The Wedding Feast Matthew #142 Matthew 22:1-14

The main point of the Parable of the Wedding Feast is that those invited, like the Pharisees, will not participate in the marriage feast, while others will.

The context of this parable is the ministry of John the Baptizer.
Matthew 21:24-26 and Matthew 21:43-46

Consequently, *the king was angry; and he sent his armies and destroyed those murderers, and burned their city* (Matthew 22:7) their rejection of the kingdom offer resulted in the destruction of the murderers (the leadership of Israel) and their city (Jerusalem) because they that were invited (the generation to whom Jesus came) were not worthy (Matthew 22:8).

In the parable, the wedding garment symbolizes righteousness through salvation. From the beginning, God provided a covering for our sin.

Anyone who wants to approach God and participate in the wedding feast must rely on God's provision of righteousness and not on his own.

The Comfort of Surrender

I sat alone in the hospital, sad and discouraged. After a shocking family loss, I was devastated and struggling. I didn't know when I'd get discharged or what the future would hold.

Spending time in that hospital made me rethink my priorities. Being out of control was uncomfortable and scary. I had no calendar or cellphone to keep me on track for the week.

Yet during that time, the Lord taught me an important lesson.

The Illusion of Control

I struggled with control because I wanted to manage every detail. If something was unplanned, I worried. Yet Jesus commands us to “*not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble*” (Matt 6:34).

This was hard to put into practice. At the hospital I couldn't keep my mind busy. One morning I walked through the halls, peering through various rooms. I noticed a small library and picked out a blue NASB Bible. Although everything around me was uncertain, I knew God's Word would provide comfort.

Demonstrating Self-Control

When I think about what it means to be in control, I'm reminded of Joseph's story. Despite being sold into slavery and imprisoned, Joseph surrendered control to God. In Genesis 43, we read that Joseph was overwhelmed by emotion after seeing his brother Benjamin after many years. Instead of lashing out in anger, however, he controlled himself (vv. 31–32).

Later, in Genesis 45:1, Joseph struggled to control himself when he saw all his brothers, who had mistreated him. Although Joseph did express his emotions, he also treated his brothers with kindness. This was a tense moment with others standing by, so he asked everyone to leave and wept so loudly that the Egyptians and the household of Pharaoh heard his cries.

As a powerful ruler, Joseph could have handled the situation with his brothers differently. Often, when there is something wrong, we want to get angry and lash out at others. Joseph did the opposite. He told them not to be grieved or angry, then pointed to the sovereignty and plan of God, which preserved his life (Gen 45:5). When unfavorable circumstances arise in our lives, we can give our emotions to God and treat others, even unkind people, with self-control. Joseph later led Egypt safely through the seven-year famine, ultimately saving both his family and the nation. No matter how challenging our circumstances may seem, God is in control.

Joseph's actions were in sharp contrast to those of others around him. His brothers lacked self-control and threw Joseph into a pit to satisfy their own desires. Potiphar's wife couldn't control her sexual urges and made inappropriate advances toward Joseph. We can learn from this example and trust God with the unfortunate events in our lives. Even bad situations can be redeemed to encourage others.

Looking Outwards

During my stay, I was so consumed by my worries that I didn't notice the needs of others. But towards the end of my visit, I looked around and saw many hurting people. One morning, I noticed an older woman sitting alone in a chair and slowly approached her.

"Hi, what's your name?"

She looked up with sunken eyes.

"Christine."

She nodded her head and went on to describe her situation. She frantically asked me for help with the phone and contacting her family. When she got really distressed, I sat down next to her, looked her in the eyes, and assured her everything would be okay. When she asked me to pray for her, I put my hand on her shoulder and slowly prayed for her health.

We can't always control our circumstances, but we can control our response. We can cry out to the Lord and point others to Jesus, knowing we don't have to worry about tomorrow because he is in control.

Don't Boast in Tomorrow

Now that I'm home, I'm still learning the lesson of control. On this side of heaven, we don't know what each day holds. I'm slowly learning to trust God with each day, hour, and moment.

