The King's Road: Greater Light / Greater Responsibility

Matthew 11:20–30

Discussion Questions

I. Condemnation – Greater Light, Greater Accountability

(Matthew 11:20–24)

Jesus rebuked cities that had seen His works but refused to repent. What does this teach us about the responsibility that comes with knowing truth?

Why do you think people can be exposed to clear evidence of God's work and still choose not to respond in repentance?

II. Confession – God Reveals Truth to the Humble

(Matthew 11:25–26)

Jesus praises the Father for revealing truth to the “little children” rather than the “wise.” What does this tell us about the kind of heart posture God honors?

How can pride or intellectual confidence become a barrier to truly knowing God?

III. Call – Come to the King and Find Rest

(Matthew 11:27–30)

Jesus invites the weary to come to Him, not to a system or ritual. What does it practically mean to “come to Jesus” in your daily life?

Jesus says His yoke is easy and His burden is light. How is following Christ both a calling to surrender and a source of rest at the same time?

Application Questions

Considering the amount of truth and exposure to God's Word you've received, how is God calling you to respond more fully in repentance and obedience?

Are you currently trying to carry burdens on your own, or are you truly coming to Jesus for rest? What would it look like to take His yoke upon you this week?

Prayer Prompts

Prayer of Repentance and Response

Lord, help us not to ignore the truth You have shown us. Give us hearts that respond quickly in repentance and obedience.

Prayer for Humility

Father, guard us from pride. Help us come to You with simple, trusting hearts that are ready to receive Your truth.

Prayer for Rest in Christ

Jesus, teach us to come to You with our burdens. Help us walk in Your ways and find true rest for our souls.
