An endowment scholarship fund at Good Shepherd has been created to reward and celebrate a recipient by granting funds to help financially continue his/her post high school education.

About Pam Powers:

This scholarship is offered in memory of Pam Powers who went home to Jesus on January 9, 2020 at the age of 57. She was a wife, mother, grandmother, and a friend to anyone! She was a member of Good Shepherd UMC since 1994, but her faith went beyond Sunday morning. She leaves behind a legacy of loving Jesus and loving people and animals. Throughout her life, Pam volunteered for countless organizations including Kansas City Pet Project, and anything else her children were involved in. She led numerous Bible studies and small groups and had a zest for life. She recognized needs in her daily interactions with people and worked to fix them - feeding someone who was hungry, walking the dogs from the hospital wing of the shelter, and constantly praying for others. The common thread and driver in her life was Jesus. From her travels and experiences, she would remind her family that kindness is something that needs no words or language to be understood. It was evident that she took that advice to heart. Pam's ability to truly see people and meet them on a heart level was a gift.

Qualifications:

1. Families applying must be an official member or a regular attendee of one of the campuses of Good Shepherd.
2. The applicant must plan to attend a higher learning institution which includes, but is not limited to community colleges, universities, technical schools, trade schools, etc.
3. The applicant must enroll as a full-time student in the fall semester of the year the award is given.

Scholarship Available:

The Pam Powers "Light of Christ Award" offers one tuition scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 to be used the first semester of post high school studies.

Application Procedure:

1. Complete the application form for the Light of Christ Award and return it to Good Shepherd Church, 9555 N. Oak Trafficway, Kansas City, MO 64155 Attention: Light of Christ Award.
2. A voting committee comprised of Pam Powers' family (and any friends they choose to include) will review and vote on the scholarship recipient. Applicant names and contact information will not be disclosed to the voting committee members.
3. The Good Shepherd Executive Director/Pastor will be the Light of Christ Award coordinator.
4. After each application is reviewed and an honoree has been selected, Good Shepherd will make arrangements to forward the scholarship funds to the awarded recipient.

Scholarship Renewal:

The Light of Christ Award is an annual scholarship offered to graduated high school seniors. One scholarship will be awarded each year and is limited to the recipient's first semester only.

None

Deadlines and Review Process: Applications will be accepted between April 1-May 2. The scholarship will be awarded in mid-May.
