Leader Notes

Bible Passage: Remarkably Made- Psalm 139

Bottom Line: God's Made Me on Purpose

Leader Context: Psalm 139 says that we are remarkably and wonderfully made, which means that God made us special, unique, and one of a kind. God didn't make mistakes when He made us—He made masterpieces!

THE WIN FOR SUNDAY GROUPS: Give kids a first look at The Bible, Jesus, and our need for a Savior by embracing their physical needs or engaging their interests. Use The Code when necessary to help redirect kids and build relationships.

Games and Music (10 minutes)

What You Need: June 2 Social Instruction Pages, Game Sets, Roku Game Instructions

What You Do:

- Play worship songs and other songs available on Roku during the Social Game or while kids are playing.
- Using the supplies and game instruction page, choose one game to play with the kids today.
- As you are playing, use this as a time to call each kid by name and learn their names well.

Say: That was a fun game to get us ready to watch our Bible video. Let's sit and listen to our story today."

Bible Story Video (10 minutes)

Bible Story Recap- Say This!

Wow! Thanks Super Crew! They really helped us understand how the Super Clue connected today's Big Deal and the Bible! In today's Bible story, we heard how King David wrote a special song to God. David praised God for making him special and one of a kind.

"One of a Kind, God Made Me Special" That is our big deal. God made you special, unlike anyone else! Special is when something or someone is important and one of a kind. One of a kind means not like anyone else. God made you on purpose.

Artists can use a paintbrush to make beautiful art. The art they make is special and different because each artist is one of a kind. An artist use a paintbrush to make one-of-a-kind artwork, just like God made each of us one of a kind. God made us on purpose, which means with a special plan. We are not an accident. We are remarkable and special to God.

Let's pray and talk to God. We can thank Him for making us so special. When we pray we close our eyes and are quiet so we can focus on talking and listening to God. Let's pray in 3-2-1.

God, thank You for making us special and not like anyone else. I love how You made us. We love you! Amen!"

Can you say the Big Deal with me?

One of a Kind!(*hold 1 finger out in front of you*)

God (*Point Up*)

Made Me Special! (*show two thumbs up*)

Let's do that a few more times.

Make a Face Race(20 minutes)**What You Need:** Butcher paper, painter's tape, crayons, markers

Tape 2 pieces of butcher paper on the wall(for younger kids consider putting paper on a table of floor. You could also have kids paste the facial features if drawing seems too complex). Draw a large oval on each paper to represent a blank face. Before group, color in the ovals with diverse skin tone colors. Make a starting line on the opposite side of the room using painter's tape.

Say:

Let's line up in two lines. *(form two lines of kids. Stand behind the starting line.)* Today we are learning that God made us special and on purpose. Do you see the circles on the papers on the wall? Let's pretend like those are faces. What are our faces missing? *(name different parts that are missing.)* You're right! Each face needs eyes, a nose, a mouth, ears, and hair. Let's play a game where we work together to add one part to the face at a time.

I will give the first friend in each line a crayons. I want you to race to the paper and draw one eye on your team's face. Once you do that, bring the crayon back and give it to the next friend in line. That friend will draw another eye on the face. We will continue until the faces are complete and everyone has a turn. Ready? 3-2-1 Go! *(Play the game encouraging kids to draw the following facial features: two eyes, a nose, a mouth two ears, hair and so on. Consider drawing things like eyelashes, eyebrows, and freckles if your group is larger. As preschoolers get the crayon for their turn, announce what they will be drawing.)*

Say : Wow! Your faces look amazing! God made each of you special. You are not an accident. God made you on purpose. That means God made you special and He has a plan for you. After all, He made you, and He loves you very much.

Say:

- What was our Super Clue today? (a paintbrush) What does it help us remember?(A paintbrush makes special artwork, just like God made each of us special and one of a kind.)
- What was your favorite part of the Bible story?
- How did God made you one of a kind? What is special about you?
- God made you on purpose. What is something about you that reminds you of this?
- What is something you learned about God today?
- What can you tell your friends and families about this week?

Our Big Deal is, "One of a Kind! God Made Me Special!

One of a Kind!*(hold 1 finger out in front of you)*

God *(Point Up)*

Made Me Special! *(show two thumbs up)*

Today we learned that God made us on purpose. We are not an accident. We are remarkable and special to God because He made us. Each person is one of a kind and valuable to God. Remember, one of a kind mean not like anyone else. I am so glad that you came to church today. This week look for ways that show how God wondrously and remarkable made you, your family, and your friends!

Prepare kids to talk with their family about what they learned today.

- Pass out coloring pages for kids to take home.
- As family members arrive to pick up their kid, greet them and tell them one thing you noticed about their kid that day or something you talked to each kid about remembering this week.
- If there is time to chat with the family, ask how you can pray for them this week.
- Say bye to the kids and call them by name.
