## Warming Shelter Winter Plans

Is it really only the beginning of September, and we're already discussing winter?

to be effective, we must start planning well in advance for the upcoming season. We recently learned that one of the shelters will not be opening this year. We are concerned about our neighbors who will be on the streets during these frigid months. Aid for Friends will likely be at capacity most of the time, leaving many vulnerable to severe conditions, or forcing them to make unwise choices just to stay warm.

Valley Mission is working diligently to open the Food Pantry in our new space before winter, allowing the existing pantry space to be transformed into a warming shelter. This initiative requires careful planning and many helping hands to be successful for our community. We're joining a national conversation around homelessness.

On October 9-10, Valley Mission director, Karl Pettit, will sit on a bench - rain, snow, or shine - for 24 hours to listen, talk, and share with our community.

It's part of Conversations on A Bench, a Citygate Network event taking place in dozens of cities across North America. The goal? To reflect the love of God and create space for honest conversations about homelessness, addiction, and mental health. We're hopeful this event helps shift hearts and spread the hope of Christ in our city.

## Construction Progress Funding Update

### Great Start To Conversations...

A big part of Conversations On A Bench is focused on raising funds for construction costs for our building project. Specifically, raising upwards of \$300,000 to complete the build of the Food Pantry phase. Those (rough) costs include fire sprinklers (\$100,000), electrical (\$45,000), plumbing (\$25,000), insulation and sheetrock (\$35,000), HVAC installation (\$30,000), gas line installation (\$25,000), paint and flooring (\$15,000), and equipment/supplies for the food pantry (\$25,000). If we can raise those funds, the pantry can be open and operational within about 2 months time. That would allow us to move the pantry over to its new home, which would then open the existing pantry location to be utilized as our warming shelter. A 'two-for-one' deal!
