MARK 15

**“My God, my God,
why have you forsaken me?”**

MARK 16

**“He has risen;
He is not here.”**

THE MOVEMENT

Darkness → Dawn

Forsakenness → Resurrection

Death → Life

THE WOMEN WENT TO THE TOMB

They weren't expecting a resurrection.

They were expecting a corpse.

“WHO WILL ROLL AWAY THE STONE?”

Mark 16:3

THEY WERE WORRYING ABOUT A PROBLEM

GOD HAD ALREADY SOLVED.

THE STONE WAS ROLLED AWAY

**Not to let Jesus out—
but to let them see He was already gone.**

“HE HAS RISEN”

Mark 16:6

THE SAME JESUS

Jesus of Nazareth

Who was crucified

Who is risen

THE RESURRECTION MEANS

SIN DIDN'T WIN.

DEATH DIDN'T WIN.

THE GRAVE DIDN'T WIN.

JESUS ENTERED THE PLACE OF THE FORSAKEN

He bore what we deserved to bear.

“THE LORD HAS LAID ON HIM
THE INIQUITY OF US ALL.”

Isaiah 53:6

THE CROSS WAS NOT AN ACCIDENT

Jesus gave Himself.

THE RESURRECTION WAS GOD'S DECLARATION

THE SACRIFICE WAS ACCEPTED.

THE VICTORY WAS WON.

“TELL HIS DISCIPLES—AND PETER.”

Mark 16:7

PETER HAD FAILED JESUS

**But failure did not get the final word.
JESUS DID.**

THE RESURRECTED JESUS

RESTORES FAILING PEOPLE

Grace gets the last word.

“GO INTO ALL THE WORLD
AND PROCLAIM THE GOSPEL”

Mark 16:15

THE RESURRECTION CREATES A MISSION

We don't just celebrate the empty tomb.

WE CARRY THE MESSAGE.

MARK 15

He was forsaken.

He entered death.

He bore our sin.

MARK 16

He has risen.

Death couldn't keep Him.

He is alive.

THE EMPTY TOMB CHANGES EVERYTHING

Your sin doesn't define you.

Your shame doesn't define you.

Your failure doesn't define you.

Death doesn't get the final word.
