We say we believe God's Word "but do our worry, our reactions, and our words actually agree with what He has said? Five days to move from agreeing with God's Word to actually standing on it.

Hebrews 10:23 • Hold Fast Without Wavering

DEVOTIONAL

FIVE DAYS IN THE WORD

Read one day at a time. Sit with the Scripture before you read the reflection, and let the prayer be your own before you move on to the next day.

DAY

IS GOD'S WORD ENOUGH?

HEBREWS 10:23

"Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; for He is faithful that promised."

Is God's Word enough? It isn't a difficult question, and it isn't a trick question – it's simply a question. If you asked every believer in the sanctuary and online to answer out loud, you would likely hear an overwhelming, resounding "Yes! Absolutely! Without a doubt!" We believe God's Word. We preach it, teach it, quote it, and tell others to stand on it. And rightly so, because God's Word is the foundation of our faith.

But here is a harder question: if God's Word is enough, why do we continue to worry after God has already spoken? Why do we continue to fear after He has said, "Fear not"? Why do we lose sleep after He has promised, "I will never leave you nor forsake you"? Why do we doubt after He has already made us a promise? And why do our conversations sometimes contradict the very promises we claim to believe?

The real issue has never been whether God's Word is enough. The real question is whether His Word, once spoken, is enough for us. Notice something about our key verse: the writer of Hebrews doesn't tell us to hold fast because we are faithful. He tells us to hold fast because God is faithful. Our confidence was never meant to rest in our ability to hold on – it rests in the One we are holding on to. When we settle that in our hearts, it changes everything.

ASK YOURSELF

- Where have I said I believe God's Word, but my worry, fear, or words told a different story?
- What promise of God do I need to simply rest in today, rather than trying to hold on to with my own strength?

PRAYER

Lord, forgive me for the times my words and my worry have contradicted what I claim to believe. Today I choose to hold fast – not because I am strong enough, but because You are faithful. Settle my heart in the truth of who You are. In Jesus' name, Amen.

I hold fast, not because I am faithful – but because He is.

DAY

TRUTH ONE: WHEN GOD SPEAKS, HIS WORD SETTLES THE MATTER

NUMBERS 23:19 & ISAIAH 55:11

"God is not a man, that he should lie... hath he said, and shall he not do it? Or hath he spoken, and shall he not make it good?" "So shall my word be that goeth forth out of my mouth; it shall not return unto me void, but shall accomplish that which I please."

One of the greatest reasons God's Word is enough is because God's character is trustworthy. People change their minds. Circumstances change. Promises made by people are sometimes broken. But God is not like man. When He speaks, He does not lie, forget, or fail to fulfill what He has promised. His Word carries the full weight of His character.

Isaiah reminds us that God's Word never returns empty "it always accomplishes the purpose for which He sends it. That means our confidence is not in our ability to make God's Word happen. It is in God's faithfulness to perform what He has already spoken. We may not know when or how He will do it, but we can trust that He will remain faithful to His Word, because He cannot deny Himself.

Maybe today you're facing a difficult diagnosis, a layoff, or financial pressure. Those facts may be real, but they are not greater than God's promises. Faith does not deny the situation; faith simply refuses to let it have the final word over what God has already said. God's promises are not strengthened by our faith "they are secured by His faithfulness.

ASK YOURSELF

- What situation in my life do I need to stop trying to argue with, and instead let God's Word settle?
- Am I placing my confidence in my ability to make something happen, or in God's faithfulness to keep His Word?

PRAYER

Father, thank You that You are not like man "You do not lie, and You do not change Your mind. Where I have been striving to make things happen in my own strength, teach me instead to rest in Your faithfulness. Let Your Word settle every matter in my life today. In Jesus' name, Amen.

When God speaks, the matter is settled "because He is faithful to His Word.

TRUTH TWO: FAITH HOLDS ON EVEN WHEN CIRCUMSTANCES SAY OTHERWISE

ROMANS 3:4 & PROVERBS 3:5-6

"...let God be true, but every man a liar." "Trust in the Lord with all thine heart, and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct thy paths."

