"We are very grateful for all you do for us. We try to get help from different places but sometimes we can't make it on time and people leave for the day. When you come out with folks from other (partner) agencies, we feel like we can get something done and we really appreciate that. We also feel like at least there's someone looking out for us and checking in on us."

THAT is why we do Street Reach. Not for the recognition or exposure. People experiencing homelessness need to know that they matter, that someone DOES care about them. For people experiencing poverty, the Food Pantry serves 200 households EVERY WEEK, distributing between 5,000 and 8,000 pounds of food in the same period. And this season, the Warming Shelter will provide a warm, safe place for our neighbors to get out of the cold and get a good night sleep.

With your help, and that of our generous community, in 2026 we plan to:

- Open the Food Pantry in it's new location, ready to serve more than 200 households every Thursday, as well as provide a separate time of service for our senior and physically challenged guests.
- Complete fundraising for Phase 2 - emergency shelter, kitchen/dining, medical, and office space.
- Expand the Street Reach Team and leadership, and begin fundraising for Phase 3 - Transformational Living Program.

We know this new year will bring some new opportunities. We are looking forward to the challenge!

STREET REACH

The Valley Mission Street Reach teams are active every week, engaging with the community, providing resources, and encouraging follow-up with appointments, among other initiatives. There is a significant need in our valley.

It's easy for any of us to take a step back and say things like, "Just get a job... You're just lazy... You're a drain on our community." Sadly, our neighbors have heard these comments—and worse. But who appointed us as judge and jury? Whenever I conduct a training session, one of my first statements is, "For those of us in the room who have NEVER made a poor decision, please raise your hand. Raise it high for everyone to see!" We all know the outcome: not a single hand is raised. In fact, it often elicits a chuckle from the audience. Why is that? Because we've all been in similar situations; we've all made mistakes.

So, what sets us apart from those living on the streets? While this question is complex, here are a few points we often take for granted:

1. Most of us had a supportive upbringing that taught us how to make informed and educated choices. Many also had families willing to guide us through the process.
2. Most of us benefited from a support network that helped keep us on track.
3. Most of us are not, or were not, battling an addiction that could strip everything away from us.

Every individual we encounter on the streets lacks these crucial elements and much more. When we establish a connection, we build trust, allowing us to provide guidance, direct them to genuine help, and celebrate their progress on this journey.

Special Warming Shelter Update

Warming Shelter Info

We are thrilled to share that we have joined forces with Housing Alliance Community Partnerships to establish a warming shelter in the former Convergys building at 805 N Main, set to open by mid-December. This is a significant victory for our community!

Following our initial two training sessions, we now have 31 dedicated individuals ready to staff the shelter. Another training session is scheduled for December 22nd at 6:30 PM at First Baptist Church, located at 408 N. Arthur Avenue. Training is mandatory for ALL volunteers and generally lasts about 90 minutes.

Since this initiative falls outside our budget plan, we need to raise approximately \$13,000 to launch and sustain the program. Our primary expenses will go toward paid security and utility costs for the facility. So far, we have acquired cots, covers, and additional supplies, enabling us to set up 30+ cots initially. We are actively seeking support from various groups, foundations, and individuals to cover these costs and will continue until we reach our funding goal.

As of now, we have already raised just under \$7,000 toward our total expenses! What an AMAZING community! Many essential items for the shelter are either on-site or in transit, giving us ample time to set up, conduct a walkthrough, and familiarize ourselves with the process.

How Can **YOU** Contribute to This Effort?

- AFTER you've been through training, volunteer for a shift: There are three shifts available:
 - 6:45 PM – 11:00 PM
 - 10:45 PM – 3:00 AM
 - 2:45 AM – 7:00 AM
- Donate a blanket or pillow, or both.
- Provide a hot meal (from a restaurant or store—no home-cooked items) for one evening.
- Pray daily for the safety and rest of our neighbors and volunteers.

There are a few ways to serve:

Wednesdays, 8 am - 11:30 am

Food is delivered from our 14 stores as well as from the Idaho Foodbank. Unloading, sorting, organizing and building food boxes takes place on this day.

Thursdays, 10 am to 11 am

Additional food deliveries from some of the same stores. Unloading, sorting and organizing takes place here.

Thursdays, 3:30 to 6 pm

Food is distributed to the community. Most 'jobs' deal with serving the guest as well as carrying boxes to their vehicles.