As I reflect on this visit, I can say God used it for good. Although it was a hard stay, I see how God continues to use difficult circumstances to bring us closer to him and encourage us to surrender control. We never know what another day may hold, and it's unwise to boast about tomorrow.

"Come now, you who say, 'Today or tomorrow we will go into such and such a town and spend a year there and trade and make a profit'— yet you do not know what tomorrow will bring. What is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes. Instead you ought to say, 'If the Lord wills, we will live and do this or that'" (James 4:13-15).

Our lives are so short. Ultimately, each life is a mist that comes and goes. Instead of trusting in our own strength, we can trust God and his perfect will. So often I rely on myself and don't ask for the Lord's blessing and strength.

When I walked through those hospital halls, I was keenly aware of my needs. I needed food, medication, and counsel to stay stable. Yet God asks us to trust him in every area of our lives and not lean on our own understanding (Prov 3:5-6). Will you surrender control to the Lord?

Consider

What might it look like for you to surrender control? I appreciate Samantha Decker's words from her book *Unhurried*:

"When we hand over the little control we think we have to an almighty God, we gain the freedom and the peace he intends for us" (148).

We can trust God to handle our problems. Like a patient trusts a doctor, we can trust God to provide spiritual comfort for our hearts.

As Jesus began his earthly ministry, he repeatedly demonstrated he was in control, and we can still trust his sovereignty today. We can trust him when we hear the birds chirping in the distance or the flowers dancing in the wind (Matt 6:26-28).

There is comfort in knowing that Jesus did not simply offer his Word, but he came down in the flesh and experienced hardship and pain, too. He faced waves of emotions yet was always in control.

What does this look like for us? Surrender is a heart posture that recognizes God's sovereign hand in everything—whether we're like Joseph, standing in a courtroom overwhelmed by emotion, or lying in a hospital bed alone and afraid. For me, surrender comes from recognizing I'm not all-powerful, knowing, or sovereign, and this compels me to offer everything I have—my schedule, plans, and expectations—with open hands.

We can trust God to write our story, as we live each day in submission to his perfect will. When we're worried, may we look out and remember the birds and the flowers, tangible reminders that though we don't have control over tomorrow, God does. ❖

Seals Show Super-Human Recognition Skills



"He calleth his own sheep by name, and leadeth them out. And when he putteth forth his own sheep, he goeth before them, and the sheep follow him: for they know his voice. And a stranger will they not follow, but will flee from him: for they know not the voice of strangers."

- John 10:3b-5

Let's say that you last saw your child when she was four months

old. It is now four years later. Are you certain you could pick out your child in a room full of a hundred four-year-old little girls?

A researcher with the National Zoological Park in Washington, D.C. studied the northern fur seal's amazing ability to recognize family members. Nursing mothers are the only mothers among mammals that leave their nursing pups for as long as two weeks. They return after they have fed, having no problem finding their own young among the colony. When the young reach the age of four months, they migrate south for the winter. Next spring, the young seals migrate back to their place of birth and easily recognize their mothers.

After recording the voices of more than two dozen seals, the researcher wanted to prove that recognition was taking place through the sound of an individual seal's voice. Seals who heard the playback of their mother's or child's voice paid attention to the speakers, while others did not. Even after four years, mother and child recognized each other's voices. Such memory and intelligence can only have intelligence as its source. That source is a loving Creator Who knows us even after our parents are gone.

Many blessings to you and your families this summer! July was not only the 250th anniversary of the United States, it was also the halfway point of the year and the beginning of our financial year. So with this newsletter we want to take a pause to evaluate and praise God for His goodness in this year so far.

Here is a quick report of our six ministries:

Community Bible Church of Kubamitwe - Our 2025 Grand Opening has caused an influx of people and a renewed excitement. Our local church has become preeminent within SOS. We have not achieved our desired maturity as a local church, but the growth of our members is evident and the passion for our local church is felt. We have many being saved. And we are seeing many people becoming ministers. But we still have a long way to go.