There will be moments when everything around us appears to contradict what God has promised. Our circumstances may speak one message while God's Word speaks another. In those moments, faith chooses to trust God's report above every other report. Trusting God does not require us to understand everything He is doing – sometimes the greatest act of faith is simply refusing to let what we see outweigh what God has said.

Life has a way of throwing unexpected situations our way. The car breaks down without warning. The doctor's report isn't what we expected. The circumstance is real. The pressure is real. The questions are real. But here is where faith steps in: faith doesn't ignore the problem – it simply refuses to let the problem have the final word.

Instead of saying, "I don't know what I'm going to do," faith asks one question: "What did God say about this?" Facts describe the situation. Truth declares what God has already said about the situation. Facts may change from day to day, but God's truth never changes. Our circumstances may have a voice – but God's Word has the final say.

ASK YOURSELF

- What "fact" am I facing right now that needs to be met with God's truth instead?
- Am I leaning on my own understanding, or trusting God with all my heart, even when I don't understand?

PRAYER

Lord, when my circumstances speak loudly against Your promises, help me hold on to what You have said above everything I see. Teach me to trust You with all my heart, and not lean on my own understanding. Let Your Word have the final say in my life. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Facts describe my situation. God's truth declares my future.

TRUTH THREE: OUR WORDS SHOULD AGREE WITH GOD'S WORD

JAMES 3:9-10 & PROVERBS 18:21

"With the tongue we praise our Lord and Father, and with it we curse human beings... My brothers and sisters, this should not be." "Death and life are in the power of the tongue."

Eventually, whatever fills our hearts will be revealed by our words. Many believers know God's promises, yet in difficult moments — when our backs are against the wall — our confession begins to reflect fear more than faith. James reminds us that blessing and cursing should not come from the same mouth.

Remember the twelve spies in Numbers 13-14. All twelve saw the same land, the same giants, and the same obstacles. The difference was not what they saw — it was how they responded to what God had already said. Ten spoke according to fear. Two spoke according to God's promise. The facts were identical; their faith was different, and their words revealed where their trust truly rested.

This isn't about pretending problems don't exist. Instead of saying, "There's no way I'll ever get through this," the believer acknowledges the challenge while declaring, "This is difficult, but God has promised never to leave me nor forsake me." God is not asking us to deny reality — He is asking us to trust His reality above ours.

ASK YOURSELF

- Have my words lately sounded more like the ten spies, or the two? What has that revealed about where my trust rests?
- What situation do I need to start speaking God's promise over, instead of speaking my fear?

PRAYER

Father, let my words come into agreement with Your Word. Forgive me for the times fear has spoken louder than faith. Today I choose to speak what You have said over my life, my family, and my circumstances. In Jesus' name, Amen.

My mouth will agree with what God has already said.

HEBREWS 10:23

"Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; for He is faithful that promised."

There is a difference between knowing about God and truly knowing Him. Knowing about God is intellectual â€” facts, study, information. Knowing God is relational â€” a connection, a trust, built through walking with Him day after day. The longer we walk with Him, the more we discover His faithfulness, His goodness, His consistency. And the God we once knew about becomes the God we now know personally.

We don't build lasting confidence in God's promises by only watching someone else walk with Him. We build confidence by walking with God ourselves â€” long enough to gather our own testimonies of His faithfulness. That's why the writer of Hebrews could confidently say, "Let us hold fast... for He is faithful that promised." That confidence wasn't theory. It was personal experience with a faithful God.

The greatest battle of faith is often not around us â€” it is within us. Every day we face a choice: will we agree with what we see, or will we agree with what God has already said? What we choose to believe will eventually shape what we declare, and what we declare will influence how we live. Today's message was never really about whether God's Word is enough â€” we already know it is. The real question is whether His Word has become the final authority in our lives.

So as we close this devotional, here is the question to carry with you, not as a sermon point, but as a personal conviction.

ASK YOURSELF

- Am I only knowing about God, or am I walking with Him closely enough to know Him personally?
- When God has spoken... is that enough for me?

PRAYER

Lord, I don't want to just know about You â€” I want to know You. Draw me into a deeper, daily relationship with You so that my confidence rests not in what I've heard, but in what I have experienced of Your faithfulness. When You have spoken, let that be enough for me. In Jesus' name, Amen.

When God has spoken â€” that is enough for me.
