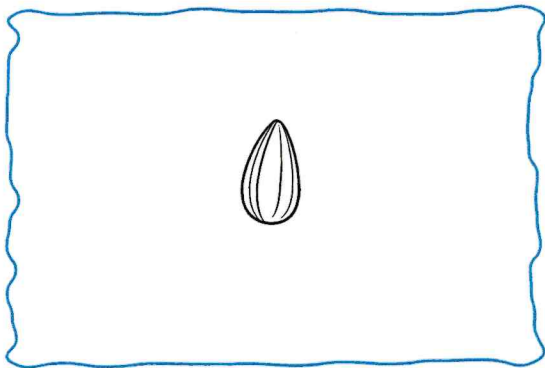
DAY 1**Do What It Says**

Read James 1:22 NIrV

God wants us to hear His Word, and He also wants us to live it. When you listen at church or read your Bible at home, a seed is being planted in your heart. But seeds grow best when action is added. If you hear, "Be kind," and then choose to include someone at recess, you are doing what God says. You are watering that seed. If you hear, "Forgive," and you let go of a grudge, you are helping grow God's kingdom. Listening is the first step. Obeying is the next step. When you do both, your heart becomes a place where good things grow.

Activity:

Around the seed, write one thing God wants you to do this week. Then draw roots and a plant growing to show what can happen when you obey.

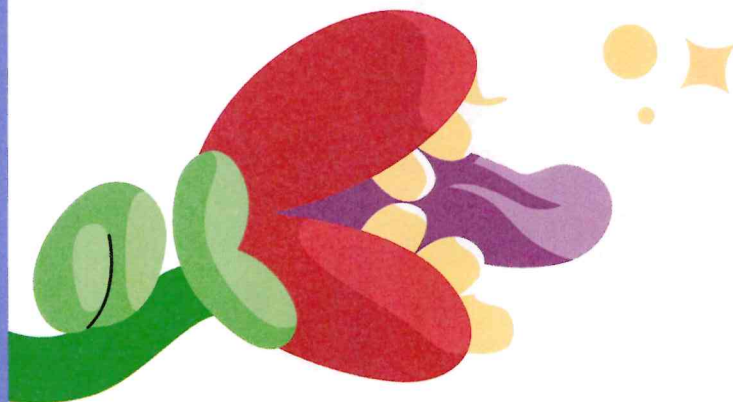
**DAY 2****Happy Listeners**

Luke 11:28 NIrV

Jesus said something amazing. He said people are blessed when they hear God's Word and obey it. Blessed means deeply happy in God. Sometimes obedience feels small. Cleaning your room. Telling the truth. Sharing your snack. But every small act of obedience matters. Each time you choose to do what God says, His kingdom grows in you. You may not see it right away. But God is working in your heart. He is growing something strong and beautiful.

At-Home Activity:

At dinner, ask each person to share one thing God teaches in the Bible, then talk about one way you can obey it tomorrow. Pray together and ask God to help you follow through.



DAY 3

Keep Growing

Galatians 6:9 NIrV

Sometimes it's hard to keep doing the right thing. Maybe you are kind, but someone is still mean. Maybe you tell the truth and get in trouble anyway. God says, "Don't give up." When you keep choosing what's right even when it's hard, you are like good soil. The seed keeps growing under the surface. You may not see fruit right away. But God promises that good things will grow in time. Your patience grows. Your faith grows. Your courage grows.

Reflection:

Is there something good you feel like quitting? Talk to God about it. Ask Him to help you keep doing what's right this week.

DAY 4

Light for the Path

Psalms 119:105 NIrV

God's Word helps us know what to do. It's like a flashlight in the dark. When you're unsure how to act, the Bible shows you the way. If you wonder how to treat a friend, God's Word says to love others. If you wonder what to say, God's Word says to tell the truth. When you follow His light, you make wise choices. Each time you hear and follow God's Word, His light shines through you. Others can see it. They notice your kindness. They see your honesty. God's kingdom grows as you walk in His light.

