#### **Reflections on Sunday's Sermon**

#### <u>The New City Catechism—Lord's Day 42</u>

How is the Word of God to be Read and Heard? With diligence, preparation, and prayer; so that we may accept it with faith, store it in our hearts, and practice it in our lives. (2 Timothy 3:16-17)

### **Scripture**

#### Hebrews 2:10-13 (ESV)

<sup>10</sup> For it was fitting that he, for whom and by whom all things exist, in bringing many sons to glory, should make the founder of their salvation perfect through suffering. <sup>11</sup> For he who sanctifies and those who are sanctified all have one source. That is why he is not ashamed to call them brothers, <sup>12</sup> saying, "I will tell of your name to my brothers; in the midst of the congregation I will sing your praise." <sup>13</sup> And again, "I will put my trust in him." And again, "Behold, I and the children God has given me."

6. Prayer: To close, how might the passage shape your prayers?
