### PRESIDING BISHOP'S EPISTLE

Praised be Jesus Christ!

After another exorbitantly long delay due to the energisingly preoccupying activity in our Church, I am relieved and delighted to write you again in this third official Presiding Bishop's Epistle. Thank you for your patience. As one will read in the following narrative, the past six months have been a sublime period in our Church's life, as I have continued to travel throughout the Eastern United States, to visit and promote directly and personally as many of our parishes and missions as possible, and to witness firsthand the great progression in our Church family. Please allow me to reiterate that serving as your Presiding and Diocesan Bishop remains the superlative blessing and honour of my life. In my prayers, I praise God daily for all of you.

#### **Events and Activities**

In July, I was able to spend two weekends on holiday with my family in Maryland and was privileged to celebrate Masses at Saint Alban's Church, Joppa. From 15th to 22nd July, it was a treat and a supreme gift to serve as the retreat conductor for the Clericus of the Anglican Catholic Church of Canada, which meeting was held at the FCJ Retreat Centre in Calgary, Alberta. The theme of the retreat was twofold: spiritual warfare in the life and work of the priest, and the use of the Anglican Missal. Our relationship with the ACCC and the Traditional Anglican Church (TAC) perdures and expands. Episcopal visitations to Saint Michael the Archangel Church, Matthews, North Carolina, and Christ the Redeemer Church, Warner Robins, Georgia followed respectively on 31st July and 7th August. On the weekend of 13th August, I made an episcopal visitation to Holy Trinity Church, Fernandina Beach, Florida.

On the Feast of the Assumption of Our Lady, 15<sup>th</sup> August, I was invited to preach the Solemn High Mass at Saint Stephen's Cathedral (ACC), in Athens, Georgia, and on Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> August, I was invited to celebrate Sunday Mass and preach at Saint Francis of Assisi Church (ACC), Gainesville, Georgia. These connections with the Anglican Catholic Church serve as a visible testimony to the increasing collaboration and cooperation of the Anglican Joint Synods (G3) communion.

The week of 12th September will long live in my memory as one of the most enjoyable and successful Synods in the history of our Diocese, the much anticipated Diocesan Synod sponsored by All Saints' Church, Mills River, North Carolina. The hotel facilities and amenities were unparalleled! We most profoundly thank Prebendary Erich Zwingert and the faithful of All Saints' Church for a truly magnificent experience. The Synod was designed to concentrate on the three aspects of Church work that go to the essence of our present and future vocation: the upgraded and sophisticated website and social media ministry of the APA, the development of parochial schools for our children, and the refurbishment and edification of our current Churches and new mission plants. New internet resources, new schools, and new Church buildings. These signs manifest our corporate resurgence in Christ.

On the weekend of 24<sup>th</sup> September, I made an episcopal visitation to Holy Cross Church, Knoxville, Tennessee. Father Scott Greene has just been called to serve as the next Rector of Holy Cross Church. Please pray for Father Greene and his family, and for Holy Cross, as

they begin this major transition. We are entirely excited by this glorious election!

I then headed off to Dallas, Texas from 27<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> of September for a conference on parish mission and growth, sponsored by Bishop Stephen Scarlett and the ACC Diocese of the Holy Trinity. This meaningful time was devoted to examining ways by which parish life, Church growth, and mission expansion can be intensified through 'remnant theology,' the spiritual formation and fostering of the life of prayer within a community through a core group or faithful remnant at its heart. It was one of the most productive and fruitful conferences I have ever attended. It was a missions conference that actually addressed how to engage in missions!

In mid-October, 10th to 13th, I arranged a pastoral trip and fact-finding venture with our Canon Missioner, Father Wade Miller, to Saint Luke's Church, Port Orange, Florida, and All Saints' Church, Palatka, Florida. As a result of our meetings, we are thrilled now to announce that we have located a priest who, at a significant cost to himself and his family, is prepared to assume the responsibility and hard work of rebuilding the mission of Saint Luke's Port Orange. Father Jeffrey Steel, who comes to us from the Reformed Episcopal Church, will begin his new ministry as our mission priest in the metropolitan Daytona Beach area by the time one reads this message. Because of the generous provision of the Diocesan bequest fund, we shall be in a position to provide financial support to Father Steel as he begins this crucial ministry. The Standing Committee has graciously allocated a portion of the Diocesan bequest specifically for the financial support of domestic missions in the DEUS. Please pray fervently for Father Steel and his efforts, and for Father Paul Beutell, who perseveres with love and great commitment as the new Vicar of All Saints' Palatka.

It should also be noted that beginning in February 2023, Father Scott Koszalinksi will become Vicar of Saint Peter's Church, Deerfield Beach, Florida, which will also enter a process of intensive restructuring and renewal,

very similar to what is now being enacted in Port Orange and Palatka. We earnestly thank Father Tracy Smith for his years of wonderful and dedicated service at Saint Peter's, as Father Koszalinski prepares to step in as the new Vicar.

Also, Father Michael Scalfani, who comes to us from the Anglican Church in America, has graciously accepted the call to serve as Vicar of All Souls' Church, Asheboro, North Carolina. The good news just gets better! We thank all of our fabulous priests for the work they perform day in and day out for Our Divine Lord. Our determination to revitalise and rejuvenate our Diocesan missions persists apace. A year from now, we shall all be surely awed at the flowering that will be achieved in all of these mission Churches, so dear to the heart of our Diocese.

On the Feast of Our Lady of Walsingham, 15<sup>th</sup> October, I was truly blessed to participate in the online Second Diocesan Synod of the Diocese of the Central and Western States. One could not help but be deeply moved by the sacrificial love, labour, steadfastness, and devotion of the clergy and the faithful of DCWS. I wish to thank Bishop Robert Giffin and all the officers of the Diocese for their unswerving leadership.

