PARTICIPATION GUIDE | ACTS 3:22–26 (KJV)

BIG IDEA God's covenant promise continues and is fulfilled in Jesus, who calls us to hear Him, turns us from sin, and sends His blessing to every family.

GROUP LENS Covenant men receive the voice of Jesus, steward what God has entrusted to them, and become a blessing at home, work, church, and in the community.

Reconnect • Week 3: Repentance Brings Refreshing

- Peter confronted sin with truth and grace.
- Repentance changes our direction, not merely our feelings.
- Through Christ, sins are blotted out and refreshing comes from God.
- God promises the restoration of all things through Jesus.

BRIDGE Repentance brings us back into alignment with God. Peter now shows that God has kept His covenant promise in Jesus.

Read the Word • Acts 3:22–26

Acts 3:22 For Moses truly said unto the fathers, A prophet shall the Lord your God raise up unto you of your brethren, like unto me; him shall ye hear in all things whatsoever he shall say unto you. Acts 3:23 And it shall come to pass, that every soul, which will not hear that prophet, shall be destroyed from among the people.

Acts 3:24 Yea, and all the prophets from Samuel and those that follow after, as many as have spoken, have likewise foretold of these days.

Acts 3:25 Ye are the children of the prophets, and of the covenant which God made with our fathers, saying unto Abraham, And in thy seed shall all the kindreds of the earth be blessed. Acts 3:26 Unto you first God, having raised up his Son Jesus, sent him to bless you, in turning away every one of you from his iniquities.

Hear Jesus, the Promised Prophet

Acts 3:22–23

Jesus is God's promised Prophet. Hearing Him includes trusting, submitting, and obeying.

What voice most competes with Jesus for my attention?

Where is Jesus calling for obedience—not agreement alone?

Trust God's Long Story

Acts 3:24–25

The prophets form one witness, and God's covenant promise reaches across generations to every family.

Where am I judging God by one unfinished chapter?

How can I steward God's promise instead of treating it as entitlement?

Receive and Carry the Blessing

Acts 3:25–26

Jesus blesses us by turning us from sin, then sends His people to carry blessing beyond themselves.

What is Jesus calling me to turn away from?

Who can experience God's blessing through my obedience?

MEN LIFE GROUP • APPLY THE WORD

COVENANT STEWARDSHIP MAP

1. HEAR JESUS Name one promise or truth from God that anchors your life.

2. TURN FROM SIN Identify one place where Jesus is calling for obedience—not merely agreement.

3. BLESS A FAMILY Choose one person or household you will intentionally bless this week.