Prayer:

"Dear God, thank You for giving me Your Word. Please guide my steps each day. Help me not just to hear You, but to obey You. Shine Your light through me so others can see Your love. In Jesus' name. Amen."

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DAY 1

Use Your Gifts

Read 1 Peter 4:10b NIrV

God has given something special to you. Maybe you're good at drawing. Maybe you're brave when others feel nervous. Maybe you're great at cheering people up. Those gifts are not accidents. God chose them for you. When you use your gifts to help others, God's kingdom grows. If you are strong and help carry in the groceries, you're using your gift. If you are good at baking and you make cookies for the neighbor, you're using your gift. Sometimes it feels easier to hide what we can do. But God didn't give you gifts to bury. He gave them to share. Every time you serve someone, you show what God is like.

Activity:

Inside each box, write or draw a gift God has given you. Then, think about one way you can use it this week to grow God's kingdom.



DAY 2

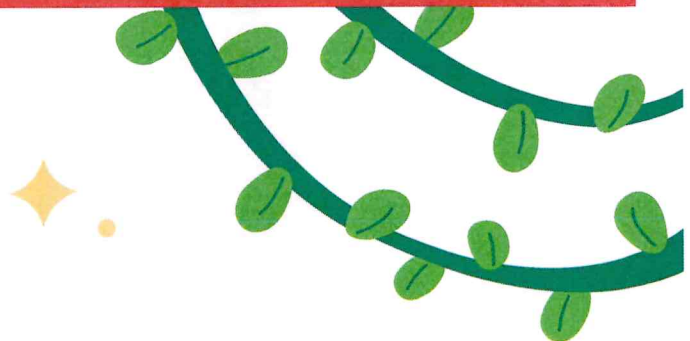
Shine Bright

Read Matthew 5:16 NIrV

Jesus says you are like a light. Lights are meant to shine. They aren't meant to hide under a bed or inside a closet. God has given you talents, time, and love. When you use them, people see something different in you. They see kindness. They see honesty. They see courage. And those good things point back to God. You don't have to be the best at everything. You only have to use what you have. When you share your snack, help a friend study, or stand up for someone, your light shines.

At-Home Activity:

Assemble your family, grab a flashlight, and turn off the lights. Pass the flashlight around, and whoever is holding the flashlight says one way they can use what God has given them to shine His light. Pray together and ask God to help you use what He has given you.



DAY 3

Small Things Matter

Read Luke 16:10a NIrV

Sometimes you may think, "I'm just a kid. What can I really do?" But God sees every small choice. When you finish your homework carefully, that matters. When you return something you borrowed, that matters. When you practice your instrument instead of quitting, that matters. God watches how you handle little things. When you are faithful in small ways, He knows you can handle bigger things. Using what God has given you starts today. It starts with what is already in your hands. You don't need a huge stage or a lot of money. You need a willing heart. God can grow big kingdom results from small acts of faithfulness.

Reflection:

What is one small responsibility you have right now? How can you handle it in a way that honors God this week?

