



God's Plan to Redeem the Earth

The entire physical universe was created for God's glory. When we rebelled, the universe fell under the weight of our sin. Yet God did not give up on us.

The serpent's seduction of Adam and Eve did not catch God by surprise. He had in place a plan by which He would redeem mankind—and all creation—from sin, corruption, and death. Just as He promises to make men and women new, He promises to renew the earth itself.

“As the new heavens and the new earth that I make will endure before me, declares the Lord, ‘so will your name and descendants endure’” (Isaiah 66:22).

“In keeping with his promise we are looking forward to a new heaven and a new earth, the home of righteousness” (2 Peter 3:13).

“I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away” (Rev 21:1).

Many other passages allude to the New Heavens and New Earth without using those terms. God's redemptive plan culminates not at the return of Christ, nor in the millennial kingdom, but on the New Earth. Only then will all wrongs be made right. Only then will there be no more death, crying, or pain (Rev 21:1-4).

Consider this: If God's plan were merely to take mankind to the intermediate Heaven, or to a Heaven that was the dwelling place of spirit beings, there would be no need for New Heavens and a New Earth. Why refashion the stars of the heavens and the continents of the earth? God could simply destroy His original creation and put it all behind Him. But He doesn't do that. Upon creating the heavens and the earth, He called it “very good” (Gen 1:31). Not once has He renounced His claim on what He made.

God isn't going to abandon His creation. He's going to restore it. Earth's destruction will not be permanent but temporary. Just as our destroyed bodies will be raised as new bodies, the destroyed Earth will be raised as a New Earth. We won't go to Heaven and leave Earth behind. Rather, God will bring Heaven and Earth together into the same dimension, with no wall of separation, no armed angels to guard Heaven's perfection from sinful mankind (Gen 3:24). God's perfect plan is “to bring all things in heaven and on earth together under one head, even Christ” (Eph 1:10).

God has never given up on His original creation. Yet somehow we've managed to overlook an entire biblical vocabulary that makes this point clear.

Reconcile. Redeem. Restore. Recover. Return. Renew. Regenerate. Resurrect. Each of these biblical words begins with the *re-* prefix, suggesting a return to an original condition that was ruined or lost. For example, *redemption* means to buy back what

was formerly owned. Similarly, *reconciliation* means the restoration or re-establishment of a prior friendship or unity. *Renewal* means to make new again, restoring to an original state. *Resurrection* means becoming physically alive again, after death.

These words emphasize that God always sees us in light of what He intended us to be, and He always seeks to *restore us* to that design. Likewise, He sees the earth in terms of what He intended it to be, and He seeks to restore it to its original design.

In his excellent book *Creation Regained*, Albert Wolters writes, “[God] hangs on to his fallen original creation and salvages it. He refuses to abandon the work of his hands—in fact he sacrifices his own Son to save his original project. Humankind which has botched its original mandate and the whole creation along with it, is given another chance in Christ; we are reinstated as God’s managers on earth. The original good creation is to be restored.”

If God had wanted to consign Adam and Eve to Hell and start over, He could have. But He didn’t. Instead, He chose to redeem what He started with—the heavens, the earth, and mankind—to bring them back to His original purpose. God is the ultimate salvage artist. He loves to restore things—and make them even better.

“Ruined sinners to reclaim.” This phrase from the hymn “Hallelujah, What a Savior!” reflects God’s purpose in our salvation. *Reclaim* is another *re-* word. It recognizes that God had a prior claim on humanity that was temporarily lost but is fully restored and taken to a new level in Christ. “*The earth is the Lord’s, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it*” (Psalm 24:1). God has never surrendered His title deed to the earth. He owns it—and He will not relinquish it to His enemies. In fact, Scripture tells us that “*the reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the devil’s work*” (1 John 3:8).

Note that it says Christ came not to destroy the *world* (which is *his* world) but to destroy the devil’s *works*, which are to twist and pervert and ruin the world God made. Redemption will forever destroy the work of the devil by removing his hold on creation and by reversing the consequences. Far from destroying the world, God’s plan is to *keep it from being destroyed* by Satan. God’s plan is to remove the destruction that has already been inflicted on it. His plan is to redeem the world. God placed mankind on Earth to fill it, rule it, and develop it to God’s glory. But that plan has never been fulfilled. Should we therefore conclude that God’s plan was ill-conceived, thwarted, or abandoned? No. These conclusions do not fit the character of an all-knowing, all-wise, sovereign God. Second Peter 3 does *not* teach that God will destroy the earth and then be done with it. Rather, it promises that God will renew Heaven *and* Earth.

God is not some hapless inventor whose creation failed. He has a masterful plan, and He will *not* surrender us *or* the earth to the trash heap.

That makes me want to thank Him right now.

Dear God, expand our view of your greatness so that we may gain an appreciation for the greatness of your redemptive work. Thank you that you did not abandon us to Hell, but that you loved us enough to shed your divine blood to rescue us

and our planet. Thank you that we have a future, and that Earth—from which you formed us, and over which you made us to rule—also has a future. Help us to anticipate that future today. and may our anticipation affect the decisions we make. We ask these things in the great name of our Redeemer, Jesus, the Lord of the earth. ❖

Who Wants to Live Forever?

But when the time comes to face the final enemy that is Death, Christians have a marvelous confidence: our life in Christ will never end. At the moment of death, our souls will be taken up to him.

And that's only the beginning. For the Bible looks beyond death to the full restoration of body and soul. The Apostles' Creed teaches us to confess, "I believe in the resurrection of the body." As Christ says in John 5:28-29, "*An hour is coming when all who are in their tombs will hear my voice and come out.*"

Jesus showed the truth of this during his ministry.

