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Construction History- Continued

We continue our conversation regarding construction progress from our March issue:

- 2023-2024: Framing was 98% finished, and we had started searching for a fire sprinkler company. This step was essential before we could proceed with HVAC, electrical, or insulation work. Additionally, exterior landscaping and concrete curbing had been completed, showing visible progress on the outside. Funding arrived in phases, allowing plumbing and electrical work to advance significantly in the building. The plumbing for the Food Pantry and shelter areas was nearly finished as well.
- Late 2024: We experienced some significant damage to the roof after all the work had been completed, causing several leaks throughout the second floor. After a call went out to the community, funds were raised in a short time and a new roof was completed by January 2025.
- 2025: Funding, again, was hit and miss. Our biggest delay - and challenge - was finding a contractor for the fire sprinkler system. This delay put us behind 9 months as we continued to find resistance to taking on our project. It was not until late October that a contractor was found to do the work. Thankfully, it also came under budget.
- Tune in next month to get the really exciting news on our progress - it is worth the wait!

Our objective is to open the Food Pantry by Summer 2026, followed by the development of the shelter, office, and kitchen, with the final phase of Transformational Living Space set for Winter. The Food Pantry funding still needed is just under \$100,000, which is our goal for Idaho Gives.

Remaining costs are estimated at:

- Security camera/system: \$25,000
- Shelter bed system: \$40,000
- Windows: \$48,000
- Bath fixtures: \$70,000
- Insulation and sheetrock: \$110,000
- HVAC systems: \$115,000
- Elevator: \$122,000
- Electrical and fire alarm: \$150,000
- Kitchen equipment: \$200,000

Total Estimate: \$880,000



What Brings Us Back Every Week

One of the primary objectives of Street Reach is to provide a wide array of resources to our neighbors living on the streets. It goes beyond just distributing a food bag, hygiene kit, or even a resource sheet. From the beginning, we have aspired to be more than that.

We started by partnering with organizations like the Free Clinic to enhance our team. Access to real case management and medical assistance is vital for these wonderful individuals. We also collaborated with the Aid for Friends housing initiative, helping people find affordable housing options or at the very least, getting them on a waitlist for housing opportunities.

Yet, we still yearned for deeper support and care during our outreach. Then, one Monday morning, it happened.

We are fortunate to have a retired RN on our board and part of the Street Reach team. Additionally, thanks to connections made with new volunteers at the Warming Shelter, we now have a retired ER doctor on our team. Both joined us for this particular outing.

We approached the vehicle of a neighbor whom we had been worried about after a recent encounter where he appeared noticeably frustrated, upset, and angry at the world. He has been living in his car for several years and uses a walker due to injuries from a car accident. There was a lot going on for him, to say the least.

When we spoke with him, the doctor asked for permission to check his vitals and perform a quick examination. Our neighbor welcomed the assistance. After nearly 30 minutes of checking vitals, asking questions, and helping him out of his vehicle to walk, we gathered a comprehensive understanding of his needs. The doctor provided advice on next steps, including a visit to the Free Clinic for a more thorough evaluation and medication. After we prayed with him, he said, "You made my day. I feel really good about things now and have a little hope."

Both the RN and I exchanged glances filled with joy and admiration for what had just occurred. Real, tangible help and heartfelt care – making an impact and changing lives.

THAT is what makes our work so rewarding, drawing us back to this mission every single time!
