Midweek Worship at PBC: Another Chance to Sit at the Lord's Feet

"And she had a sister called Mary, who also sat at Jesus' feet and heard His word. But Martha was distracted with much serving, and she approached Him and said, 'Lord, do You not care that my sister has left me to serve alone? Therefore, tell her to help me.' And Jesus answered and said to her, 'Martha, Martha, you are worried and troubled about many things. But one thing is needed, and Mary has chosen that good part, which will not be taken away from her.'" Luke 10:38-42 (NKJV)



We live busy lives, don't we? Our calendars fill up quickly with all kinds of great and important things. Between our work obligations, school schedules, practices, sports, medical appointments, homework, errands, meals, everyday responsibilities, and prayerfully, *worship and church family priorities*, sometimes we feel like there simply aren't enough hours in a day. Something's going to get left out or missed out on at the paces we run from day to day. A lot of times, unfortunately, sitting at Jesus' feet is the thing that gets the least attention. In recent Barna studies, the average churchgoer attends 1.6 times per month on the weekends (Barna, September 2025) and 50% of Christians across the U.S. study their Bibles weekly (Barna, November 2025). While we praise God for these trends moving upward over recent months in the hearts of young adults and youth, it's still a sad reality that the demands, problems, commitments, and schedules in life have seemingly taken the focus of so many people regarding worship. And many churches have shuttered their doors to additional opportunities for corporate worship, Bible study, and prayer for those things. We, like Martha, can get "worried and troubled about many things."

What if we chose a different way? What if, instead of being carried along by the demands of the world, we intentionally made room to seek the Lord together?

That's why I believe the Lord is leading me to "bring back" an opportunity for our church to worship together on Wednesday nights. I envision a simple night of worship in song, fellowship, prayer, and Bible study in a place where we can all sit at the feet of Jesus. The goal is not to try to squeeze in one more activity in an already overcrowded schedule, but to provide another opportunity to step away from the noise and busyness of life and intentionally turn our attention toward God.

As our church grows, I see the need for more opportunities to be together in fellowship, to open God's truth, and to hear from Him. Colossians 3:16 calls us to *"Let the word of Christ dwell in us richly in all wisdom, teaching, and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord."* The early church in Acts 2 had a deep commitment to gathering for teaching, fellowship, breaking bread, and prayer & the Apostle Paul called the Corinthians to build one another up in gatherings for worship (1 Corinthians 4:26). I see an opportunity in the middle of the week to grow us deeper in our following, understanding, and love of the Lord. I also see how significant this can be for each other. Mary chose that good part. She chose to sit at Jesus' feet. She understood how valuable it was for her life to prioritize that time with Him, and it was not taken away from her.

Teaching Updates: Sundays

*"Oh, the depth of the riches both of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How **unsearchable** are His judgements and **unfathomable** His ways!" - Romans 11:33.*

This has essentially been our "theme verse" for our Sunday morning teachings/discussions as we just finished our 6-week study on "The Heart of God." During this series, we looked at six different attributes of our Lord. We have discussed how His heart is...

- Holy
- Merciful
- Gracious
- Loving
- Just
- Faithful

It has been a joy to look all over both the Old and New Testaments of Scripture and see how God has so graciously and willingly revealed not only Himself to us but how He sees us and cares for us! This series allowed our students to not merely grow in head knowledge of our Lord but seeing how God continually invites us to know and love Him more, as He has shown how much He loves and cares for us. We finished the series with several verses but one that has spoke to me recently is Psalm 113:5-6, which reads, "Who is like the LORD our God, who is enthroned on high, who **humbles Himself** to the things that are in heaven and in earth?" *We have a God who is like no other. One who is **perfect** in every way; knows all things and is in control of all things. Yet He is humble enough, careful enough, loving enough to look at us who are unworthy, and sees us, cares for us, and loves us far more than we could ever imagine. The Lord has blessed us these past several weeks as we have sought out just a small amount of His endless/perfect attributes!*

Teaching Updates: Wednesday Nights

We then finished the day with a friendly game of Kickball, with amazing color commentary from Pastor Peter and Brooke Smith! We are so grateful to serve our community in this way!