His friend Lazarus had become sick and died. Jesus was a long time in coming, and when He arrived, already four days had passed. Many Jews believed that the soul remained near the body for three days, and cherished the hope that it might yet return. But after three days, a person was completely and irrevocably dead.

On the fourth day, impossibly late, Jesus appears at Lazarus' tomb. He simply speaks, "Lazarus, come out!" And Lazarus does come out of his resting place, grave clothes and all. Alive in Christ!

In a similar way, on Judgment Day all those who are dead will hear Jesus' voice. Hearing him, they will come out of their resting places, whether in the ground or in the sea, or wherever. And those who believe in Christ will live in blessedness forever.

Even if we die before the return of the Lord, our flesh, raised by the power of Christ, shall be reunited with our souls. For those who know the only true God, and Christ as Lord and Saviour, this is a sure hope and eternal comfort.

Do you want to live forever? Put your faith in him!

Creation Moments

Proclaiming Evidence for Truth

THIS WEEK'S CREATION MOMENT

Is a Shark Related to the Pig?



"So God created great sea creatures and every living thing that moves, with which the waters abounded, according to their kind, and every winged bird according to its kind. And God saw that it was good." - Genesis 1:21

If all life evolved from, and is related to, earlier forms of life, then closely related animals should also have similar kinds of chemicals in their bodies. As the science of biochemistry has grown, those who believe in evolution have held high hopes for this idea. For example, insulin from a shark should be more like insulin from other fish than insulin from mammals.

But chemical comparisons between various creatures don't usually show the same relationships as their evolutionary charts. Research at the Medical University of South Carolina compared the hormone relaxin produced by pigs and rats with relaxin produced by sharks. The results showed that the pig's relaxin was more like the shark's relaxin than it was like a rat's. This seems to suggest that pigs are more closely related to sharks than to another mammal, the rat. A similar study comparing insulin showed a closer similarity between the shark and the pig than between the shark and another fish, the carp.

While evolutionists will sometimes point out instances where these comparisons have worked out as they expected, those results are unusual. Normally, these comparisons show that the evolutionary histories and relationships are nothing more than imagination. As the Bible says, each kind of creature gives evidence that it was uniquely created by God.

Missionary of the Week

March has been a full month, bringing both exciting opportunities and unexpected challenges. One of the biggest changes has been moving into a new home with strong potential for future work and growth. While I'm grateful for this space, the transition has also come with added responsibilities, and adjusting to managing and maintaining a home on my own has felt overwhelming at times.

I also traveled to my second city to reconnect with local partners and hear updates on their house groups. During this time, we completed the second half of the Kingdom Business training. It was my first time facilitating this portion, and I was thankful for experienced partners who joined to support with teaching and translation. It was especially encouraging to hear how participants are applying the biblical principles taught to their business plans and seeking to use their work to see God's Kingdom grow in their communities.



I am currently waiting on several important documents to be processed, including my government registration and ID card, both of which have taken longer than expected. There is also a pending form from my landlord needed for completion. (She finally did get this.) Please pray for favor and that these applications will be completed and approved in the coming weeks.

Overall, I'm grateful for this new season and all that God is continuing to build, even as I navigate the challenges along the way.

New House for Launching More Work

Since last year, I've been searching for a home that could also serve as a space for an office, have guest rooms, and a place to host cultural workshops and monthly prayer gatherings. After several months of looking and returning on a longer-term visa, I'm grateful that God provided a house within my budget that has the space needed for these purposes.

The transition has come with some challenges. After moving in, I discovered a plumbing issue causing leaks within the walls, and the house also needed basic installations like fans and AC units. I've been able to install the AC unit from my previous home along with fans in each room, and with the help of local workers and friends connecting me to them, many of the initial issues have been addressed. I will still need to purchase additional AC units for the remaining rooms as the summer heat approaches.



Despite these challenges, I'm very thankful for this space and its potential for hosting and being a place to build a sense of community for both business and other work that I'm excited to invest in.

Completing the KB Training

It was great to return to my second city and complete the second half of the Kingdom Business training with our local partners who traveled from around their state to complete the training. For some of these guys (or couples) they are the only believers in their villages and they are launching study groups to share more with seekers in their communities. For others they have shared and seen responses and are now hosting the only fellowships in their communities.

It's special to host trainings as a way to bring them all together and hear the testimonies of opportunities they have to share as well as to pray with, encourage, and teach them new principles and strategies to share with more people. It's also great when their wives join in the trainings and also get a sense of fellowship to encourage each other. Through this training we were able to teach Biblical principles for running businesses and how to use business as a way to make new connections and share with more people. It was so encouraging to get feedback from the participants about all they learned and how they plan to apply these principles into their work to have more opportunities to witness and share with their communities.

Team Building

We've recently connected with another friend in my second city who is wanting to work with us to facilitate cultural workshops for travelers who visit there. My friend S has already agreed to facilitate workshops for us in my city and so this month we had our first group gathering all together to pray, dream, and talk through what these workshops can and should look like for our guests.

We also traveled as a group to Agra to attend artisan workshops with another company there to get an idea of how groups are running similar concepts in other cities. It was extremely beneficial for us as a team to do these classes together and discuss what our own experiences should look like and how we can use these classes to build bridges between travelers and local families in a meaningful way that also creates space for deeper conversations and connections.

I'm thankful for the ways God is guiding and leading us in our business plans and for the ways that we hope this business will be a blessing to both travelers and locals who we work with.

Praise Points:

- I'm thankful for being able to shift to the new house and all the potential it has for work going forward. I'm especially looking forward to being able to host events and guests and have space to build community and share openly about how God is working throughout our cities.
- I'm thankful that we had a tour booked for Agra last month that went well and that we have another one coming in late April as well as an inquiry for July.
