Psalm 51:1-4

For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me. Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight; so you are right in your verdict and justified when you judge.

- God will hide his face from your sins because he hid his face from Jesus on the cross.

Psalm 51:10-12

Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me.

- David lost the joy of salvation because he sinned, but he first sinned because he lost the joy of salvation.
