5 Simple Ways to Make This Week's Lesson Stick



IN THE CAR:

On the drive home, ask your child what he learned about this week:

How does Jesus treat sinners? With compassion, mercy, and forgiveness. Jesus spent time with the tax collectors, even though the Pharisees looked down their noses at them. Matthew 9:10-13, Jesus Eats With Sinners



HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Ask your kid how they can include those who are different from them this week. Ask your kid what ways they can show compassion to those in need this week?



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

What lesson did Jesus teach the Pharisees?

How does this lesson apply to your own life?

Who is an "outsider" that you can let into your inner circle?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"I was hungry. And you gave me something to eat. I was thirsty. And you gave me something to drink. I was a stranger. And you invited me in. I needed clothes. And you gave them to me. I was sick. And you took care of me. I was in prison. And you came to visit me." Matthew 25:35-36 (NIRV)



PARENT TIME:

What you need to know:

It is human nature to spend time with people who look like us, act like us, and like the same things as we do. Help your child see the benefits of letting others into their circle of friends by talking about how differences make us unique and can be helpful to one another. Spend some time learning about other cultures, traditions, and celebrating the differences. Explain how Jesus is for everyone all over the world!
