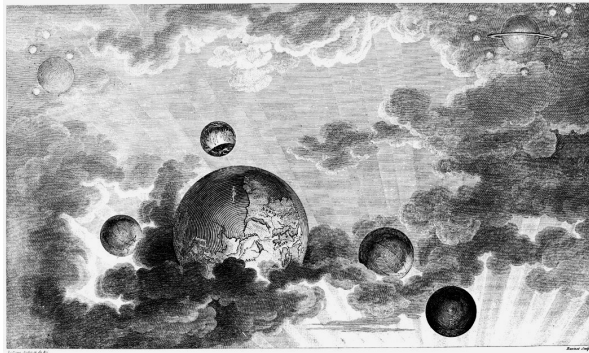

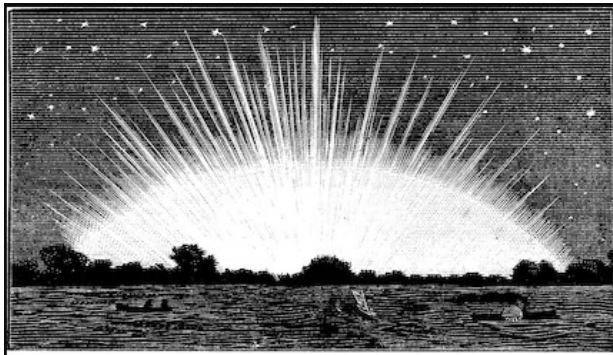

## "24/7" (Matthew 5:13-16)

Last week Senior Pastor Richard Burguet said that in these four verses Jesus is explaining who we are in Christ and how we are to stand apart from the world. Jesus wants us to recognize we are to be countercultural to a watching world and to let our light shine before men so that they may see our good deeds and praise our Father in heaven (v.16). We are live this way as citizens of the Kingdom 24/7. Our calling is to witness to a decadent, decaying and dark world no matter how unpleasant, and avoid being contaminated by the world by sacrificing our holiness. We are to be the salt of the earth even though we're going to face struggles and persecution. We are to be salty Christians, but not offensively salty and obnoxious (see Ezekiel 16:3-4). Without the gospel this broken world will suffer moral decay (see Mark 9:50). Even though we will be alien to the world we must remain salty with integrity. We must maintain our convictions and not compromise our faith or fall into the trap of being blackmailed by the world. In addition to being salty we need to be a visible light to the world like the bright lights of a city on a hill. The world needs to see Christ in us as the light and be drawn to him as we expose things as they are in this fallen world. As believing Christians and disciples of Christ we need to be in unity with our sister churches because a brilliant light cannot be hidden and broken by the common curse of sin. By God's grace, when our collective light shines the world will see our good works which are representative of the Beatitudes. Even though we may face opposition, by living this way 24/7 we give the glory to Jesus and God our Father in heaven.

## IMAGES

Cover: "NGC 2207 and IC 2163: Galactic Get-Together has Impressive Light Display." X-ray: NASA/CXC/SAO/S. Mineo et al, Optical: NASA/STScI, Infrared: NASA/JPL-Caltech. Observed between July 2010 and Aug. 2013. Chandra X-Ray Observatory.

*Located about 130 million light years from Earth, in Canis Major, this pair of spiral galaxies has been caught in a grazing encounter. NGC 2207 and IC 2163 have hosted three supernova explosions in the past 15 years and have produced one of the most bountiful collections of super bright X-ray lights known. These special objects are known as "ultraluminous X-ray sources" (ULXs).*

*As in our Milky Way galaxy, NGC 2207 and IC 2163 are sprinkled with many star systems known as X-ray binaries, which consist of a star in a tight orbit around either a neutron star or a "stellar-mass" black hole. The strong gravity of the neutron star or black hole pulls matter from the companion star. As this matter falls toward the neutron star or black hole, it is heated to millions of degrees and generates X-rays.*

*Colliding galaxies like this pair are well known to contain intense star formation. Shock waves — like the sonic booms from supersonic aircraft — form during the collision, leading to the collapse of clouds of gas and the formation of star clusters.*

*This image is 5 arcmin across (about 180,000 light years).*
