What an exciting beginning to the Easter Season we've experienced over the past month! April began with celebrating the Good News that Christ is Risen, and we didn't stop there. As you'll see throughout this month's Connect, our celebrations have continued through fellowship opportunities for men and women alike, serving as the hands and feet of Christ through special events, including Rise Against Hunger and Rebuilding Together, and we continue to worship and celebrate together each Sunday as we consider what the Resurrected Life looks like each and every day.

During this Easter season, we've also added something new to our Celebration Center, the Empty Cross, which is currently sitting upon the Lord's Table. Now I'm sure some of you may be curious as to the cross' meaning. Why is it just an outline of a cross, and why is it called "empty"? The cross is an important

symbol for Christians. It is a symbol of the grace, forgiveness, and sacrifice of Jesus Christ. When you see the cross, it is a reminder that Jesus was willing to give everything, including his life, so that we might be freed from our sins. But, as Christians, we are also Easter people. The cross of Good Friday and the darkness of death are not the end of the story. We know that, long ago on the Sunday that followed, the tomb was found empty, death was defeated, Jesus was alive! Because of this, we too might experience true and abundant life now and for all eternity.

So this Easter, the cross placed upon our Lord's Table is a reminder that the cross stands empty! Jesus is no longer there. In the same way, may we see sin, darkness, and death as nothing but empty threats as well. Thanks to the resurrection of Jesus Christ, we know that our sins, shortcomings, doubts, and fears no longer have dominion over us. As you enter the Celebration Center each week, and you see the empty cross, may it serve as a reminder. Yes, remember the sacrifice Jesus gave, but just as importantly, may you remember that Jesus is no longer on the cross; Jesus is resurrected and alive, the cross is empty. Jesus' mission and ministry, his Kingdom, his story, continues to this day.

And so does yours. Each and every week, as we continue to live as Easter people, the story of God's love for us and the calling to share this Good News with all people continues through you. The cross is empty because Jesus and his followers are busy in the world bringing God's Kingdom here to Earth. I look forward to continuing this story and living as Easter people right alongside you again this week. See you Sunday!

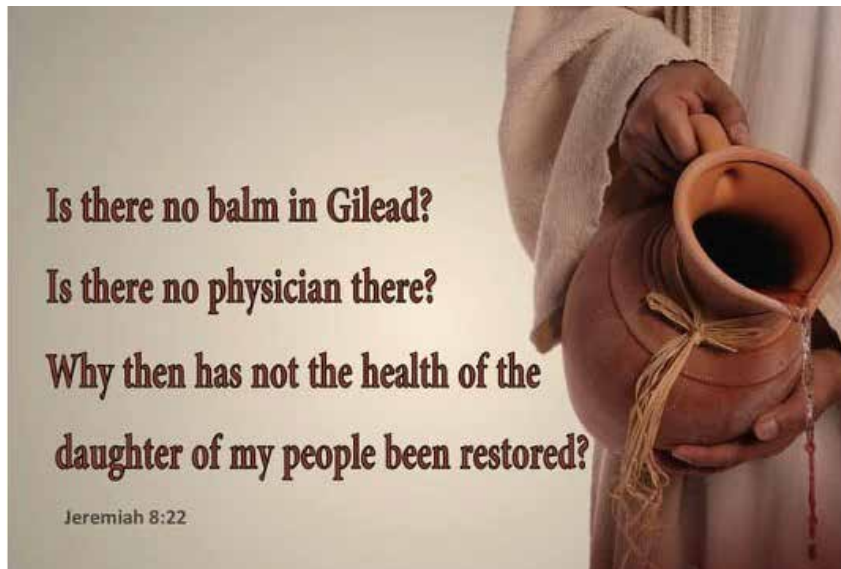

This study led by Nancy Harris will begin on September 9. Look for upcoming information in the August 2026 Connect.

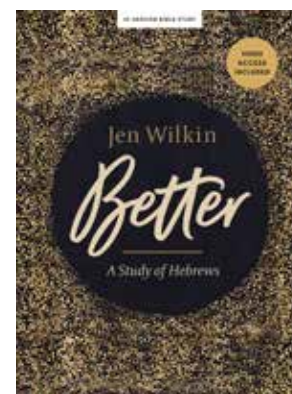


Wednesday Night Women's Bible Study – “Better: A Study of Hebrews”

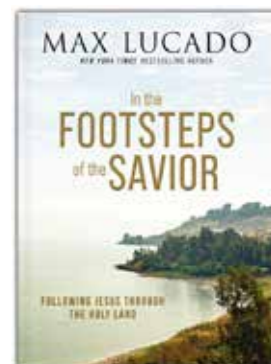

TOGETHER, WE MAKE A DIFFERENCE

If you haven't seen the movie *The Swedish Connection*, I hope you will find time to do so. This is a true story that focuses on an unheralded bureaucrat in the Swedish government named Gosta Engzell and the steps he and his team took that ended up saving thousands of Jews during World War II. Gosta and his team were simple, ordinary people who were often forgotten or disregarded by their superiors, but their consistent determination and resolve to do the right thing translated into extraordinary results that have had a ripple effect many, many years later.

In so many ways, that is how I feel about the role that the Leadership Team at Church of the Servant plays. We are normal people who each bring our own unique perspective to the Team's discussions and meetings. Not everyone has financial experience. Not all of us have managed teams or businesses. Not all of us have been in church leadership positions before, but ALL of us have a common love for Church of the Servant and have raised our hands to help in any way, to contribute to extraordinary results.

The Leadership Team has been busy as we move past the first quarter of 2026, and I would like to share a few of those highlights with you.

LISTENING POSTS –

Our Listening Posts have been in place for the Leadership Team to “err on the side of transparency” in our daily work so the congregation is up to date on our projects and areas of improvement. The Listening Posts also give the congregation the opportunity to share their perspectives with the Leadership Team. A few of our Leadership Team members recently got together to explore ways to improve the Listening Post experience. You will see more in the near future about these meetings, but we are actively investigating moving the times to make it more convenient for anyone who would like to attend and updating our agendas to make the experience more conversational with the congregation.

NATHAN ONEY RECEPTION –

Very soon, we will be welcoming Rev. Nathan Oney and his wife, Kristia, to our congregation. Nathan's arrival will be on the first of July, and the Leadership Team is actively working to organize a reception to welcome Nathan, Kristia, and their son, Elliott. This will give all of us a chance to meet Nathan and his family, and for them to meet us in a more informal, conversational setting. LENT AND EASTER HIGHLIGHTS –

What a wonderful and joyous Lenten Season and Easter Sunday we had at Church of the Servant! Many of you experienced the phenomenal Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services, and, of course, Easter Sunday, when approximately 650 were in attendance, but you may not have known about the Egg-stravaganza event earlier in the week. This family gathering had 106 families representing 230 individuals coming from throughout our community.

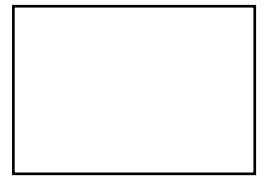
