7 Biblical Ways to Care for Your Wife

In that extremely complex and, at times, hard to understand section of the apostle Paul's letter to the Corinthians, we come across the comparison between the married and the unmarried (1 Cor. 7). In short, the apostle insists that marriage is good (and the norm), but that it brings with it a division of attention. Those who are married have a preoccupation with their spouse. Those who are unmarried are free to more fully "care about the things of the Lord" while "the married man cares about...how to please his wife" and "the married woman cares about...how to please her husband."

This forces Christian husbands to ask the question, "What does it look like to biblically care about the needs of my wife?" This is a question that I feel as though I am just beginning to learn how to answer eleven years into marriage. While there is no silver bullet, there are many things that the Scriptures teach us in order to help guide the process of learning to love your spouse. Here are seven basic biblical ways that the married man can seek to please his wife:

1. Lead her in worship.

Whether this occurs one-on-one or in the context of family worship, a godly husband will seek to "wash his wife with the water of the word" and to lead her "to the throne of grace" that they might together receive grace and mercy to help in time of need. A man who truly loves his wife will want to sing God's praises with his wife and to encourage her with God's word.

This is the most foundational way that a godly husband can love and serve his wife. Everything else in the marriage is secondary to—and will necessary wax and wane commensurate with—this all-important calling. God has given a believing husband his wife so that he might shepherd her soul to glory.

2. Carry her burdens.

One of the apostolic words to husbands regarding the way in which they are to love their wives is that they are to "dwell with them with understanding" (1 Peter 3:7). A loving husband will seek to be gentle toward his wife. A truly loving husband will seek to listen to his wife as she relays her burdens. He will be patient with her when she seems to be folding under the pressures of life. He will seek to understand why she is struggling even when he doesn't have the same burdens.

3. Provide for her.

A man who truly loves his wife will be a man who labors diligently to provide for his wife. The loving husband will be a hard-working husband. This doesn't mean that he will make lots of money; but it does mean that his priority is to "provide for his own" (1 Tim. 5:8). He will work as many jobs as might be necessary in order to provide for his wife. Being a provider is something to which a loving husband must be committed.

4. Serve her in the home.

I don't know if it is possible for someone to hate folding laundry as much as I hate folding laundry. My soul has a holy (and, often, an unholy) hatred of it. When I recognize, however, that my wife is tired from bearing my burdens, taking our kids to school, teaching one of our sons at home, doing the shopping, driving the boys to different events, and caring for many, many, many other things in our home and lives, one of the most loving things that I can do for her is to fold the five laundry baskets full of clothes.

Doing the laundry, cleaning the dishes, repairing things in the home, pressure washing the house, taking her car to get the oil changed, etc., are some of the very tangible ways that a godly husband can learn to love and serve his wife in the home.

5. Praise her in public.

One of the things that has not often been pointed out about Proverbs 31 is that it actually tells us quite a number of things about the godly husband—and does not speak merely about the godly wife. The godly husband is sitting at the gates of the city—as a leader in the community. He is working diligently for his wife and children. But, he is also doing something at the city gates. He is praising his wife for all of her qualities to the other leaders in the city. The Proverb concludes with these words: “*let her own works praise her in the gates*” (Prov. 31:31). A loving husband will sing the praises of his wife in public.

6. Show her affection.

It almost goes without saying that a loving husband will be affectionate with his wife. This certainly includes spending time alone with her. It *may* take the form of regular date nights away from the children. I usually find that it is one of the best things for our marriage when my wife & I are able to pull away from the busyness & cares of life to spend time together to foster our love for one another. Of course, it also means not withholding the sexual intimacy that is her God-given right. It should seem strange for us to find the apostle Paul commanding husbands with the following admonition: “*Let the husband render to his wife the affection due her...*” (1 Cor. 7:3). However, life in this selfish & fallen world necessitates such a command. A godly husband should commit to nurturing intimacy & affection with his wife.

