

Discipleship Training Course

Project Topics

Students are to write a minimum of **1,000-word** dissertation on one of the following topics:

Topic 1

The Contribution of Discipleship Graduates to Ministry Effectiveness and Church Life

Focus:

- How individuals who have completed discipleship actively strengthen church ministries.

Key Questions:

- In what ways do discipleship graduates contribute to serving, leadership, and mission?
- What areas of church life are most impacted by their involvement?

Contribution Areas Examined:

- Ministry teams
- Volunteer capacity
- Leadership support
- Outreach participation

Why is it needed:

- Evaluates outcomes and organisational impact, not programme delivery.

Topic 2

From Formation to Function: The Role of Discipleship Graduates in Building a Healthy Church Community

Focus:

- How discipleship completion translates into relational, pastoral, and community contribution.

Key Questions:

- How do discipleship graduates enhance unity, care, and belonging within the church?
- What relational competencies are evident after formation?

Contribution Areas Examined:

- Small groups
- Pastoral care
- Mentoring newer believers
- Conflict resolution and relational health

Why is this needed?

- Connects spiritual formation with social and communal outcomes.

Topic 3

Discipleship and Missional Engagement: Assessing the Impact of Formed Believers on Outreach and Community Transformation

Focus:

- How discipleship contributes beyond the walls of the church.

Key Questions:

- Does discipleship increase participation in evangelism, outreach, and social action?
- How do graduates represent the church in the wider community?

Contribution Areas Examined:

- Evangelism
- Community service
- Social initiatives
- Faith representation in everyday life

Why is it needed?

- Measures missional output and societal engagement.
