Leader Notes

Bible Passage: The prophecy of the Promised Savior- Isaiah 7:14, 9:6, 11

Bottom Line: God gives me hope.

Leader Context: The people of the Old Testament were looking forward to and waiting for the promised Messiah. We celebrate what the prophet Isaiah told about was fulfilled in Jesus! Hope in Jesus- who He is and what He means for our lives- brings us joy and peace every single day.

Read- Isaiah 7:14, 9:6, 11

Highlight: Isaiah 9:6

Reflect- What aspect of God brings you the most hope when you are in a season of darkness?

- That He helps me overcome? (1 Cor 10:13)
- That He has great plans for me? (Jer 29:11)

Pray: Jesus, thank You that there is always reason to hope in You. The same way the prophet looked forward to Your coming, I can rest assured in Your presence in my life. Your name- Immanuel- reminds me that You are always with me. May I always cling to the hope that is found in You. Amen.

Prepare: If we believe in Jesus, we have hope- Jesus! When has the hope of Jesus helped you in a season of darkness? Share your story of hope with someone this week.
