LAVERNNE THOMPSON - 100 YEARS Of Living Life Fully

Our dear sister in Christ, Lavernne Thompson, recently celebrated her 100th



birthday! What a joyous achievement, so let's learn more about this remarkable woman. Lavernne was born on Feb 12, 1923, in the town of Nipawm, Saskatchewan, Canada. Her parents were Everett and Grace Mattoon. She had one brother, Glenn. She lived on a 160-acre parcel of land; if her father cleared and lived on the land the family would eventually own the land as part of a Canadian government plan.

Because the family lived so far from the town, Lavernne's early education consisted of homeschooling by her mother. In subsequent years her schooling included correspondence courses (can you imagine taking algebra and biology by correspondence); she also had some years in a small

schoolhouse and riding a horse to school. As a result of this mismatched education, Lavernne did not graduate from High School until 1960 the same year as her daughter Carole.

However, the lack of formal education did not stop this remarkable woman from a varied and interesting career. She obtained her pilot's license. Lavernne worked in a department store, bookkeeper for a chiropractor, an oral surgeon's office and also a stay-at-home mom for her two girls. Lavernne was a success at every career choice.

Lavernne met her husband Howard at a school dance in 1940 and they were married April 15, 1942. They moved to Vancouver for Howard's job. Their daughter, Carol, was born Jan 18, 1943. Eventually Howard obtained employment at the Alameda Naval Air Station. Their second daughter, Barbara, was born Feb 4, 1944 in Oakland.

After the war the family settled in Northern California as Howard was running a sawmill. Eventually the forest which provided the lumber was slated to be under water as part of a new dam. Howard and Lavernne bought a Big O tire store in Chico and lived there

until 1961. The family then moved to San Lorenzo. Lavernne worked in an oral surgery office in Oakland for a total of 38 years until retiring at the age of 80.

Howard suffered a massive stroke and died in 1984. Lavernne bought her home in San Lorenzo in 1965 and sold it in 2003 when she retired and moved to Trilogy to be near Barbara who was working at Travis AFB.

Lavernne has been attending Windborn since 2003. She sends birthday and anniversary cards to everyone in the Church and has hosted a bible study in her home for many years.

Lavernne came to the Lord when she was 13; because she lived in rural Saskatchewan the church was held in a home and Lavernne was baptized in a bathtub. **Psalm 118:24 This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.** This is the way Lavernne has lived her life and we are blessed as a church family to have her in our congregation.

He has completed three of the five stages of this process and hopes to complete his work by October 2023. I am incredibly proud of how hard he works, not only in taking on this endeavor but also in how well he continues to care for our family and lead the team of workers placed in his care with Converge, the mission organization that we serve with here in Poland.



Karis is 12 and in 7th grade, attending her second year with Wilson Hill Academy. We are thankful for the faith-based education that she receives through this hybrid homeschool model. When she's not studying History and Latin (her two favorite subjects) she is dancing and taking sewing lessons.

Isaac will be 11 at the end of February and is currently in 5th grade and also participates in the Wilson Hill Academy hybrid homeschool program. He loves to read, spend time outdoors, and play the piano. He is a deep thinker (like his dad) and very curious.

Olivia will turn 9 at the end of February and is our most extroverted child! She is not shy, loves to have a good time and laughs loud (wonder where she got that from!) She started acrobatic dancing this year alongside her big sister and enjoyed her first performance this past Fall. She is in the 3rd grade (in a local Polish school) and it's fun to see her thrive in this environment.

Milo is 4 and keeps us all on our toes! He is the stereotypical baby of the family – loves the attention, loves to snuggle, and loves to make you laugh; He knows just what to say to get everyone in stitches! He is in a local preschool and doing a fantastic job at learning Polish, it's fun to hear all the new phrases he comes home saying. I'm not ready for him to be in extracurricular activities, so he spends his free time playing in our backyard, watching Bluey on Disney+ or riding his bike. He tags along for all the big sibling adventures and is a good sport about it.

As for me, I get to try and help manage all the above and when I do get some free time, I enjoy finding new coffee shops in town and reading a good book. I also get to work with the team of people serving in the TCK's in our region (Third Culture Kids – missionary kids are TCK's), and love on the women who serve with the 15:5 West Initiative (that we lead for Converge)/ I enjoy meeting other moms here and talking about the highs and lows of motherhood and how to best show love to those God has entrusted in our care.

Some exciting things ahead include the arrival of the Kids' Christmas present. Next week, we will be picking her up... her name is Poppy and she is the cutest little Bichon Frise you've ever seen (of course I'm biased!)
