Pray through your observations and application and ask God to grow your dependence on Him.

Pause: acknowledge who God is and ask him to convict your heart of any sin
Rejoice: praise God for His redeeming work in your heart through Jesus and give Him thanks for specific things
Ask: bring your requests before God knowing He loves you and hears you
Yield: submit to God's will and quiet your heart to hear from Him
