THE ORIGINS OF CIVILIZATION 6 —

Genesis 7:1-10

In Genesis 7:1-10 (KJV), God moves from giving instructions to personally inviting Noah and his family into the Ark. This passage shows that salvation is both a gracious invitation and a complete response of faith and obedience. The Ark continues to picture Christ beautifully, and Noah's family's entrance shows what it means to be saved when judgment comes.

First, A COMPELLING INVITATION (vs. 1) reveals God's personal and gracious call: "Come thou and all thy house into the ark." For 120 years Noah had built this massive testimony of God's salvation while preaching righteousness. Now the Ark was no longer just a symbol—it was practical and completely sufficient. It had room for Noah, his wife, his three sons and their wives, and every creature God commanded. In the same way, God's salvation in Christ is not merely testimonial; it is practical and sufficient. Christ's sacrifice and resurrection are enough. We can fully trust the sufficiency of His salvation for every need—past, present, and future.

Second, A COMPREHENSIVE INSTRUCTION (vs. 2-6) shows that God does not leave His people in the dark. He gave Noah very specific directions: seven pairs of every clean animal (for sacrifice and food) and one pair of every unclean animal. He also gave a clear timeline—seven more days before the rain would begin. God reveals everything we need for "life and godliness" (2 Peter 1:3). His instructions are detailed, practical, and complete because He cares for every detail of our salvation and daily walk.

Finally, A COMPLETE ENTRANCE (vs. 7-10) records the beautiful moment when Noah, his wife, his sons, and their wives entered the Ark by faith. They believed everything God had said—His coming judgment, the flood, the Ark, and His grace. Then they acted in obedience. When the rain began and the floodwaters rose, they were completely safe inside the Ark. In the same way, we experience salvation today by faith in Christ. When we enter Him by faith, we are safe from judgment. The door of the Ark was later shut by God Himself (Genesis 7:16), showing that the time to enter is now—before judgment falls.

"Thus did Noah; according to all that God commanded him, so did he." Noah's faith was proven real because he did everything God told him to do. As Jesus said, "If ye love me, keep my commandments" (John 14:15). James reminds us that "faith without works is dead, being alone" (James 2:17). We are not saved by our works, but our obedience to God's commands demonstrates that our faith is genuine and alive.

Application Question #1

Genesis 7:1 shows God personally inviting Noah and his whole family into the Ark. How does this remind us that God's salvation in Christ is both personal and includes our household? What does it mean for our family to respond to God's invitation together?

Application Question #2

In Genesis 7:2-6 God gave very specific instructions about the animals and the timeline. How does this show that God cares about every detail of our lives? What "instructions" from God's Word is our family currently trying to follow?

Application Question #3

Genesis 7:7-10 says Noah and his family entered the Ark by faith before the rain started. Why is it important that they entered before judgment came? How can our family make sure we have entered God's salvation through Christ while there is still time?

Application Question #4

Looking at the whole passage (Genesis 7:1-10), how do God's invitation, instruction, and our entrance work together in salvation? What is one practical step your family can take this week to live as people who have entered the Ark of Christ by faith?

LEADER GUIDE

Application Answer #1

God's invitation was personal ("Come thou") yet included the entire household. This reflects household salvation when the head believes (Acts 16:31). The Ark was sufficient for all who entered. Application: Salvation in Christ is personal but often impacts the whole family. For kids: "God invited Noah's whole family—just like He invites our whole family into Jesus." Challenge: Talk about how your family can respond together in faith and obedience.

Application Answer #2

God's instructions were precise (seven clean pairs, one unclean pair, seven-day warning). This shows His care and that He provides everything needed (2 Peter 1:3). Challenge: God's Word is not vague—He gives clear guidance for life. Application: Choose one specific instruction from Scripture (prayer, kindness, honesty) your family will focus on this week.

Application Answer #3

They entered by faith (Hebrews 11:7) before the rain began. Once the door was shut, it was too late. This creates urgency. Challenge: Salvation must be entered now. Application: Ask each family member, "Have you entered Christ by faith?" Pray together for anyone still outside.

Application Answer #4

God invited, instructed, and expected a response of faith and obedience. The Ark had one door (Christ is the only way), was covered with pitch (His blood covers us completely), and was big enough for all who came. Action ideas: Thank God together for His sufficient salvation, pray for someone outside the Ark, or share one way your family is living "inside" Christ this week. Encourage: Just as Noah's family was safe when the flood came, we are safe in Christ when judgment comes.
