

UNDERSTANDING SCRIPTURE: A SHIFT IN PERSPECTIVE

The Bible was written **for** us, but it was not written **to** us—and that distinction is crucial. Too often, people approach Scripture by asking, “What does this mean to me?” While well-intentioned, that mindset can lead to misunderstanding and misinterpretation. The truth is, the Bible was originally written to real people living in specific historical, cultural, and linguistic contexts. To grasp its true meaning, we must first ask: **“What did this mean to them?”**

Only after understanding the original context can we faithfully interpret the message and apply it accurately to our lives today.

“The natural person does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, for they are folly to him, and he is not able to understand them because they are spiritually discerned.”
– 1 CORINTHIANS 2:14

“For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart.”

Begin your Bible reading time in prayer asking God for understanding, and end with prayer asking God to help you be changed by it—because we need the Spirit of God to help us know, understand, discern, and rightly apply His Word.
