My other two main classes, Greek and the Lutheran Confessions group, have continued steadily as well, both of which have been a joy for me to teach. I managed to finish Titus up in Sunday morning Bible Study, and a fellow seminarian will be taking over for a few weeks before I begin teaching on the book of Hosea.

My parents brought with them several gifts from the Gerths, with a few shelves and casserole dishes, which will help me out a great deal with storage and keeping up with my cooking! There has been lots to do but all of it has been a blessing.

I also received a very large gift from St. John's Lutheran Church in Galva, Iowa. Their generous gift is going to pay for almost half my final year at seminary!

With February winding down, I am now over the halfway point for my vicarage and have just under 6 months left until I am done. It is going incredibly quickly but it has been such a joy to be up here!




An Evening of Music and Poetry at St. Paul

Sunday Morning Adult Bible Study