7. Be transparent with her.

I have never met a woman who didn't long to have a husband she could trust. How could anyone in their right mind enjoy living with someone that they couldn't trust? A godly husband will talk often and openly with his wife. He will be transparent with her about finances, activities, and struggles.

Surely, a measure of propriety and wisdom is needed when seeking to approach the issue of personal struggles with lust. As a rule, however, a man who wants to truly love and serve his wife will be a man who is open and honest with her. The words of James 5:16 apply to the marriage relationship no less than to our other relations in the church: “*Confess your trespasses to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed.*”

All of these things must, of course, be pursued in the context of our own relationship with Christ. It is only through union with Jesus—in his death and resurrection—that you will ever be able to begin to love and care for your wife in these ways. When we fail (and we will most certainly fail), we go back to the Lord in brokenness and contrition. We confess our sin to him and ask him for grace to grow in these areas.

We must meditate often on the fact that Jesus has done all of these things for us as the Heavenly Bridegroom of our souls. He leads us in worship on a daily and weekly basis; he carries our burdens and sorrows; he constantly provides for our spiritual and material needs; he serves us in his church; he speaks well of us, even though we are sinful and often wander; he is intimate with us in communion; and he is open with us about all of his and his Father's works.

Brothers, we must learn to live out of our union with Christ and to listen to all that his word teaches us about our responsibilities as husbands if we are to ever truly care for the needs of our wives. ♦



The First Two Minutes Matter Most

It's obvious, I know. It's been said a million times by a million different people. But, in my defense, it's been forgotten by a million more. I've said it and neglected it too many times to count: *The first two minutes matter most.*

Today Christians are gathering all across the world for our worship services. We will read the Bible, sing the Bible, pray the Bible, preach the Bible, and learn better how to live out the Bible. Then the service will end and the first two minutes will matter most.

But first you can make a difference in someone's day and maybe even in someone's life if only you'll make the most of the moments following that final "amen." Masters of Mimicry



"Hast thou not known? hast thou not heard, that the everlasting God, the Lord, the Creator of the ends of the earth, fainteth not, neither is weary? there is no searching of his understanding." - Isaiah 40:28

Though they are only insects, stick insects seem to have an amazing knowledge of their surroundings. They are geniuses at using their

predators' weaknesses for their own protection.

Stick insects are leaf eaters. Many of them look like little twigs. The longest insect in the world is a walking stick from Borneo that reaches a length of 13 inches. A tropical stick is as thick as a finger and the same color as the bamboo on which it is often found. It also has swollen ridges that make it look even more like bamboo. Other types have leafy flaps that match the leaves of the plants they frequent. Some stick insects go even further. They lay eggs that look exactly like the seeds of the plant they feed on. A stick found in New Mexico glues its eggs to grass stems. The position and shape of the long-pointed eggs exactly mimic the seeds of that species of grass.

Some sticks have brightly colored wings that they can rapidly unfurl to startle away birds investigating them for lunch. Sticks will often sway with the breeze to make their illusion more effective. Some sticks sit motionless for hours and will often refuse to move even when being carried away by a bird. This tactic has fooled many birds into thinking it really was a twig and releasing it. Stick insects are clearly not the result of mindless chance. Their intelligence was created by the Creator of all things.

Missionary of the Week

Pascal & Becky Grenade Global Faith Mission - Mauritius

Dear friends,

It has been quite a long time since I looked through the names of all the people that receive our newsletter. As I looked through your names this evening, I was blessed remembering how we met and the time we spent with you. Some we went to college with, some we met in graduate school, some were childhood friends, some of you we met at supporting churches, some were friends from churches we were members at, some are family members. A few people have passed away and were still on the list. Each of you has had a part to play in our lives somehow, and I felt much gratitude as I looked over your names. I thank the Lord for the part each of you have played in our life's story.

