I Am Secure

1 year olds - 4 year olds

Leader Notes

Bible Passage: Moses and The Red Sea- Exodus 13-14

Bottom Line: God is trustworthy when I doubt.

Leader Context: We are teaching the story of Moses and the Israelites crossing the Red Sea in Exodus 13-14. When the Israelites faced the enormous Red Sea in front of them and angry Egyptians behind them, they doubted God could rescue them. But God showed up, reminding them they could always trust Him. (Read Exodus 14:29-31.) Kids will learn today that, even when they doubt, God is trustworthy. Even when they feel insecure, kids can know they are secure in God.

THE WIN FOR SUNDAY GROUPS: Give kids a first look at The Bible, Jesus, and our need for a Savior by embracing their physical needs or engaging their interests. Use The Code when necessary to help redirect kids and build relationships.

Games and Music (10 minutes)

What You Need: Social Instruction Page, Game Sets, Roku Game Instructions, Bark Coloring Page (several) crayons, Scratch and sniff stickers (several), Construction paper (several), Markers (1 per group; optional), Stickers (several; optional), pool noodle (1 per group)

What You Do:

- Play worship songs and other songs available on Roku during the Social Game or while kids are playing.
- Using the supplies and game instruction page, choose one game to play with the kids today.
- As you are playing, use this as a time to call each kid by name and learn their names well.

Say: That was a fun game to get us ready to watch our Bible video. Let's sit and listen to our story today."

Bible Story Video (10 minutes)

Bible Story Recap- Say This!

Thank you, Super Crew! In our Bible story today, we learned about Moses and the Red Sea. God helped Moses lead His people, the Israelites, through the sea on dry land.

That's a super example of how God is trustworthy.

Our Super Clue, the letter "T," reminds us of something very special. It reminds us that God is trustworthy. Let's say, "God is trustworthy," together. Ready? "God is trustworthy." Great job! *Trustworthy* means we can always, always count on God; He does what He says He will do. God took care of Moses and the Israelites, and God takes care of us too. Let's pray and thank God for being trustworthy. When we pray, we talk and listen to God.

God, thank You for being trustworthy and for always taking care of us. Help us remember that we can trust You because You always do what You say You will do. Amen.

Can you say the Big Deal with me?

A to Z! (Close hands on right side, then make a rainbow motion over in front of you and land with both palms up)

God Takes Care of Me! (Hug yourself with both arms)

Let's do that a few more times.

Trustworthy T — 20 minutes

Preschoolers will decorate the Super Clue.

Big Goal: Remember the Super Clue and how it connects to our Big Deal.

Supplies: “Trustworthy T” printable (1 per child), Markers or crayons (several) T stickers (12 per kid)

Craft Instructions:

1. Before the session, print “Trustworthy T” printables, one per child.
2. Give each preschooler a “Trustworthy T” printable and markers or crayons and 12 “T” stickers.
3. Encourage preschoolers to decorate the Super Clue using markers or crayons and stickers.

What To Do: Does anyone remember what our Super Clue is today? (*Allow responses.*) It is the letter “T.” We are going to decorate our Super Clue. I will give you a “Trustworthy T” paper to decorate with markers or crayons. I can’t wait to see how you decorate it!

Loud And Clear: Great job working on your craft! Remember that when you look at the Super Clue you decorated, it can remind you that God is always trustworthy. In our Bible story today, God took care of the Israelites. He made the waters separate and led them through the Red Sea. Even though they didn’t know how they were going to be safe, they trusted God, and He took care of them. We can always trust God. God takes care of each and every one of us.

Say:

- Who remembers what our Super Clue is today? (*the letter “T”*)
- What does the letter “T” help us remember? (*God is trustworthy.*)
- God is trustworthy. What does it mean for God to be trustworthy? (*Trustworthy means God always tells the truth and always does what He says He will do.*)
- What was your favorite part of the Bible story today?
- Who can you tell what you learned about God today?

Our Big Deal is, “A to Z, God takes care of me.”

A to Z! (*Close hands on right side, then make a rainbow motion over in front of you and land with both palms up*)

God Takes Care of Me! (*Hug yourself with both arms*)

God takes care of us by guiding us just as He did with the Israelites through the Red Sea. God will take care of us everywhere we go. Let’s name places we can go that God will take care of us. (Name places with preschoolers.) Isn’t it so great that God will always do what He says He will do?

Going Home

Prepare kids to talk with their family about what they learned today.

- Pass out coloring pages for kids to take home.
- Say bye to the kids and call them by name.
