SOCIAL TIME

The first 10-15 minutes as kid's arrive are some of our most important times to meet needs and show kids they are valued. This is why we provide strategic activities for you help engage with every kid as they arrive.

- This month you have Building Sets and Playdough with spring cutters
- You will also find 2 Social activities each week. ***Use one now and one at the end to redirect attention.*

Games and Music (10 minutes)

What You Need: Social Game Instruction Page including Roku Games, Bark Color Pgs, crayons, Blocks (several), Plastic cups (several), Index cards (several), Craft sticks (several), Small toys or animal figures (several), "3-2-1 Action!" printable (1 per group), Adult scissors (1 per group)

What You Do:

- Play worship songs and other songs available on Roku during the Social Game or while kids are playing.
- Using the supplies and game instruction page, choose one game to play with the kids today.
- As you are playing, use this as a time to call each kid by name and learn their names well.

Say: That was a fun game to get us ready to watch our Bible video. Let's sit and listen to our story today."

Bible Story - Say This!

Thanks, Super Crew! The Super Crew is so helpful! In today's Bible story, Moses had an important job to do, asking Pharaoh to let God's people go. God helped Moses follow Him and know what to say and do. Pharaoh made wrong choices and did not obey God with his actions. God wants us to obey Him all the way. He helps us follow Him all the way, just like He helped Moses.

When you are playing hopscotch, there are different actions you can take. Every day we have to make choices about the actions we take. God wants us to obey Him all the way. On our own this can be hard, but God will help us obey Him, just like He helped Moses. Let's say, "God helps me with my actions," together. I'll say it first, and you say it after me. Ready? God helps me with my actions. (God helps me with my actions.)

When we need help, we can ask for it. When we talk and listen to God, this is called prayer. Let's pray now and ask God to help us obey Him with our actions.

God, thank You for helping us with our actions. Please help us obey You all the way in the things we do. Amen

Can you say the Big Deal with me?

All the Way! *(With palms facing each other, stretch arms up and then down to your sides.)*

God Helps Me Obey! *(Point thumbs toward yourself, then make a double thumbs-up.)*

Bible Story Video (10 minutes)**Theme Verse Hopscotch (20 minutes)**

Preschoolers will hop across a hopscotch grid with words from the Theme verse on it.

Big Goal: Remember what is super about the Super Clue.

Leader Prep: Tape the printable pages on the floor in a hopscotch grid.

Supplies: "Theme Verse Hopscotch" printable (1 per group), Cardstock (several), Painter's tape (1 per group)

What To Do: Give me a thumbs up if you remember what today's Super Clue is? *(Allow responses.)* Our Super Clue is a hopscotch grid. We are going to play a super fun game of hopscotch that will help us learn our Theme verse. Each of these squares has a word or two from the Theme verse. As we hop through the grid, we will say the Theme verse. Remember, our Theme verse is John 15:14. It says, "You are my friends if you do what I command you." You can either try the hopscotch by hopping on one foot or jumping with both feet. If you lose your balance or hop out of the squares, that is OK! You can just jump back in and start where you left off. Who would like to go first? *(Allow responses.)* Let's get started! *(Guide preschoolers to jump or hop on one square at a time with the whole group saying the verse in unison. Say the word or phrase first, then invite them to repeat it after you.)*

You are my friends *(You are my friends.)*

if you do what I command you. *(if you do what I command you.)*

Leader Tip: Create several hopscotch grids if your group is larger. Place a leader with each small group.

Loud And Clear: Way to hopscotch! I loved how we were able to say our Theme verse while playing a very fun game! You all made your way through the hopscotch grid as you said the Theme verse. Our Bible verse says that when we obey God and do the things He tells us to do, we are His friends. But we can't obey Him on our own. We need help! God is always ready to help us. That is such good news!

Say:

- Who remembers what our Super Clue is today? (*a hopscotch grid*)
- What does a hopscotch grid help us remember? (*A hopscotch grid reminds us of a fun game. When the game piece lands, you know what action to take. God wants us to obey Him with our actions.*)
- What was something you liked about Large Group?
- **God helps me with my actions.** Which actions will God help us with? (*all of them*)
- What did you learn about God today?

Keep It Going: Form two teams. Guide the first team to pick an action to do while they say the Big Deal. Lead the other team to repeat the words and the actions. Then switch roles and do it again.

Big Deal Motions:

All the Way! (*With palms facing each other, stretch arms up and then down to your sides.*)

God Helps Me Obey! (*Point thumbs toward yourself, then make a double thumbs-up.*)

I enjoyed spending time with you today! It was so great to learn that God will help us obey Him with our actions, the things we do. I can't wait to see you again!

Prepare kids to talk with their family about what they learned today.

- Pass out coloring pages for kids to take home.
- As family members arrive to pick up their kid, greet them and tell them one thing you noticed about their kid that day or something you talked to each kid about remembering this week.
- If there is time to chat with the family, ask how you can pray for them this week.
- Say bye to the kids and call them by name.