I want to share a few stories with you this month of people we know. A few days ago, some of our neighbors whom we had gotten to know and love moved to Canada. This is actually fairly common here in Mauritius. The husband had moved there four years ago, and the wife and children stayed here until their papers were ready and they were able to join him. You may remember us mentioning Myles. This is his family. Myles is now six years old. He went with us many times to wow club, and we would send the memory verse to his mom and grandmother for him to learn. We also took Myles to school every day as he went to the same primary school our children went to. I think of the time we had with their family, and thank the Lord for the window that he gave us to be a witness to them and a blessing. We had invited them many times to church, but they never did come. Would you pray that God would send someone else to continue the work of witnessing to this family in Canada?

As I was out running and walking in our neighborhood last week, I met the father of one of our neighbors. He was doing some work at his son's house, and we had a good conversation where I was able to share the gospel with him. He is very entrenched in his Hindu faith, but he listened. Tradition is very important to him. However, tradition does not save a person. A few days later, we had some Rocksand left over after a project we had been doing at our house. I had told Pascal about how they had an ongoing building project. Pascal went to see if he would be interested in having our leftover Rocksand. He offered to pay us for it, but we told him we would be happy to give it to him. Pascal and Liam (who is now 13) moved about two tons (20 wheelbarrows full) of Rocksand to his house (he is just a few houses down the road). He again wanted to offer to pay us, but we told him we were happy to give it to him. The next day he came over and gave Liam some money. What a blessing to see his kindness to our son (who had been willing to work for free). Please pray that we can continue to be a good witness to him, and that the Lord would soften his heart toward the good news that only Jesus can save.

The third story involves a boy named Timeo. Timeo goes to the same primary school our children go to. His mom works as one of the caretakers at the school. His mom is also a neighbor of Pascal's parents. She had come to a few house meetings in the past, but she has started coming more regularly to church in the last several weeks along with her companion. Her son Timeo has just started coming to wow club recently. Adrien (our second son) came home a few days ago and told us that Timeo already knows his verse for this week. Sure enough, in wow club today, Timeo got up and recited his verse perfectly in front of all the other children. What a blessing to see him learning God's word. Please pray for Timeo, his mom Sheila, and Elvis.

These are just a few stories that we can share with you of how God is working here in Mauritius. We are thankful that God can use each of us no matter where we are to reach people in our family, in our neighborhood, in our work place, our sports club, or even as we shop. We pray that each of you, as well as us, will redeem the time the Lord has given to us. Jesus said in John ch. 9 v 4 "I must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work." May we follow after Jesus and work for him while it is still "day."

As I finish this letter, I would like to share with you a need that we have. Pascal and I have been blessed in that we have always seen the Lord provide for us financially, and we trust that He will continue to provide for all of our needs. We would like to share though that our financial support has decreased over the last few

years due to a few supporters passing away, and a few churches and individuals not being able to continue their support. We are thankful for the time the Lord allowed us to have that support, and we understand that things have gotten increasingly difficult for families and churches. Life for a family of seven has gone up a lot as well in Mauritius. We would appreciate your prayers for us that we would be faithful to the Lord and that we would be careful in how we manage the resources God has given to us. Some of you have increased your support, and we are very grateful. If you are in a position where you could consider joining our support team and you would like more information, we would appreciate you reaching out to us. I will conclude with a short list of blessings I have been compiling in my head for this week: bread that the kids bring home from school every day, Pascal's mom giving us some pasta for supper she made for us, another lady in the church giving us some cake she made last week, hearing Olivia pray at ladies' meeting today sincerely asking the Lord to help her to be faithful (she has been coming to church and every ladies' meeting since the beginning of the year), spending the evening with Pascaline last night (we had her over for supper), having a cup of tea with Pascal in the evenings, hearing the kids say sorry, seeing the boys working in the yard with Pascal, the kids being able to take swimming lessons again after the pool being closed for over a year, Pascal's finger healing after getting hurt earlier this week, seeing Adrien help lead a song in wow club today, and Liam and Ashlen helping by playing the guitar, getting to talk to my brother on the phone today, and the list goes on... I hope you also have a grateful list. What a blessing to be able to thank the Lord for the big and the little things.

May the Lord bless you, and may we continue to work together to see the kingdom of God advance where He has placed each of us.