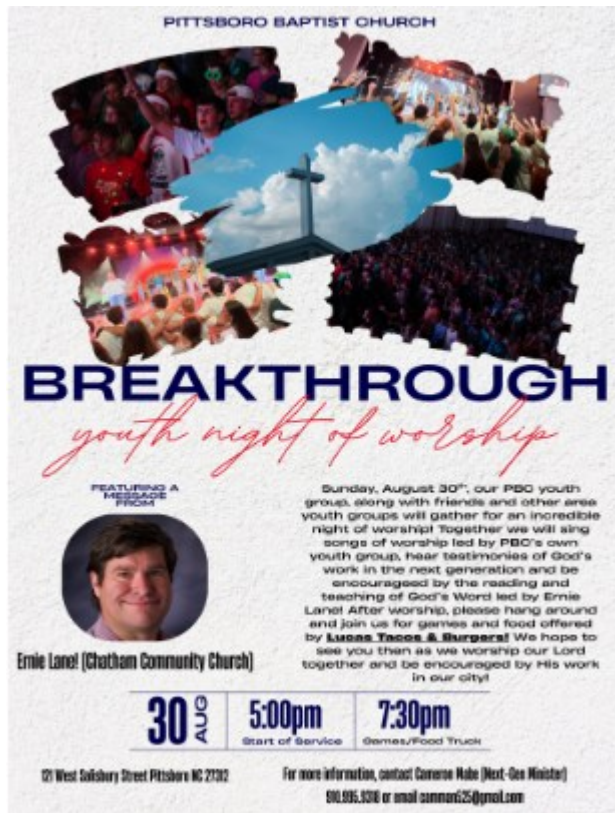
Fantasy Lake FUN!

Closing Encouragement

When I co-lead a Young Adult small group at my old church, I had the privilege of co-leading with an amazing married couple, the Labus'! I got in touch with them this past weekend, where Brox, the husband, sent me a picture of a dress shirt he got with "37:24." When he asked me if those numbers were familiar, I had no clue! I made a guess (and was wrong), then he told me that it was a reference to Psalm 37:24, which was a verse I would reference several times during our small groups and have also shared here at Pittsboro several times already! That Psalm (specifically 37:23-24) spoke to me heavily several months ago in my life, where I was fearful of what was to come, being scared to fail. Here's what that passage says,

"The steps of a man are established by the LORD, and He delights in his way. When he falls, he will not be hurled headlong, because the LORD is the One who holds his hand" (Psalm 37:23-24).

I am writing this for several reasons. One, I wanted to shout out my old co-leaders! They were such a blessing to me. Secondly, I have always had a fear of failure. Whether it be from pride, how others perceive me, etc., it is wrong to have an unhealthy fear of failure. With having this fear, I can have unrealistic expectations set and even isolate myself because of the fear of hurting/disappointing someone because of my failure. This scripture directly attacks that!