DAY 4

Work for the Lord

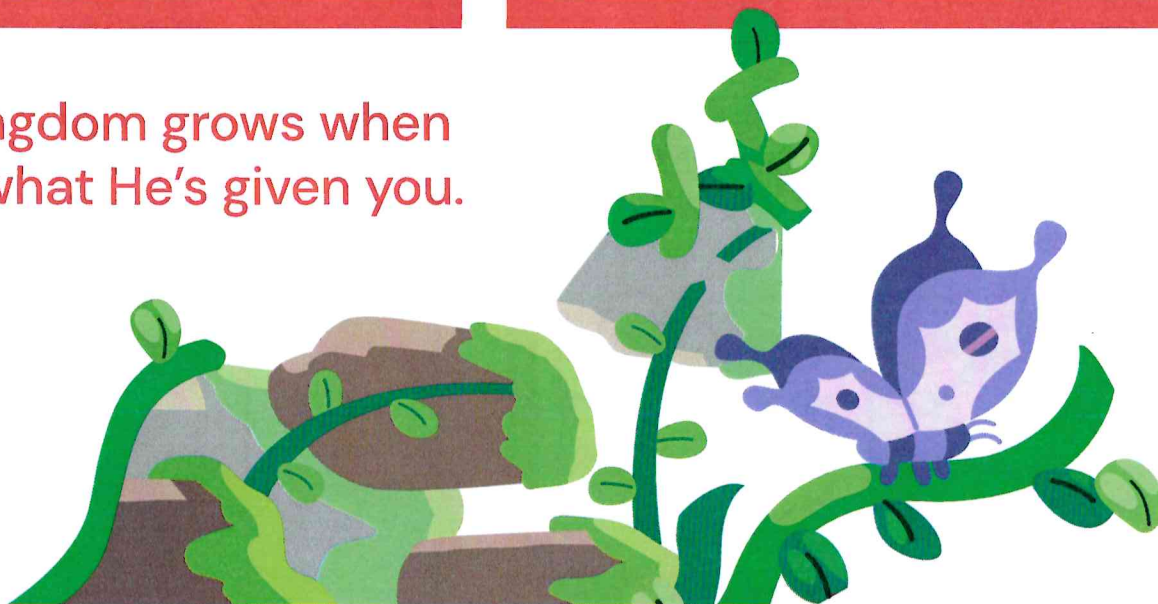
Read Colossians 3:23 NIrV

Whatever you do, you can do it for God. Homework. Chores. Practice. Helping a friend. When you remember you are working for Him, your attitude changes. God has given you time, energy, and ability. When you use them with your whole heart, you honor God. Even simple jobs become important when you do them for the Lord. You might not see a big reward right away. But God sees your effort. He sees when you try your best. Every faithful choice helps grow His kingdom inside you.

Prayer:

"Dear God, thank You for everything You have given me. Help me use my gifts, time, and talents for You. Teach me to work with my whole heart. Show me how to serve others this week. In Jesus' name. Amen."

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DAY 1

Forgive Like Jesus

Read Ephesians 4:32 NIV

Forgiveness can feel hard. When someone lies, cheats, or says mean words, your feelings get hurt. You may want to stay mad. You may want them to feel bad too. But God asks us to forgive. Why? Because He forgave us first. Every time we disobey, God could stay angry. Instead, He chooses love. Because of Jesus, our sins are forgiven. When you forgive, you're acting like Jesus. You're choosing kindness instead of payback. You're trusting God to handle what is unfair. Forgiveness doesn't mean what happened was okay. It means you're letting go of the anger and giving the problem to God. That choice helps your heart stay soft.

Activity:

1. On a piece of paper, write down something you need to forgive.
2. Pray and ask God to help you let it go.
3. Crumple it up and throw it in the trash can.

DAY 2

Let It Go

Read Colossians 3:13 NIV

Everyone makes mistakes. Friends forget promises. A brother or sister teases. Classmates say unkind words. When that happens, it's easy to hold on to anger. But holding on to anger is heavy. It weighs down your heart. God knows that. That's why He tells us to forgive. Forgiveness is a choice. You may still feel upset. But you can decide not to get even. You can decide not to bring it up again. You can pray for the person instead. When you forgive, you make space for peace. You show others what God is like. His kingdom grows in you when you choose mercy instead of revenge.

At-Home Activity:

Think of someone in your family you need to forgive. Pray quietly for them tonight. Ask God to help you show kindness to that person tomorrow.



DAY 3

Drop the Anger

Read Proverbs 20:22 NIrV

Sometimes you may want to get even. If someone pushes you, you may want to push back. If someone embarrasses you, you may want to embarrass them. God says wait. Let Him handle it. He sees everything. He knows what is fair. When you try to pay someone back, the problem usually grows bigger. But when you forgive, the problem can stop with you. That takes courage. It takes trust. Forgiving doesn't mean staying silent about bullying or unsafe behavior. Always tell a trusted adult if someone is hurting you. But inside your heart, you can still choose not to hate. God's kingdom grows when you trust Him to make things right.

Reflection:

Is there someone you want to get even with? Talk to God about it. Ask Him to help you wait and choose forgiveness.