From 18<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> October, a life-long anticipation was fulfilled by attendance at the General Synod and the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration of the Polish National Catholic Church (PNCC) held in Scranton, Pennsylvania. Many of the PNCC delegates present there told me personally of their fond remembrances and serious cherishing of the relationship the PNCC once enjoyed with orthodox Anglicanism; the hope for a restoration of that communion looms large amongst our Polish National Catholic friends. It was a tremendous grace to represent the G3 at the Synod.

On 30<sup>th</sup> October, a day of profound rejoicing and gratitude arrived with the Institution of Father William Joshua Kimbril as the new Rector of Saint Matthew's Church, Weaverville, North Carolina. It is absolutely superb to have the ministry of Father Kimbril in this

new and vital position. Please pray for Father Josh and all the faithful of Saint Matthew's Weaverville.

For All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day this year, Dean Matthew Harlow kindly invited me to celebrate the Solemn High Masses for the occasion at Christ the Redeemer Church, Warner Robins, Georgia. On the weekend of 6<sup>th</sup> November, I returned to All Saints' Church, Mills River, North Carolina, for the annual episcopal visitation.

After a three-year hiatus because of the coronavirus pandemic, we finally restored from 16<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup> November the annual Diocesan Women's Retreat at the Monastery of the Holy Spirit in Conyers, Georgia. Interest in the retreat is at a record level. We welcomed the largest number of participants yet. It is thoroughly heartwarming and encouraging to see such an outpouring of desire for the formation of the spiritual life amongst the ladies of our Diocese. The theme for the retreat, which I was once more gratified to lead, focussed on spiritual warfare and the Catholic way by which to deal with the diabolical.

On the weekend of 27<sup>th</sup> November, I reveled in another episcopal visitation to Saint Philip's Church, Blacksburg, Virginia, which continues to grow at an astonishing rate. On the weekend of 11<sup>th</sup> December, I made my first official episcopal visitation as Ordinary to Saint Matthew's Church, Riverview (Tampa), Florida. The highlight of the visit was the dedication of two renovated parish buildings in honour of beloved parishioners, followed by a terrific luncheon reception.

On 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> December, I attended the Saint Vincent de Paul Chapter meeting of the Society of the Holy Cross (SSC), sponsored by Saint Stephen's Cathedral (ACC), Athens, Georgia.

#### In the New Year

January 2023 events include an episcopal visitation to All Saints' Church, Charlottesville, Virginia, the Anglican Joint Synods – Polish National Catholic Church dialogue meeting at Saint Paul's Church, Melbourne, Florida, and the annual national Mass of the Society of King Charles the Martyr (SKCM) at Saint Barnabas Cathedral, Atlanta.

On 4th February, it will be a cause of elation and thanksgiving to visit Saint Patrick's Church, Brevard, North Carolina, and dedicate the congregation's beautiful new Church building!

On 26<sup>th</sup> February, it will be my great privilege and delight to institute the Reverend Father G. Allen Fisher as the new Rector of Saint Michael the Archangel Church, Matthews, North Carolina. We earnestly thank Father O. Michael Cawthon, who has now retired, for his years of devoted service as Rector of Saint Michael's Church.

### Foreign Consecrations

Tentatively, Bishop David Haines and I are scheduled to travel to Saint John the Evangelist Cathedral (ACCC), Victoria, British Columbia, Canada from 7<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> February to consecrate Father Richard Panem Rajesh Kumar as Bishop of the Anglican Church of India (APA). A second future bishop, Father John Prakash, will be consecrated with Father Richard to serve as Bishop of the Anglican Church of India (TAC). The consecration of our new Indian bishop has been dramatically delayed because of the pandemic, so please pray that this scheduled consecration can occur as planned. This event will be the first joint episcopal consecration of the APA and TAC since 1995.

#### In the Spring

In March 2023, a retreat for all G3 Anglican Joint Synods clergy will be held at the Monastery of the Holy Spirit in Conyers Georgia, from 7<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup>. Canon Stephen Dart of the Anglican Province of Christ the King will be our retreat conductor. Please join us if you can. The Diocesan Board of Examining Chaplains will meet at Saint Barnabas Cathedral Atlanta from 13<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> March. I shall make an episcopal visitation to All Saints' Church, Wilmington, North Carolina on the weekend of 25<sup>th</sup> March. At Saint George's Cathedral (Anglican Church in America), Columbus, Georgia, the

inaugural meeting of the new Anglican Joint Synods -Charismatic Episcopal Church (CEC) dialogue will take place from 28<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> March. More information about this dialogue will soon be shared with you. Please pray for the work and ministry of the involved committees.

### APA Spring Retreat

Finally, please don't forget our annual APA Spring Clergy Retreat! The 2023 retreat will be held at the Trinity Centre in beautiful Pine Knoll Shores, North Carolina, an island refuge on the southern Outer Banks. There is access to the sound and the beach. We will be in the East, West, South, and Lagoon housing clusters with access to the Beach Pavilion. Rooms are walking distance to the conference building and dining rooms. The retreat begins on Monday 24th April and concludes on Wednesday 26th April. Registration has ended, but please consult the Provincial Office for any potential openings.

#### Advanced Reading for Spring Retreat

The theological theme for the 2023 retreat will be 'Ecclesiology and the Doctrine of Sacramental Participation in the Letters of Saint Ignatius of Antioch.' In particular, we shall discuss the nature of the Church as she inheres in the Episcopate and the means by which we participate in the Incarnation and Person of Our Lord through the Church and the Sacramental System. We eagerly encourage everyone attending carefully to read the letters of Saint Ignatius of Antioch before our time together.
