### SOCIAL TIME

**The first 10-15 minutes as kid's arrive are some of our most important times to meet needs and show kids they are valued. This is why we provide strategic activities for you help engage with every kid as they arrive.**

- This month you have Puzzles and Building Sets
- You will also find 2 Social activities each week. *\*\*Use one now and one at the end to redirect attention.*

#### Games and Music (10 minutes)

*What You Need:* Social Game Instruction Page including Roku Games, Bark Color Pages (several) crayons, "Swap A Heart" printable (several), Adult scissors (1 per group), Crayons (several), Stickers (several), Adhesive jewels (several; optional), Copy paper (1 per group), Marker (1 per group), Music and music player (1 per group)

#### What You Do:

- Play worship songs and other songs available on Roku during the Social Game or while kids are playing.
- Using the supplies and game instruction page, choose one game to play with the kids today.
- As you are playing, use this as a time to call each kid by name and learn their names well.

**Say:** That was a fun game to get us ready to watch our Bible video. Let's sit and listen to our story today."

**Bible Story Video (10 minutes)**

Thanks, Super Crew! Our Bible story today taught us about a man named Paul who wrote a letter to people who believed in Jesus in a place called Ephesus (*EF uh suhs*). Paul encouraged the people and told them that they were special to God. Like the people in Ephesus were special to God, we are special to God too!

Our Super Clue today is a birthday cake. When it is your birthday, you might get a special birthday cake. Your cake helps you celebrate your special day—you can even blow out the candles on the birthday cake while friends and family sing to you. A birthday cake can help remind us that we are special to God from head to toe. I am so thankful God made each of you special.

*Let's talk and listen to God. This is called prayer. Ready? Let's pray in 3-2-1.*

*God, thank You for making us all special. Thank You that when we believe in Jesus, we become part of Your family. Help us always remember how special we are to You. Amen.*

Can you say the Big Deal with me?

Head to Toe! (*Point to head with both hands. Point down with both hands.*)

God Made Me Special! (*Bring fists to hips and strike a superhero pose.*)

**Place the Candles on the Cake- Game (20 minutes)**

Preschoolers will place candles on a cake in a game like “Pin the Tail on the Donkey.”

**Big Goal:** Remember what is super about the Super Clue.

**Supplies:** “Place The Candles On The Cake” printable (1 per group), Adult scissors (1 per group), Butcher paper (1 per group), Painter’s tape (1 per group), Marker (1 per group), Clear tape (1 per group)

**What To Do:** Today our Super Clue is a birthday cake. What is our Super Clue? (*A birthday cake!*) Great! We are going to play a game called “Place the Candles on the Cake.” There is a big cake drawn on this big sheet of paper. We are going to get in a line and take turns putting a candle on the cake. When it is your turn, I will give you a paper candle with a piece of tape on it. You will close your eyes, step up to the cake, and place the candle on the cake. Then you can open your eyes, and we will see where you placed your candle. We will all say, “Way to go!” and then the next friend will have a turn. We will play until everyone places a candle on the cake.

**Loud And Clear:** Great job playing “Place the Candles on the Cake!” That was so much fun! When it is your birthday, you might get a special birthday cake. Your cake helps you celebrate your special day—you can even blow out the candles on the birthday cake while friends and family sing to you. **Say:**

- Who remembers what our Super Clue is today? *(a birthday cake)*
- What does a birthday cake help us remember? *(A birthday cake helps celebrate your special day—you can even blow out the candles on the birthday cake while friends and family sing to you. A birthday cake reminds us that we are special to God from head to toe.)*
- What was something you liked about Large Group?
- Who wrote a letter to the people that believed in Jesus to tell them they were special to God, and where did they live? *(Paul, Ephesus)*
- What did you learn about God today?
- Do you remember today's Big Deal? I'll say it first, and you say it after me. *(Use the motions below as you say the Big Deal.)* Here we go. Head to Toe! *(Head to Toe!)* God Made Me Special! *(God Made Me Special!)*

**Keep It Going:** Invite preschoolers to practice saying the Big Deal while standing in different positions: stand on one foot, hold both hands in the air, hop like a bunny, wiggle like a snake, and so on.

**Big Deal Motions:**

Head to Toe! *(Point to head with both hands. Point down with both hands.)*  
 God Made Me Special! *(Bring fists to hips and strike a superhero pose.)*

Today we have learned that we are special to God. In our Bible story, a man named Paul wrote a letter to people who believed in Jesus. Paul encouraged the people and told them that they were special to God. You are special to God too. God loves you from your head to your toes. I'll see you next time!

**Prepare kids to talk with their family about what they learned today.**

- Pass out coloring pages for kids to take home.
- As family members arrive to pick up their kid, greet them and tell them one thing you noticed about their kid that day or something you talked to each kid about remembering this week.
- If there is time to chat with the family, ask how you can pray for them this week.
- Say bye to the kids and call them by name.