Legacy Christian Academy - Legacy is so fun and so exciting. Everyone can't wait until 2027. This will be the year of Legacy's first ever graduation. Legacy will have reached its full completion from K1-S6. It will be a benchmark year and will end with a climactic graduation event. Stay tuned...

SOS Medical Center - SOS's medical center is a massive blessing. For the communities around, this ministry serves as a nucleus to draw people toward our ministry. Caring for 100 patients a day, the center is bustling with activity. And patients are feeling loved by the staff and grateful for the high quality treatment. Our patients are walking away happy and satisfied. Right now it is stationed next to our local church, but our plan is to relocate to its own location in 2027.

Joni and Friends - This ministry is outstanding! Joni and Friends is giving practical love to many hurting people. The staff are very committed, very faithful, and very professional. This ministry is completely funded by Joni and Friends USA and is transforming thousands of lives in very personal ways.

Church Strengthening - This ministry is slow right now, but it is being restructured to make an even greater impact. Right now we are primarily carrying out conferences for the Baptist Union and working closely with the Baptist leadership to strategize the impact of its churches. In May we hosted 700 young people, and the national youth conference was very well received. We have a women's conference in a few weeks and a pastors' conference in November.

Shepherds Training College - This ministry is at its height. With our first degree students set to graduate, we now have an honest evaluation of what the program is going to produce. We can't be more pleased. God has blessed STC.

Prayer requests for the SOS ministry:

- Pray that God will develop a really strong group of godly leaders from within our church as we call everyone the greater devotion to Jesus Christ this year. *Update: Keep praying. God is working but it is slow.*
- Pray that God will provide the needed funds to help us finish some critical building projects and to help us launch a radical church planting movement. *Update: God has provided since the beginning of the year. Pray we will finish strong! There are some big projects ahead.*
- Pray that God silences people who slander SOS. *Update: It has been a quiet year. To God be the glory!*

- Pray that our local church really steps up its game now that it is in its new building. *Update: God has answered this prayer, but we still have a long way to go! Keep praying.*
- Pray that God will provide Legacy Christian Academy with strong, godly administrators to help Michael lead the kindergarten, primary, and secondary schools. *Update: We are still in need of such people. Keep praying.*
- Pray that God will bless STC by continuing to provide talented and deeply educated stateside professors to fill the teaching until we are able to build up African staff. *Update: God has provided an administrator and a strong relationship with professors in Rwanda who are interested in joining us. Keep praying.*
- Pray that God will allow SOS's impact and reputation to continue to grow in influence and credibility for the sake of extending God's name. *Update: Keep praying. God is answering.*
- Pray that God will bless SOS's church planting efforts around its local community. *Update: We have chosen 10 graduating pastors to be planted. Now we need the resources and a leader to help us.*
- Pray that God will bring salvation in massive waves as CBCK (SOS's local church) continues to reach out to its community. *Update: Keep praying. 36 people are being baptized in August.*
- Pray that God will intervene within Uganda's political system to enable there to be a peaceful transfer of power between Museveni (current president) and the next president. *Update: This will be a 5-year prayer. Praise God there is peace right now!*

Prayer requests for the Hurley family:

- Pray that God will help us love the Lord with all our hearts, souls, and minds.
- Pray that God will save our extended family as some of them have hard hearts. *Update: We are seeing God really change hearts. We are very encouraged. Please keep praying.*
- Pray that God will provide wisdom to Danielle and I regarding how to firmly love and lead the many young people the Lord has entrusted into our home. *Update: It is amazing how the Lord grants grace and wisdom regarding how to spend my time. I am balancing a lot. Keep praying.*
- Pray that God will help us to walk in wisdom, respond to everyone with graciousness, compassion, and love while still upholding biblical standards. *Update: This is by far the biggest area of growth over the last 10 years. Praise God!*
- Pray that our home will radiate the love of Jesus Christ and weightiness of God's abiding presence.
