* **Firstfruits note:** This calendar follows the Sadducean/Messianic reckoning of Leviticus 23:11, taking “the day after the Sabbath” as the day after the weekly Sabbath during Unleavened Bread. Therefore, Firstfruits falls on Sunday, April 25, 2027 (18 Nisan), and is counted as Day 1 of the Omer. Shavu’ot falls fifty days later, on Sunday, June 13, 2027 (8 Sivan). The traditional rabbinic/Jewish reckoning instead begins the Omer on 16 Nisan.

* **Shavu’ot note:** This calendar follows the Sadducean/Messianic reckoning, counting fifty days from Firstfruits on the day after the weekly Sabbath during Unleavened Bread. Unlike the other appointed times in Leviticus 23, Scripture does not assign Shavu’ot a fixed month and day; its date is determined by counting seven complete Sabbaths and the following day (Lev. 23:15–16).