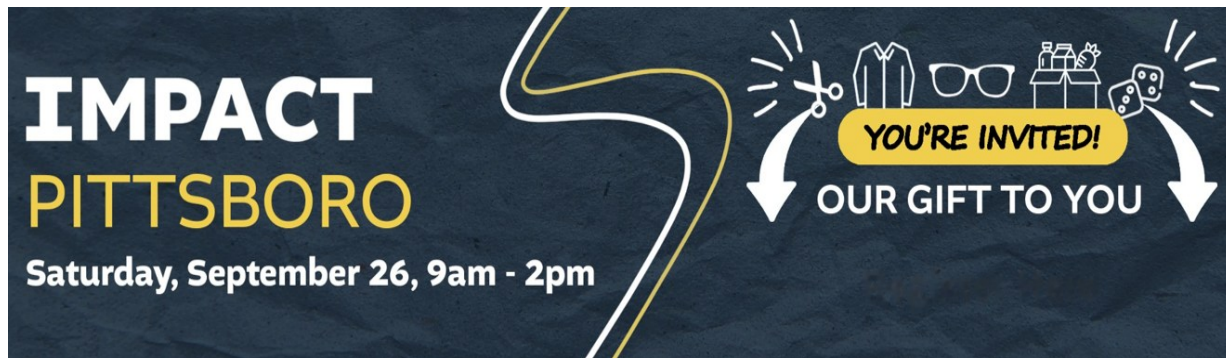
- First, it comforts us, reminding us that God is in control of our lives. Praise the Lord that we have a God that establishes our steps and even watches our steps (Psalm 113:5-6).
- Second, it humbles us, God makes it clear that you and I WILL fail. We cannot be perfect, we cannot plan every step accordingly, for there will be mistakes, whether it is something out of our control or something from our own doing or lack of doing.
- Third, this passage teaches us that failure does not equal destruction. This is because God Himself is committed to not letting us be "hurled headlong" (v.24). We will not be hurled headlong, not because we are the ones who save ourselves, but because God holds our hand!

Maybe today, you feel burned out; maybe you feel as if everything around you is not going the way you hoped and everything that you are trying to do is just simply not working out. I pray that this passage serves as a great comfort to you. The Lord knows where you are and does not enjoy seeing you in this state. At the same time, I pray that this passage gives you great motivation to cry out to your LORD, who is already holding you by your hand and is ready to guide you to where He has already declared for you to go! This does not mean that you will know the entire path, but He will reveal to you the path you need to go, even if it's one step at a time. This is where we MUST remember God's heart towards us and the gospel. If He has loved us enough to send His Son Jesus, to die on our behalf and be raised again for the destruction of sin and the reconciliation between God and man, why would He not care for you in your day to day struggles and worries!?

Let's remember today that we have a God who has established our steps and is committed to our completion of that path, not by our own will and strength, but by the strength, grace, mercy, and great love that the One and Only God has for YOU! You are loved, thank you for taking the time to read about what's going on with our church and youth group!

Through this initiative, PBC will have an opportunity each month to **encourage, uplift, show appreciation, and share God's love with the amazing staff at Pittsboro Elementary School (PES)**. Here's what we have planned:

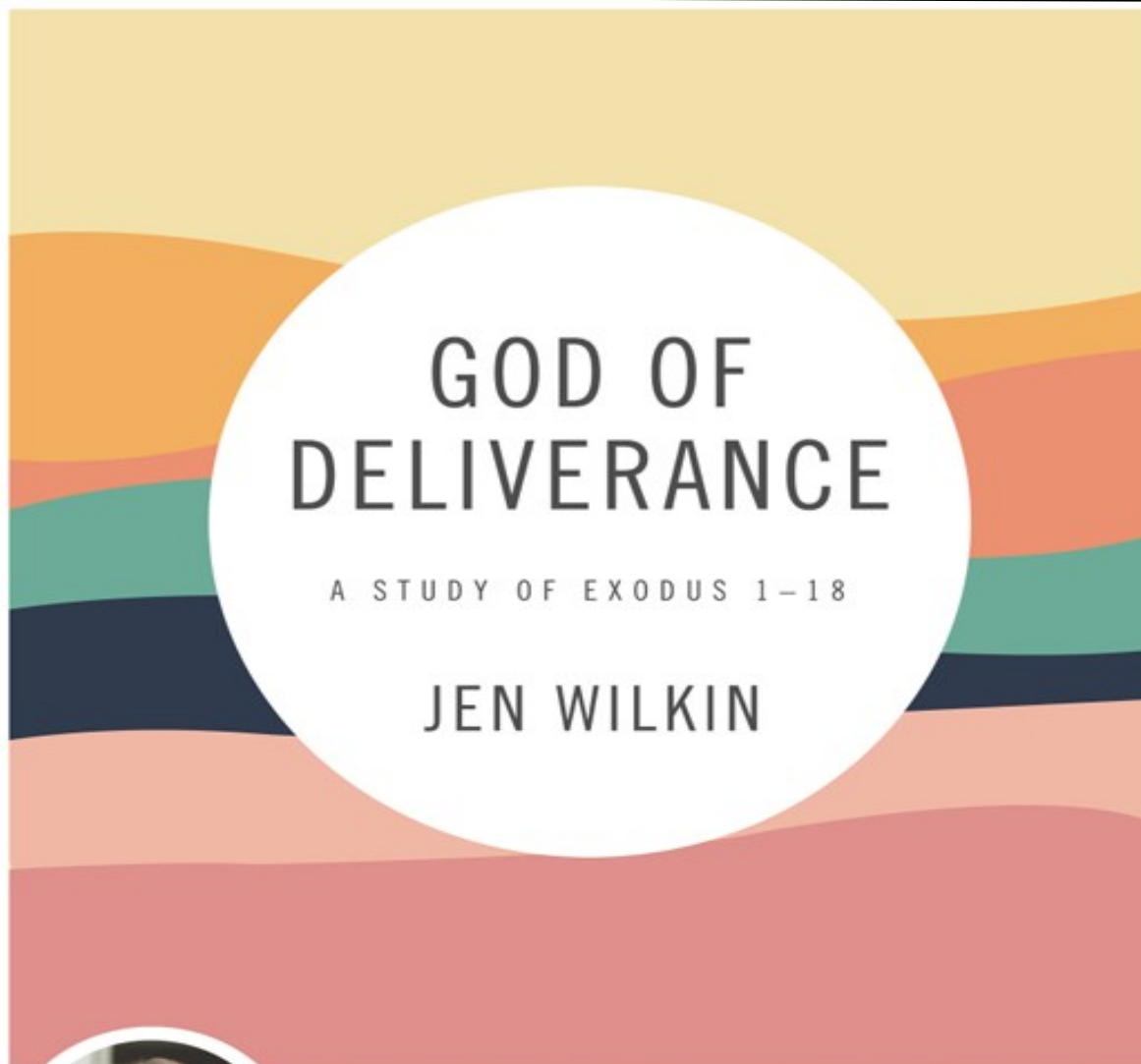

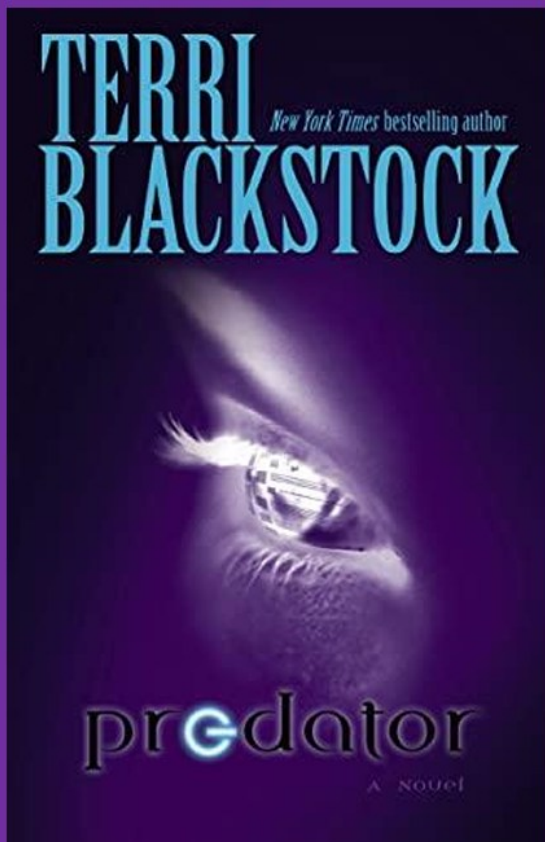

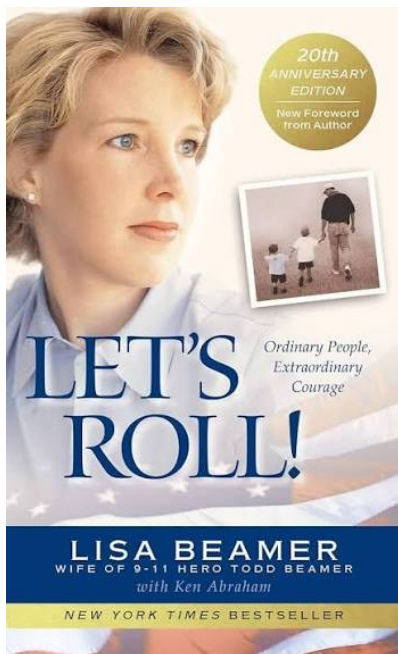

horrific events of that devastating day. She reveals poignant moments—telling her sons their daddy was dead, celebrating Todd's birthday without him, and the grief and joy

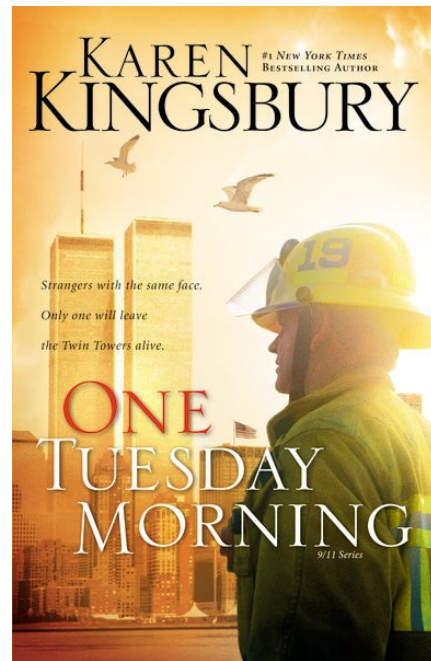

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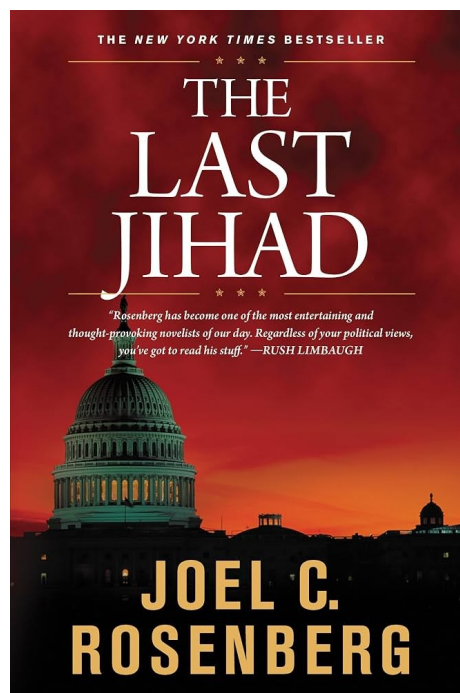
Last Jihad**by Joel Rosenberg**

But just before a treaty can be signed, Israeli commandos foil an Iraqi Scud missile launch, recovering a nuclear warhead and evidence that the next attack will level Washington, New York and Tel Aviv.

Now, the Israeli Prime Minister gives the American President an ultimatum: Melt

down Baghdad within one hour . . . or Israel will do it herself. From Jerusalem, Bennett and McCoy must summon all their stealth and savvy to save themselves--and the world--from absolute destruction.

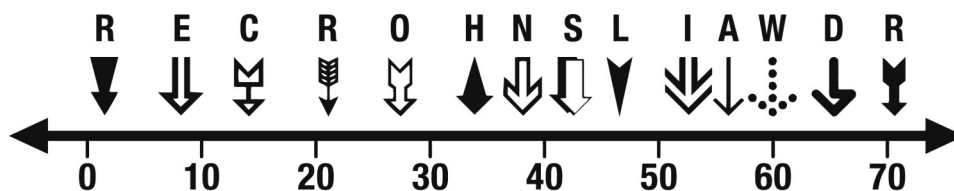
