I Am Meant to Know God 1 year olds - 4 year olds

Leader Notes

Bible Passage: God Called Abram- Genesis 12; 15

Bottom Line: I can trust in God.

Leader Context: This month we are teaching kids that they are meant to know God.

Through Bible stories from the life of Abram, who is later called Abraham, kids will learn that God is knowable and involved in their lives. Today, we will teach kids that they can trust God, like Abram did in Genesis 12 and 15. (Read Genesis 12:1-4.) Abram trusted God and followed where He led, and our kids can trust in God too.

THE WIN FOR SUNDAY GROUPS: Give kids a first look at The Bible, Jesus, and our need for a Savior by embracing their physical needs or engaging their interests. Use The Code when necessary to help redirect kids and build relationships.

Games and Music (10 minutes)

What You Need: Social Instruction Page, Roku Game Instructions, Bark Coloring Pages (several per group), crayons, "Step By Step" printable (several), Cardstock (several), Toy animals (1 cow, 1 horse, 1 duck, 1 dog per group) Pom-poms (several), Bucket or bowl (1 per group), Painter's tape (1 per group), Timer (1 per group)

What You Do:

- Play worship songs and other songs available on Roku during the Social Game or while kids are playing.
- Using the supplies and game instruction page, choose one game to play with the kids today.
- As you are playing, use this as a time to call each kid by name and learn their names well.

Say: That was a fun game to get us ready to watch our Bible video. Let's sit and listen to our story today."

Bible Story Video (10 minutes)

Bible Story Recap- Say This!

Thank you, Super Crew and Bark! In our Bible story today, we learned about a man named Abram who loved and followed God. Let's all say, "Abram." (*Abram.*) Great job! God told Abram to leave his home and to trust God to lead him. Step by step Abram followed God and moved away from his home. God made a special promise to Abram that his family would have more people than the number of stars in the sky. That is a big promise, but Abram believed that He could trust God.

Today's Super Clue is a car seat. A car seat's job is to keep you safe in the car, and you can trust your car seat to work. In a similar way, like we can trust a car seat, God wants us to know Him and trust that He will always do what He says.

One of the ways we learn to trust God is by talking with and listening to Him. This is called prayer. Let's pray and talk to God right now and ask Him to help us trust Him step by step.

God, thank You for the true story of Abram in the Bible that helps us remember that we can trust You. Thank You that we can trust in You. Amen.

Can you say the Big Deal with me?

Step By Step! (*March in place.*)

God Wants Me (*Point both pointer fingers to the sky.*)

To Know Him! (*Tap your left finger on your head like you are thinking.*)

Let's do that a few more times.

Videos

Make A Night Sky — Craft

Big Goal: Remember God’s promise to Abram to grow his family.

Leader Prep: Print “Make A Night Sky” printables. Cut out the Abram figure, one per child. Print “I Can Trust in God” printable labels, one label per child.

Supplies: “Make A Night Sky” printable (several), “I Can Trust in God” printable (several), Labels (address labels, 30 per page, #5160) (1 per child), Dark blue or black construction paper (1 per child), Star stickers (several), Glue sticks (1 per child), Scissors (1 per group; adult-use only)

Craft Instructions:

1. Before the session, print “Make A Night Sky” printables. Cut out the Abram figure, one per child. Print “I Can Trust in God” printable labels, one label per child.
2. Give each preschooler construction paper and star stickers.
3. Invite preschoolers to place star stickers on the top half of their papers to make a night sky.
4. Give each preschooler a glue stick and an Abram figure. Instruct them to glue Abram on the bottom half of their papers.
5. Give each preschooler an “I Can Trust in God” label. Invite them to place the labels on their papers.

What To Do: Let’s make a craft that will remind us of the Bible story. You will each get a dark piece of paper and some star stickers. Place as many star stickers as you can on the top half of your paper. Then you will glue Abram to your paper and add a label that says, “I can trust in God.”

Loud And Clear: In our Bible story today, God promised Abram He would grow his family more than the stars in the sky. Can you imagine just how many stars there are in the sky? There are too many to count! God kept His promise to Abram, and we can trust God to keep His promises to us too. **I can trust in God.** Let’s say that together. Ready? **“I can trust in God.”** Great job!

Say:

- Who remembers what our Super Clue is today? (*a car seat*)
- What does a car seat help us remember? (*We can trust in God.*)
- What was your favorite part of Large Group?
- When can we trust in God? (*We can trust in God all of the time.*)
- What is something you learned about in today’s Bible story?

Our Big Deal is,

Step By Step! (*March in place.*)

God Wants Me (*Point both pointer fingers to the sky.*)

To Know Him! (*Tap your left finger on your head like you are thinking.*)

Say: In today’s Bible story, Abram was an old man when God told him to move to a new place. Abram trusted God and did what He said to do. Step by step, God was with Abram and kept His promises.

Going Home

Prepare kids to talk with their family about what they learned today.

- Pass out coloring pages for kids to take home.
- As family members arrive to pick up their kid, greet them and tell them one thing you noticed about their kid that day or something you talked to each kid about remembering this week.
- If there is time to chat with the family, ask how you can pray for them this week.
- Say bye to the kids and call them by name.