DAY 4

A Clean Heart

Read Psalm 51:10 NIrV

Anger can make your heart feel messy. It can grow into bitterness if you let it stay too long. But God can clean your heart. When you ask Him for help, He gives you the strength to forgive. He can replace anger with peace. He can replace hurt with hope. Forgiveness may not happen all at once. You may need to forgive the same person again tomorrow. That's okay. Each time you choose to forgive, your heart becomes softer. God forgave you completely. Because of that, you can forgive others. And every time you do, you are helping God's kingdom grow right where you are.

Prayer:

"Dear God, You have forgiven me for so much. Please clean my heart when I feel angry. Help me forgive again and again, just like You. Teach me to trust You with what feels unfair. Grow Your peace inside me. In Jesus' name. Amen."

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DAY 1

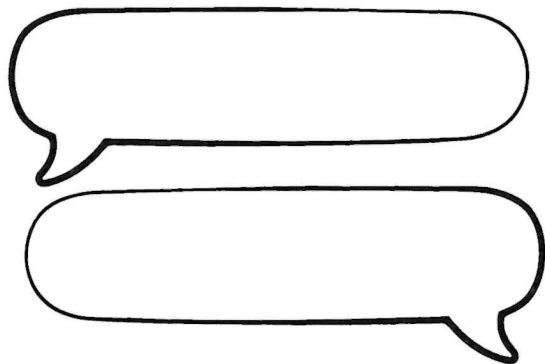
Keep Talking to God

Read 1 Thessalonians 5:17 NIrV

Prayer is simply talking to God. You can pray in the morning. You can pray at school. You can pray before a game or test. God is always ready to listen. Sometimes, you may pray and not see an answer right away. You might ask God to help a friend. You might pray about something hard at home. When nothing changes quickly, you may wonder if God hears you. He does. God never misses a prayer. He cares about every word you say. Jesus teaches us not to give up. When you keep praying, you're showing faith. You're saying, "God, I trust You." And each prayer grows your connection with Him.

Activity:

Inside each speech bubble, write or draw something you want to keep praying for this week. Ask God to help you trust Him as you wait.



DAY 2

Ask Boldly

Read Hebrews 4:16 NIrV

God isn't bothered when you pray. He invites you to come close. You don't have to be shy. You don't have to use fancy words. You can talk to Him honestly. When you need help, ask. When you feel scared, ask. When you feel thankful, tell Him. God gives mercy and grace when we need it most. Being bold doesn't mean being bossy. It means trusting that God loves you and wants to hear from you. Even if the answer takes time, you can keep coming back. Each time you pray, your faith grows stronger. You learn to depend on God instead of yourself.

At-Home Activity:

With your adult, make a short prayer list for the week. Place it somewhere you will see it and remember to pray each day. Pray every day, and watch your faith grow.

DAY 3

Trust While You Wait

Read 1 Romans 12:12 NIrV

Waiting can feel hard. Maybe you're waiting for healing. Maybe you're waiting for a friendship to get better. Maybe you're waiting for answers. God tells us to be patient and keep praying. Patience doesn't mean doing nothing. It means trusting while you wait. You can choose joy because you know God is working, even when you can't see it. You can keep talking to Him about the same thing again and again. When you keep praying, you are saying that God is bigger than your problem.

Reflection:

What is something you've been waiting for? Write it down. Ask God to help you stay patient and hopeful this week.

DAY 4

Faith That Keeps Going

Read Mark 11:24 NIrV

Prayer and faith go together. When you pray, you are trusting God to move. You are believing that He hears and cares. Believing doesn't mean you control the answer—God knows what is best. Sometimes He says, "Yes." Sometimes He says, "No." Sometimes He says, "Not yet." But you can trust that He always answers with love. When you keep praying, even after many days, your faith grows stronger. You learn that God is steady and faithful. Your prayers matter. Your faith matters. So keep praying. And don't give up!

Prayer:

"Dear God, thank You for listening to me every time I pray. Help me remember to keep talking to You, even when I have to wait. Grow my faith. Teach me to trust Your timing. In Jesus' name. Amen."
