"Pay No Attention To The Hand Behind My Back" (Matthew 6:1-4)

Last week Senior Pastor Richard Burguet said the overarching theme in these five verses is Jesus speaking about not being hypocrites, especially when it comes to our faith. Don't pretend to be something you're not; be authentic and real. He is speaking about what it's like to belong to a family of believers because the people of that time looked at faith as just something they did. Their approach to worship was hypocritical and phony. He warned about the quality of their righteousness, and stressed their hearts are what should motivate what they do. It requires sacrifice and self-discipline, especially when it comes to giving, and should be done out of a thankful and loving heart and not done to call attention to ourselves or to gain the praise of men (Proverbs 27:2 ESV). Hypocrites act this way, and God will not honor us when we're tempted to promote ourselves, especially by having our names attached to things for our philanthropy. While we're all tempted to self-promotion, giving should be a natural thing by the believer. God owns everything and doesn't need our money. He simply loves a thankful and cheerful giver (2 Corinthians 9:7 and Proverbs 11:24-25). Our priorities in giving: the church, the poor and the needy. As Jesus reminds us, "whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me" (Matthew 25:40). Giving is an act of love, and in a way an investment in God. Giving is not related to how much we have and must be personally determined. When it comes to seeking approval for our giving, the only one that matters is God. Jesus wants us to realize that our hearts don't beat for God as they should. Jesus gave his life for us when he took our sin to the cross. Like him, our giving must spring from hearts of love.
