiny Homes Progress Report**

The Tiny Homes Task Force has been hard at work since the last update on March 22. As explained in that article, if we choose to use our property to create supportive housing for the chronically unsheltered, we would need help from other partners. Firm Foundation is drawing up conceptual plans of what a tiny home village might look like. The Task Force and the Trustees have made suggestions, which Firm Foundation is now incorporating into their drawings. Members of the Task Force have also talked with La Familia, the social service agency interested in providing the "supportive" part of the homes (including an on-site supervisor 24/7). These conversations are clarifying who would be eligible to live in the homes and what the rules and quidelines would be for the residents and their visitors. As also mentioned in the article on March 22, the Task Force needs more information from the City of Livermore. In order to provide that information, the City needs a Planning General Application, a document that is nearly completed now. Before it is filed, however, the members of Asbury will be asked to vote on sending in this application. Remember, this is not the vote on building tiny homes, it is just a vote on whether or not the congregation wants the Task Force to continue its research by getting more information from the City of Livermore. Another group of Task Force members are working on improving communications with the neighbors adjacent to Asbury's property.

A tiny home village is an important mission of compassion, and if it is to be built, many aspects need to be carefully studied. Keep checking the Asbury Articles for further updates. And keep the unsheltered, the neighbors, the Asbury congregation, and the Task Force in your prayers.

# Asbury Masking Policy

Alameda County is following the CDC guidelines for masking. When community transmission is low, masking indoors may be optional. When community transmission is medium or high, masking indoors is strongly recommended. Asbury will follow the CDC guidelines, and we support and encourage mask wearing indoors, especially for those with underlying health conditions or who are not fully vaccinated and boosted.
