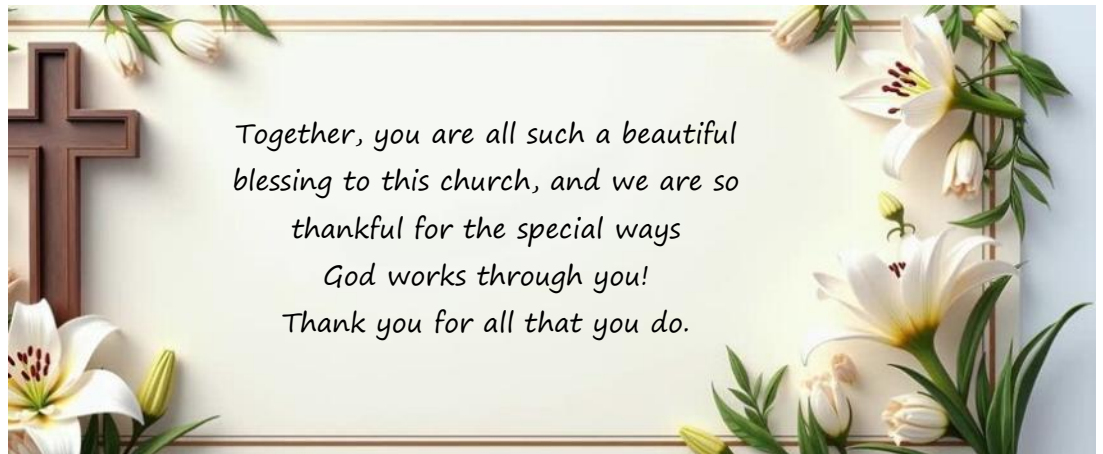
We are Blessed to the 170th Degree!!!

NOTES FROM THE BALCONY

It's happening. Spring is emerging from the dormant earth. Barely perceptible at first, and held hostage for a weekend in March by a late snowstorm, spring has broken forth. It's as if everything with potential for life has been secretly gathering itself for this moment. The perennials are popping out of the ground. The bushes are covered with buds. The bulbs are bursting forth with blossoms. The grass blades are growing. The trees are transmitting the sap from their roots and thrusting out myriads of new leaves. Spring comes in great abundance as a gift from our heavenly Father.

Salvation, freedom from sin, death, and the devil, and life in Christ also come as gifts in great abundance from our God. On Easter, we joyfully celebrate these gifts that burst forth from the grave that temporarily held Christ. The hymn, *With High Delight Let Us Unite*, LSB 483, expresses the Christian's thankful joy in light of the abundant gift of life given to us as a result of Christ's life given on the cross. Written in 1566 by the Moravian priest Georg Vette (1536-1599), this hymn originally had thirteen stanzas. The first letter of the stanzas formed an acrostic on "Mediator Jesus."

Stanza 1

With high delight Let us unite In song of great jubilation.
 Ye pure in heart, All bear your part, Sing Jesus Christ, our salvation.
 To set us free forever, He
 Is ris'n and sends To all earth's ends
 Good news to save ev'ry nation.

Stanza 2

True God, He first From death has burst Forth into life, all subduing
 His enemy Doth vanquished lie; His death has been death's undoing.
 "And yours shall be Like victory
 O're death and grave,' Saith He, who gave
 His life for us, life renewing.

Stanza 3

Let praises ring; Give thanks, and bring To Christ our Lord adoration.
 His honor speed By word and deed To ev'ry nation.
 So shall His love give us above.
 From misery And death set free,
 All joy and full consolation.

In addition to the jubilant praise with spring-like imagery expressed in this hymn, we are reminded that this treasure should be shared with every nation. Pastor Will Weedon, on a recent *The Word of the Lord Endures Forever* podcast, compared the abundance of spiritual blessings we receive from God to the abundance Joseph had gathered in Egypt during the years of plenty. It would have been a crime not to share the wealth of grain with the needy people during the years of scarcity. So also we must share freely the abundance of God's blessings so others also can be set free from death and misery and join in the jubilation and delight of Jesus Christ, our salvation.

It draws upon the theme of the 69th Regular Convention of the LCMS, set for July 18–23, 2026, under the theme "Christ Is Risen Indeed," based on 1 Corinthians 15:20–22.

The National Offering theme is based on Psalm 78:4: "We will not hide them from their children, but tell to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the LORD, and His might, and the wonders that He has done."

The National Offering, which spans the years between conventions, provides an opportunity for congregations, districts, circuits, individuals or other groups to support the work of the LCMS vigorously to make known the Good News of Jesus Christ, that all might rejoice and give thanks to our heavenly Father.
