Greetings Servant Faith Family!

The front of our Celebration Center was adorned this past month with a vintage children's desk, providing a visual aid throughout our recent "The Desk of a Disciple" sermon series. As I was preparing to put it away after our final service in the series, I took a moment to examine it more closely.

The desk and chair are sturdy and well built; there are even holes at the base of the legs where it was once screwed into the floor. No leaning back on two legs in this chair! There's a cubby for storage and an opening for an inkwell. Dripped ink and pencil marks discolor the wood. I don't know where this desk was in use, but my best guess is that it served a school somewhere in the late 1800s to early 1900s.

This made me consider how many different children have filled that chair over the past century or more. What has that desk seen? Children learning to read, solve math equations, or maybe taking notes from a lecture on how our solar system works. Did students use that wooden surface to compose poetry, bring their imagination to life through a simple drawing, or craft a note to pass to their crush a couple of rows over? In the decades since it was likely removed from a school setting, where has it lived? Have previous owners used it as a space for their children or grandchildren to complete their homework, color, or write their own stories? Such a simple piece of furniture, yet so much history.

As I considered this truth about the desk, I realized it is also true about the place where we gather each and every Sunday. The Celebration Center is a space where people have offered God their praise, laughed until their stomachs hurt, and wept until they had no more tears to give. Children have been baptized, couples proclaimed "I do", loved ones memorialized, and bread has been broken so that the faithful may gather around a large table and partake of God's grace.



This month marks Church of the Servant's 58th birthday. On Sunday, September 8, 1968, at a previous location, 148 individuals gathered for our first worship service. Since that day, Church of the Servant has spent nearly six decades building, experiencing, and sharing God's Kingdom in the Northwest Oklahoma City community.

We may not know all of the individual stories, but every time we take a seat, lift our voices, and proclaim the Good News, we join our lives with one another and those who have come before us. As we do, we are intertwining our personal stories with an even larger story: the ongoing story of God's Kingdom here on earth. I look forward to continuing to write that story with you this coming Sunday!

Nathan's NOTES

In 1806, U.S. Army officer Zebulon Pike set out to explore the western edge of the newly acquired Louisiana Purchase. Four months into the expedition, Pike and his team were traveling across the plains of what is now Kansas and Colorado when he looked toward the horizon and saw what he described as “a small blue cloud.” Eventually, Pike realized it wasn’t a cloud at all. It was a mountain peak: the peak we now know as Pike’s Peak.

At first, Pike wasn’t particularly impressed. He had seen mountains before. His experience was with the Alleghenies in the East, so he interpreted this new mountain through what he already knew about mountains. It looked like a mountain, and therefore, he assumed, it must be about the size of the mountains he had seen before. Pike estimated that they could reach it in a day, so they started walking.

A day passed, and the mountain was still in the distance. Then another. By the third day, Pike was beginning to realize that his original calculation was wrong. What’s more, the mountain didn’t seem to be getting much closer. In fact, the closer they got, the more enormous it seemed.

What had at first looked like a small blue cloud on the horizon eventually unfolded into the crown of an enormous range: ridge after ridge, slope after slope; stretching farther and rising higher than Pike had imagined possible. Every time he thought he had finally understood the scale of what he was seeing, the landscape corrected him.

Upon reaching the base weeks after first spotting the peak, Pike abandoned any hope of reaching the summit. He concluded, “I believe that no human being could have ascended to its pinnacle.”

There is something almost funny about the story. Pike wasn’t wrong to recognize what he was seeing as a mountain. He was wrong about how big a mountain could be. He had seen mountains before, so he assumed he already knew what a mountain could be... until he encountered one that was bigger than his idea of a mountain.

I wonder if we sometimes do the same thing with God’s love. We may think we understand love because we have experienced it before. We have known friendship, family, generosity, forgiveness, compassion. We have seen beautiful and genuine expressions of love, and those experiences give us a picture of what love is supposed to look like.

But what if God’s love is bigger than our idea of love? What if, every time we think we have finally figured out the boundaries of God’s grace, God reveals that there is still more? What if the life of faith is not simply learning to understand God, but allowing ourselves to be continually surprised by the vastness of God’s love?

Sometimes faith asks us to let go of the limits we have placed on what God can do, whom God can love, and what grace can reach. Like Pike standing before a mountain that was far larger than his experience could account for, we may discover that God is not smaller than we imagined, but infinitely greater.

TUESDAY MORNING BIBLE STUDIES

Looking for a Bible Study? There is a seat for you on Tuesday morning! There's coffee and a donut, there's good company, and there's an open Bible on the table. It's an hour that sets the week down on a solid footing before it gets away from you.

We are in the second half of Isaiah. This is the part of the book that turns toward hope — toward the Messiah who was coming. You already know one of its lines even if you've never opened Isaiah: "They that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles." We're going to spend the fall finding out what stands behind those words. There's nothing else quite like it in Scripture.

If you're new, this is the right place for you. We open by walking back through what's come before, so no one starts out behind. You don't need to have read a page. Just come.

There are two sessions, same study, same morning.

- **Men's Buck and a Bible | 6:30 a.m.**
- **Women in the Word | 9:30 a.m.**

Bring a Bible. That's all you need. The dollar covers the coffee and the donut, and the fellowship is free.

We'll be in Isaiah through February, and then we take up the Gospel of Mark in the spring and finish it by summer. Come once and see how it sits with you. My guess is you'll be back.

We will meet in Community Hall for both studies.

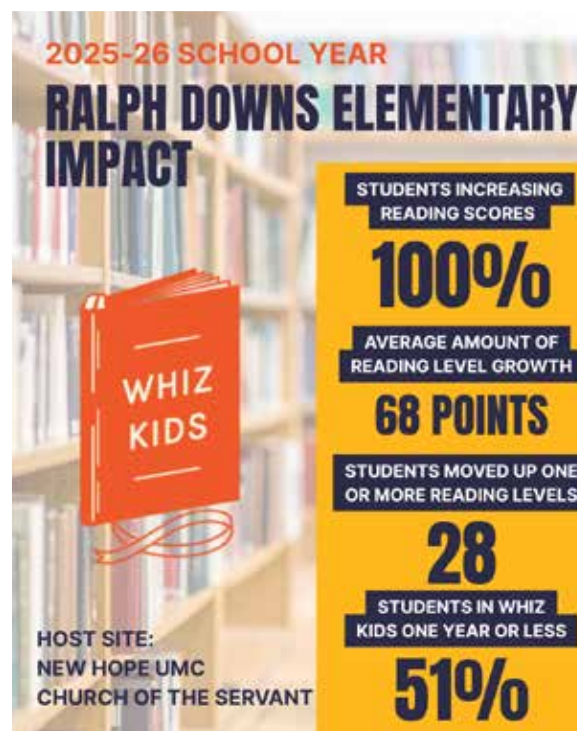
