DESCRIPTION:

Jesus' resurrection brings new hope as He appears to His disciples, inviting them into a new way of life that celebrates God's character and faithfulness. As we return to the story of Jacob and Joseph, we see that even in the midst of uncertain or unfair situations, God remains with us and at work for our ultimate good. Even in the face of deception, broken relationships, and unusual dreams, human failures cannot prevent God from working in our lives to ultimately bring healing and restoration.

As they journeyed to the Promised Land, they had much to learn and unlearn. God gave them the Ten Commandments and other instructions to shape their understanding of worship and freedom. Though they often stumbled, God remained with them, continually leading them toward the full promise of their freedom.

• Miracles & Mercy

DESCRIPTION:

Jesus, both through what He says and how He lives, reveals the depth of God's love and graciousness to us. Thousands are fed in unexpected ways with a small meal, living water is offered to a Samaritan woman, and a conversation ensues with Nicodemus about God's love and eternal life. Through the story of the Good Samaritan, Jesus challenges our prejudices and expectations, and in raising Lazarus, He demonstrates God's ability, no matter how hopeless things can seem, to restore life once again. Each moment gives us a glimpse into the heart of God, and invites our response.

On the mountain, Moses and Elijah appear with Jesus, encouraging Him and pointing to the ultimate fulfillment of God's promises. The prophets had long anticipated the coming of the Messiah, and that hope was now being fully embodied in Jesus.
