SOCIAL TIME

The first 10-15 minutes as kid's arrive are some of our most important times to meet needs and show kids they are valued. This is why we provide strategic activities for you help engage with every kid as they arrive.

Games and Music (10 minutes)

What You Need: Social Game Instruction Page including Roku Games, Bark Color Pages (several) crayons

What You Do:

- Play worship songs and other songs available on Roku during the Social Game or while kids are playing.
- Using the supplies and game instruction page, choose one game to play with the kids today.
- As you are playing, use this as a time to call each kid by name and learn their names well.

Say: That was a fun game to get us ready to watch our Bible video. Let's sit and listen to our story today."

Bible Story Video (10 minutes)

Thanks, Super Crew! In today's Bible story, we learned that God's people, the Israelites, were living in Babylon (BAB ih lahn) because their enemies had brought them there. Babylon was not their home. Israel was their home. But God sent a prophet named Jeremiah to tell the people that they were special to God and that He wanted them to live in Babylon and build a life there with a place to live, a garden to grow fruit and vegetables, a family, and a job. The Israelites could trust God because He provided them with everything they needed.

This makes me think about our Super Clue. Our Super Clue today is a pillow. A pillow reminds us that where we live is special to God. Wow! **Where I live is special to God.** Let's say that together. Ready? **"Where I live is special to God."** I am so glad God cares about where we live. God made us special, and we are special to Him.

Let's talk and listen to God. This is called prayer. Ready? Let's pray in 3-2-1.

God, thank You for caring about where we live. Thank You for providing everything we need. Thank You for making us special. Thank You for always keeping Your promises. Amen

Can you say the Big Deal with me?

Head to Toe! *(Point to head with both hands. Point down with both hands.)*

God Made Me Special! *(Bring fists to hips and strike a superhero pose.)*

Growing in the Garden- Game (20 minutes)

Preschoolers will look for hidden pictures of foods that grow in a garden.

Big Goal: Remember the Bible story.

Supplies: "Growing In The Garden" printable (1 per group), Plastic food items (several; optional), Adult scissors (1 per group)

What To Do: Do you like to play games? *(Allow responses.)* Great! I do too. We are going to play a game called "Growing in the Garden." What are we going to play? *(Growing in the Garden!)* That's right! Excellent listening. Look at the fruits and vegetables I have on these cards, and let's talk about what each one is. *(Review fruit and vegetable names with preschoolers.)* Let's all close our eyes while I hide these fruits and vegetables. Then we will take turns trying to find something yummy from the garden. Is everyone ready? *(Allow responses.)* Let's get started!

Keep It Going: Allow preschoolers to hide the fruits and vegetables for the leaders or other preschoolers to find.

Loud And Clear: I can't believe we found all the fruits and vegetables from the garden! In today's Bible story, we learned about the Israelites, God's people. Through the prophet, Jeremiah, God told the Israelites to plant a garden and eat the fruits and vegetables in the place they were living. A garden helped the Israelites remember that where they lived was special to God. Even when the Israelites were in a country far away from their home, God cared for them. God cared about the Israelites, and God cares about you.

Say:

- Who remembers what our Super Clue is today? *(a pillow)*
- What does a pillow help us remember? *(A pillow is something we use to sleep comfortably. We use it where we live and wherever we travel. A pillow reminds us that where we live is special to God.)*
- What was something you liked about Large Group?
- **Where I live is special to God.** God's people were living in a place that was not their home. What is the name of God's people? *(the Israelites)*
- What did you learn about God today?
- Do you remember today's Big Deal? I'll say it first, and you say it after me. *(Use the motions below as you say the Big Deal.)* Here we go. Head to Toe! *(Head to Toe!)* God Made Me Special! *(God Made Me Special!)*

Keep It Going: Form two lines. Lead the first line to say, "Head to Toe!" and the second line to say, "God Made Me Special!" Practice the Big Deal several times, then let the lines switch parts.

Big Deal Motions:

Head to Toe! *(Point to head with both hands. Point down with both hands.)*

God Made Me Special! *(Bring fists to hips and strike a superhero pose.)*

You did a great job today. We have learned so much together. We have learned that where we live is special to God. In our Bible story, God told His people that they should live their lives in Babylon and promised to bring them home to Israel in 70 years. Where the Israelites lived was special to God, and where we live is special to God too.

Prepare kids to talk with their family about what they learned today.

- Pass out coloring pages for kids to take home.
- As family members arrive to pick up their kid, greet them and tell them one thing you noticed about their kid that day or something you talked to each kid about remembering this week.
- If there is time to chat with the family, ask how you can pray for them this week.
- Say bye to the kids and call them by name.
