Bible Story: Revenge- Matthew 5: 38-48

Big Idea: God helps us love our enemies.

The Win: Kids who can identify and take their next step of discipleship by embracing a preschooler's physical needs or engaging an elementary kid in things that interest them.

Wednesday Share:

Tonight during Impact Kids, we looked at Matthew 5:38-48. In this section of the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus talks about how to treat our enemies. Even though most people think it's okay to hate their enemies, Jesus says to love our enemies and pray for people who persecute us. He also says not to work for revenge but instead be generous. Talk about these ideas as a family. Help kids see that when someone makes them mad, they can show kindness and love.

Leader Devo:

Dig In to the Bible

Read: Matthew 5:38-48

In This Passage: In this section of the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus talks about how to treat our enemies. Even though most people think it's okay to hate their enemies, Jesus says to love our enemies and pray for people who persecute us. He also says not to work for revenge but instead be generous.

Bible Point: God helps us love our enemies.

Summary Verse: "So don't worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring its own worries. Today's trouble is enough for today" (Matthew 6:34).

Dig Deeper

You'll Be Teaching: God helps us love our enemies. The word enemy might feel a little strong to some kids, especially younger kids. But the concept of someone who's hard to get along with is definitely familiar to kids. Help kids see that when someone makes them mad, they can show kindness and love.

Think About: Think about someone who has been hard for you to love in the last week or two. Pray for that person!

Dig In to Prayer

Ask God to help you love the kids in your class who are harder to love.
