

## Discussion Questions Romans 1:18-25

### *When Truth Is Suppressed*

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1. The sermon said our greatest problem is not lack of information, but resisting the truth we already have. Why do you think people often resist truth, even when they know it?
2. When you hear the phrase “the wrath of God,” what comes to mind? How did this sermon challenge or reshape your understanding of God’s wrath?
3. Paul says creation reveals enough about God to leave humanity “without excuse.” Where do you most clearly see God’s fingerprints in creation or everyday life?
4. The message said science is a wonderful tool, but a limited one. How can science and faith work together rather than compete with one another?
5. Romans 1:21 highlights two root sins: refusing to honor God and refusing to thank Him. Why do you think gratitude is so important to spiritual health?
6. The sermon stated: “When we don’t worship God, we will worship something else.” What are some common modern idols people turn to today? Which ones are most tempting in your own life?
7. Paul says rejecting truth darkens the heart and confuses the mind. Have you ever seen how repeated sin can distort someone’s thinking—or your own? What happened?
8. The phrase “God gave them up” shows that judgment can sometimes mean being allowed to chase what we want apart from God. Why is that both sobering and merciful?
9. Which of the three personal questions from the sermon challenged you most?
  - What truth are you suppressing?
  - What created thing are you asking to be God?
  - Where is sin already unraveling life?
10. The sermon ended with hope in Christ: justice and mercy meet at the cross. Why is the gospel better news than simply “try harder and do better”?
