The hand of the LORD was on me; he carried me away by the spirit of the LORD and set me down in the middle of the valley, and it was full of bones. He made me walk all around among them. There were vast quantities of these bones on the floor of the valley and they were completely dry. He said to me, "Son of man, can these bones live?" I answered, "You know, Lord GOD." He said to me, "Prophesy over these bones. Say, "Dry bones, hear the word of the LORD. Thus says the Lord GOD to these bones: I am now going to put breath into you and you

And while he was sitting up on the Mount of Olives, opposite the Temple, Peter, James, John and Andrew questioned him privately, “Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign that all this is about to be accomplished?”

Then Jesus began to tell them, ‘Take care that no one leads you astray. Many will come in my name saying, “I am the one,” and they will lead many astray. CALLING ALL CALVARIANS – We are planning to review the CAT survey results after church on 9/13/26. After discussing the results, we would like have a group discussion on future opportunities. Please come and provide your input so that we can better plan for our future.

Below you will find a one page summary of the CAT survey. Please read through it and come to coffee hour on 9/13.

Thank you for participating in the recent Congregation Assessment Tool ("CAT") Survey. We had 108% of the average weekly attendance complete the survey. What came across loud and clear is you love Calvary. We will set a Sunday in September to discuss the survey during coffee hour.

The following are key points from the survey that we discussed as a vestry with Andrea Mysen of the Diocese:

- Top 3 priorities:
 - Make necessary changes to attract families with children and youth to our church.
 - Develop and implement a comprehensive strategy to reach new people and incorporate them into the life of the church.
 - Provide more opportunities for Christian education and spiritual formation at every age and stage of life.
- We are settled ("stuck") in our ways. While we are very loving caring of and for each other, we are not terribly flexible.
- While we are not considered a "wealthy" parish, we have an above average contribution rate and an above percentage of income giving rate.
- The congregation trusts and has faith in the vestry.
- The congregation wants improvement in both education and music. We will discuss this more during that coffee hour.
- We should develop a pastoral care plan during this time without a full time priest.
- As part of our ongoing pastoral care, we should continue to have a dedicated healing service. Last Sunday of each month?

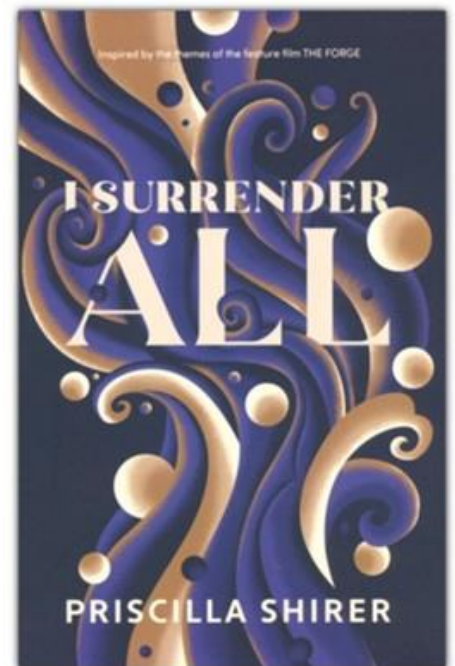

Hi there, Calvary! This is just a reminder to keep on bringing in your aluminum pull tabs. They can be from soda, adult beverages, or canned fruit, soup, meat, veggies - - - basically ANYTHING with a pull tab.

Why are we collecting them?

When we get a critical mass together, they are taken to the Ronald McDonald House Charity in Winfield. RMHC gives them to United Scrap Metal of Chicago. United Scrap donates approximately .55 ¢ per pound to RMHC and then adds an additional monetary gift. Every little bit adds up and we're keeping junk out of landfills.

What is Ronald McDonald House?

These are compassionate "homes away from home" for the parents and siblings of hospitalized children. The families pay nothing for a clean place to stay with a full kitchen, bath, laundry, entertainment, and activities. Imagine the stress many of these parents are under. particularly if their child has a serious or terminal illness! We can play a small part in showing them care and compassion.

So pull your tab and pop your top, Calvarians!
