

5-Day Devotional:

Sitting at the Feet of Jesus

Day 1: Choosing the Good Part

Reading: Luke 10:38-42

Devotional:

Mary chose to sit at Jesus' feet while Martha busied herself with preparations. Jesus affirmed that Mary had "chosen the good part." In our activity-driven world, we often equate busyness with faithfulness. But intimacy with Christ requires intentional stillness.

Before we serve, we must listen.

Before we work, we must worship.

The question isn't whether service matters—it does—but whether we're allowing good things to distract us from the best thing: abiding in His presence. Today, examine your spiritual life. Are you so busy serving Jesus that you've stopped spending time with Him? True discipleship begins at His feet, listening to His Word.

Reflection Question: What "good things" might be keeping you from the "best thing" in your relationship with God?

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Day 2: Worshiping in Spirit and Truth

Reading: John 4:19-24; Acts 17:22-25

Devotional:

God seeks true worshipers—those who worship Him in spirit and in truth. The Athenians worshiped ignorantly, focused on buildings and instruments rather than the living God.

Paul reminded them that God doesn't dwell in temples made with hands; He inhabits the praises of His people.

Our worship must align with God's revealed will, not our preferences or traditions. It's not about the location or the performance; it's about the heart posture.

God is spirit, and He desires worshipers whose spirits connect with His, grounded in the truth of His Word. When we gather, are we truly present with Him, or merely going through motions?

Reflection Question: Is your worship focused on what pleases God or what feels comfortable to you?

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Day 3: Abiding in the Vine

Reading: John 15:1-8

Devotional:

Jesus declares, "I am the vine; you are the branches." Apart from Him, we can do nothing. Fruit doesn't come from frantic activity but from abiding—remaining connected to the source of life.

When branches disconnect from the vine, they wither and die. Similarly, when we disconnect from Christ through neglect of His Word, prayer, and worship, our spiritual vitality fades.

Abiding isn't passive; it's intentional positioning. It means staying at His feet, drawing nourishment from His presence daily. The prodigal son discovered that what his father had given him never truly left; it drew him home. What God plants in you at His feet will sustain you through every season.

Reflection Question:

What practices help you remain connected to Christ daily?



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Day 4: The Truth That Sets You Free

Reading: John 8:31-32; John 14:6; John 17:17

Devotional:

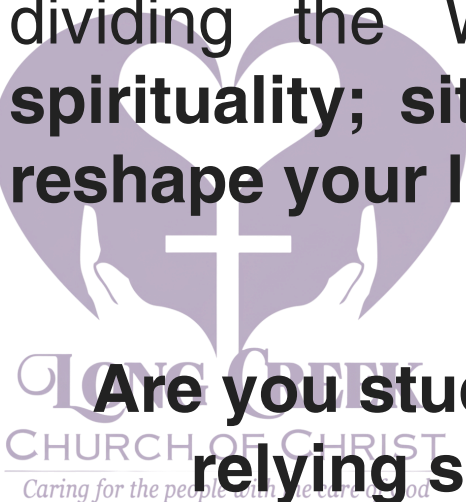
Jesus said, "You shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." But this freedom comes with a condition: continuing in His Word.

Discipleship isn't a one-time decision but a daily commitment to remain at Jesus' feet, learning from Him. He is the way, the truth, and the life—our only path to the Father.

In a world filled with competing voices and distorted messages, we must anchor ourselves in Scripture. God's Word is truth that sanctifies, transforms, and liberates. Study to show yourself approved, rightly dividing the Word. **Don't accept secondhand spirituality; sit at His feet yourself and let truth reshape your life.**

Reflection Question:

Are you studying God's Word for yourself, or relying solely on what others tell you?



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Day 5: The Gospel Call To Salvation

Reading: Acts 2:36-41; Mark 16:15-16; Romans 10:17

Devotional:

On Pentecost, hearts were pierced by the gospel. "What shall we do?" they cried. Peter's answer was clear: "Repent and be baptized...for the remission of sins."

Salvation begins at the feet of Jesus—hearing His Word, believing His promises, confessing His name, repenting of sin, and being baptized into His death and resurrection. This isn't about ritual; it's about response.

Faith comes by hearing God's Word. But hearing alone isn't enough—we must respond with obedient faith.

The invitation still stands today. If you haven't positioned yourself at Jesus' feet through obedience to the gospel, today is your opportunity. Salvation is found in Him alone.

Reflection Question:

Have you responded to the gospel in the way Scripture prescribes, or are there steps of obedience you still need to take?
